COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Last chance to **HAVE YOUR SAY!** Community consultation for the main street improvements closes this Wednesday, 8 February 2023. Surveys were posted to all local mail boxes.

More information is also available and can be downloaded from the Shire website, and the surveys can be dropped off at the Shire or CRC by Wednesday, 8 February 2023.

Why it is important to get a broad response from the community to the Shire of Narembeen Churchill Street Survey?

If you are interested in what improvements are made in your Main Street it is important for you to let us know via this survey process. You can rate those items listed only or you can add some of your own comments &/or ideas, all feedback submitted will be recorded and subsequently presented to the council. The Shire of Narembeen has received funding from the Federal Government to make improvements to the town centre and your responses will help inform the council on what the community would like to see these funds spent on (prioritise). Some of the limiting factors however include time restrictions, giving you this one opportunity to have your say on this project via the survey closing at 5pm Wednesday 8 February 2023.

Why are your details requested?

It is important we know that local individuals have responded to the survey and not multiple surveys completed by one person anonymously, skewing the priority ratings toward their own preferences. Therefore requesting your details helps us to ensure we get a true representation and cross-section of the community.

All comments on the survey will be added to the final report presented to the council for consideration with the utmost discretion and without any of your personal details included.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Restricted (Permit Required) 1st February to 15th April

The following additional requirements for burning are also in place.

- 1st February includes grass and raked cereal stubble and header windrows of non-cereal stubble including canola and legumes.
- 1st March is header windrows and chaff dumps and cereal stubble fires.



Burning during restricted periods is allowed on Sunday's and Public Holidays with a permit.

Any questions about burning times should be directed to a Fire Control Officer or the Shire Office.

WHO'S WHO AND WHERE IN 2023: WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO MAINTAIN FIVE PRIMARY CLASSES AT THE BIG SCHOOL!!!

At the end of 2021, we made the decision (and I think that is the royal 'we' because I guess, it was really 'me'!), to continue to ensure that our students in early childhood enjoyed the best possible learning environments by having straight classes from K - Year 3. This means that we have made an additional primary class in 2022 and we have somehow managed to continue to staff it in 2023, fingers crossed for 2024!! Now those on the Board will already know, that this continually stretches the budget, and really, we have only been able to do it this year thanks to the WASSTU last agreement, which gave DHS's additional funds for staffing (100k in 2022 and hopefully the same in 2023). We have been able to keep a straight Kindergarten and PP as well, which is much better educationally than splitting our Kindy students in to two classes of 8, and sending them two different days and alternate Wednesdays. We are lucky that both Russ and I also do a lot of teaching, almost 1.5FTE between us, which means that there is a lot of salary funding that is open to be used in other areas. We will wait and see what 2024 brings in terms of numbers and funding but we are ok for 2023 😊. So, our classes in 2023, look like this:

Evidence suggests that the early years are the most important ones in setting up students for success, so we are striving to enhance their learning in these years. Our middle and upper primary numbers are not huge, and this should continue to assist the learning of all students. Every class in the primary is also single streamed in Mathematics, with Georgia Miller picking up the Year 5, while Mel and Han take the Year 4 and Year 5 respectively. I really believe that we are putting our funding where it is needed, making sure our students have the small classes and the best timetable to allow

them to succeed. Our staff are generally experienced, the teacher/student ratio is low and we are all set to make a difference.
