BACKGROUND

SUMMARY

Adopt the Shire of Narembeen Asbestos Management Plan 2016 document for Asbestos in the Workplace.

BACKGROUND

A legislative requirement was enacted in the mid-1990s under the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* requiring workplaces to have in place a Workplace Asbestos Management Plan and Asbestos Register. The Asbestos Management Plan, field documents and Register are available as templates made available by the Local Government Insurance Service (LGIS). These templates are designed in accordance with WorkSafeWA requirements are to assist local governments to comply with their legislative requirements for the management of Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) in Shire owned or controlled buildings, infrastructure and workplaces (inclusive of dwellings provided to Shire Staff and Contractors).

Late in January 2016 the Shire of Narembeen Environmental Health Officer was contacted by WorkSafeWA regarding accessing documents and an onsite inspection of the Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Management Plan and Asbestos Register documentation. The previous EHO Mrs L Pitman and Mrs B King had conducted a workplace asbestos assessment in April 2014 and this has been documented. It is a legal requirement that Workplace Asbestos Management Plans and Asbestos Registers are made available and reviewed annually as a desktop requirement and reviewed in detail with on-site follow-up inspections every three years. During the officers review of the documents provided it revealed that the overarching corporate document that comes as part of the LGIS templates was not available; this agenda item will rectify this matter.

COMMENT

Before Council now is the required Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Management Plan 2016 which will form part of the corporate framework to enable budget considerations for repair or removal of ACM from time to time. Also for consideration is the funding of the Asbestos Register which will need to be reviewed in April 2017 within the 2016-2017 budget.

ACM in sound condition, left undisturbed, presents negligible risk to employees, building occupants and the general community. Therefore removal of asbestos may not be immediately necessary but should be taken into consideration due to possible health risks and public concern. ACM should be regularly inspected and actions taken to minimise health risk as far as is reasonably practical by non-invasive sealing or removal by a qualified person and in accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Asbestos Management Plan protocols. The Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Register when completed will provide recommendations only for the buildings and structures identified with ACM and the recommendations are able to be modified as the case may be for each building and structure.

The legislation that the Shire of Narembeen is required to comply with is the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996*, particularly Regulation 5.43 which states:

Reg. 5.43. Identification and assessment of asbestos hazards at workplaces

Without limiting regulation 3.1 or 5.15, a person who, at a workplace, is an employer, the main contractor, a self-employed person or the person having control of the workplace must ensure that —

- (a) the presence and location of asbestos at the workplace is identified; and
- (b) the process of identification referred to in paragraph (a) and the assessment of risks arising from hazards in relation to asbestos at the workplace are conducted in accordance with the Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces [NOHSC: 2018 (2005)].

Penalties do apply for a breach of Regulation 5.43. The penalties for a 'body corporate' are significant and a local government is by law a body corporate pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1995* Sec 2.5:

In May 2014 A Newburn Company SGS Australia Pty Ltd pleaded guilty to failing to ensure that the presence and location of asbestos at the workplace was identified, and was fined in the Perth Magistrates Court to the sum of \$5500 plus costs

In adopting the Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Management Plan 2016 as shown and resolving to fund the Asbestos Register review and onsite inspection of Shire assets the Shire of Narembeen will then comply with the requirements of the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996*. The Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Management Plan 2016 and Asbestos Register will form part of the corporate documentation process for asbestos in the workplace to be made available to staff and contractors working on buildings which contain ACM.

The cost is estimated at \$1,100 based on the RoeHEALTH scheme funding rates.

1. Foreword

This plan has been developed to assist the Shire comply with legislative requirements in the management of **asbestos containing materials (ACM)** in Shire owned or controlled buildings and workplaces (inclusive of dwellings provided to Shire Staff and Contractors). The ultimate goal is for all Shire owned or controlled buildings and workplaces to be free of ACM. Accordingly, consideration should be given to the removal of ACM during renovation, refurbishment and/or maintenance processes in preference to other control measures such as encapsulation, enclosure or sealing.

Reasonable steps have been taken to identify all ACM within all Shire owned and/or controlled buildings and workplaces. In some instances inaccessible areas have not been subject to inspection, as detailed in the ACM register, and in these instances such areas must be presumed to contain ACM unless a competent person inspects and subsequently declares them as free of ACM.

The NOHSC Documents – National Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos (2nd Edition) [NOHSC: 2002(2005)] and National Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces [NOHSC: 2018(2005)] are collectively referred to as “The National Codes of Practice” in this management plan.

This asbestos management plan must be reviewed whenever the register of ACM is reviewed. The review process should critically assess all asbestos management processes and their effectiveness in;

- Preventing exposure to airborne asbestos fibres
- Controlling maintenance workers and contractors
- Highlighting the need for action to remove or maintain ACM
- Raising awareness amongst all workers; and,
- Maintaining the accuracy of the ACM register

2. Legislative Duty

The Shire, as an employer, has a legislative duty to provide and maintain a working environment in which the employees of the employer are not exposed to hazards. This duty further extends to any other person who may be affected wholly or in part as a result of the work done or caused to be done by the Shire or the Shires employees. The legislative framework which must be complied with includes the provisions of:

- The *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* (WA)
- The *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996* (WA) and, as invoked by the Regulations;
 - The Guidance Note on the Membrane Filter Method for Estimating Airborne Asbestos Fibres (2nd Edition) [NOHSC:3003 (2005)]
 - National Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos(2nd Edition) [NOHSC:2002(2005)]
 - National Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces [NOHSC:2018(2005)]

3. Government Policy

The long-term aim is for all buildings occupied or controlled by government agencies to be free of ACM. Whilst working towards this goal, agencies also have an obligation to identify and manage ACM in their facilities in order to comply with legislative requirements.

ACM in sound condition, left undisturbed, presents negligible risk to employees, building occupants and the general community. Therefore removal of asbestos may not be immediately necessary but should take into consideration immediate health risks and be completed prior to demolition, partial demolition, renovation or refurbishment if these works are likely to disturb ACM.

Remaining ACM should be regularly inspected and actions taken to minimise health risk, as far as is

5. Responsibilities

5.1. Shire Chief Executive Officer

The Shire Chief Executive Officer has the ultimate responsibility for ensuring that all works involving or potentially involving any disturbance or removal of ACM are conducted in accordance with all applicable legislative requirements, including the National Codes of Practice;

- [National Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos\(2nd Edition\) \[NOHSC:2002\(2005\)\]](#)
- [National Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces \[NOHSC:2018\(2005\)\]](#)

The Shire Chief Executive Officer shall ensure that the register of ACM and associated Asbestos Management Plan is maintained, reviewed and updated at the determined intervals being a **desktop review every year and a full building reinspection onsite every three years**. The Chief Executive Officer is to ensure that the register of ACM is reviewed by a person so competent to do so in order to identify any ACM or presumed ACM to the persons intending to perform works prior to the commencement of any works in any Shire owned or controlled building or workplace.

The Chief Executive Officer shall ensure that works involving ACM are undertaken by competent persons, using formal documented safe systems of work including suitably authorised **Safe Work Method Statements** and **Permits to Work**. Any such work shall be subject to adequate supervision to ensure compliance with legislative requirements, including as detailed in the National Codes of Practice relating to ACM. The nominated member of staff is responsible for the authorisation of documented **Safe Work Method Statements, Permits to Work** associated with ACM works, and the provision of sufficient supervision to ensure works are conducted strictly in accordance with requirements.

The nominated representative shall ensure that competencies and licences of persons involved in works removing or disturbing ACM are verified and recorded. This obligation extends to verifying and ensuring that only suitable equipment (such as vacuum cleaners compliant with AS 3544 (1988) "Industrial Vacuum Cleaners for Particulates Hazardous for Health" and AS 4260 – 1997 "High Efficiency Particulate Air Filters – Classification, Construction and Performance" is used in the performance of ACM works.

5.2. Shire Employees and Contractors

All Shire employees and contractors have a responsibility to comply with legislative provisions, the National Codes of Practice and Shire imposed safe systems of work. The employee or contractor shall consult with the member of staff arranging works and employment prior to the commencement of any works on Shire owned or controlled buildings in order that the asbestos register may be reviewed, ACM locations identified, and a safe system of work determined to complete the proposed works.

All works involving the disturbance or removal of ACM must be done by suitably trained or licensed persons, as the situation may require, in accordance with a suitably documented and authorised Safe Work Method Statement and Permit to Work.

6. Identification of Asbestos Hazards

Surveys of Shire owned buildings have been conducted by:

- Mr L Bosch (holds current ACM identification card) and Mrs B King.

These inspections formed part of the annual inspection of buildings regime initiated by the Shire in April 2014 and incorporated also the three year inspection of buildings containing asbestos review to be conducted over the **first half of 2017** period. The surveys will include a risk assessment and recommendation for future control measures. Results of surveys are recorded in the 'Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Register 2016' maintained by:

- Mr G Gegan Deputy Chief Executive Officer; and
- Mr S Thomas Building Supervisor.

7. Risk Assessment

A matrix comprising the condition of the ACM and the likelihood of disturbance have been applied to all material found or presumed to contain asbestos during the survey process. A qualitative risk ranking has subsequently been assigned to each occurrence of ACM and may be reviewed by accessing the asbestos register and associated site/location condition assessments and accompanying photographs.

8. ACM Risk Control Measures

The recommended control measures that have been considered appropriate for use by the responsible Shire of Narembeen Officers are as follows:

Category 1

Risk Ranking "**EXTREME**". Immediate isolation until remedial action completed immediate removal of asbestos containing material.

Category 2

Risk Ranking "**HIGH**". Remove source of disturbance; or isolate asbestos containing material

Category 3

Risk Ranking "**MODERATE**". Remove before possible disturbance, such as demolition, partial demolition, renovation or refurbishment to ensure potential health risks do not arise. Monitor risk until remedial action is completed

Category 4

Risk Ranking "**LOW**". Monitor and manage in accordance with the review of risk assessments.

8.1. Category 1 Risk Ranking items

Category 1 items identified in the future, through register review, prior oversight or damage, are to be reported and immediately rectified through application of the risk categorisation process. Any friable, unstable ACM must be treated as a category 1 risk.

8.2. Category 2 Risk Ranking items

Category 2 risks are characterised by an elevated risk due to likely disturbance and the control measure is designed to reduce or eliminate the possibility of disturbance. The following items were identified as Category 2 risks.

8.3. Category 3 Risk Ranking items

Category 3 items are programmed for removal prior to a time of likely disturbance during such activities such as renovation, maintenance and scheduled activities. The responsible Shire Officers formal decision is necessary as to when this should be done.

8.4. Category 4 Risk Ranking items

These items are determined as low risk due to good condition with a low probability of disturbance and need only future management and monitoring. Generally they are well bonded, for example in a cement matrix, stable and relatively inaccessible.

9. Monitoring and Management

All identified ACM locations shall be monitored and managed as required and dependant on the current or revised risk assessment and subsequent risk category assigned to the occurrence/ location of ACM. A formal review of all ACM locations and update of the ACM Register maintained by the Shire is required to be conducted before **May 2017**, or earlier where a risk assessment indicates the need for reassessment or the ACM has been disturbed or removed. Annual Shire building inspections will also assess ACM locations and condition as part of the building asset management process as well.

10. Labelling and Signage

11. Access

It is a strict requirement that works access for identified ACM locations is only to commence after consultation of the Shire of Narembeen Workplace Asbestos Management Plan 2016 and Asbestos Register and when formally approved by the Shire Chief Executive Officer. All works must be undertaken strictly in accordance with legislative requirements and the associated National Codes of Practice related to ACM. (Refer to Section 15 - "Safe Work Methods" in this plan).

Where works are undertaken that may disturb ACM then the works area must be isolated and access restricted to essential workers only. Fencing and signage warning of the nature of the work being undertaken and site access restrictions should be employed. All fencing and warning signs must remain in place until a clearance to re-occupy has been granted by a competent person.

Areas within buildings that were unable to be inspected for the presence of ACM, such as ceiling spaces and wall cavities as indicated in the ACM Register, must be presumed to contain ACM unless formally inspected and identified as not containing ACM.

12. Work Permits

All works on sites identified as containing ACM must be in accordance with the issuance of a work permit issued by the designated Shire officer. Issued work permits will be recorded in the ACM Works Permit Logbook. All persons proposed to conduct works on sites identified in the ACM register, must have been provided with training in safe work methods and have the location of any ACM, actual or presumed, formally identified to them. This information must be recorded on the work permit and work permit log book entry.

13. Recording Work on ACM

Work done on ACM that materially changes a register entry is to be recorded in the Asbestos Register by The Shire of Narembeen Administration Staff under the supervision/signoff of Mr C Jackson CEO or M G gregan DCEO and will include details of:

- The company/ person(s) conducting the work
- The date of the work
- The scope of the work done
- Monitoring undertaken and results of tests
- Any clearance certificates
- Details of licenses required to be held and confirmation that these are held
- Record of appropriate disposal (receipt) at a site designated by the Shire of Narembeen

NOTE: Where ACM is removed from the building or has been declared by testing as not ACM material the entry in the register is to remain but highlighted in 'Green' in order to allow future users of the document to be assured that ACM has been removed and/or identified or not.

14. Maintenance of Asbestos Register

The asbestos register is to be maintained, reviewed and the locations of actual or presumed ACM identified to employees or contractors on every occasion that work may be done which could possibly disturb ACM. Reasonable requests by staff members for inspection of the asbestos register will be granted.

15. Safe Work Methods

All works that involve disturbance or removal of any ACM must be strictly undertaken in accordance with:

authorised **Safe Work Method Statement** and associated **Permit to Work**. All persons involved in the works must be suitably trained, including licensing if the scope of works require.

15.1. Equipment and techniques

Only suitable equipment and techniques shall be used in the performance of any works involving disturbance or removal of ACM. Details of considerations to be taken into account when determining suitable equipment and techniques to be employed for ACM work are detailed in the National Codes of Practice. The appendixes in these Codes contain some specific examples of safe working methods which involve:

- Drilling of ACM
- Sealing, painting, coating and cleaning of ACM products
- Cleaning leaf litter from the gutters of ACM roofs
- Replacing cabling in asbestos cement conduits or boxes
- Working on electrical mounting boards (switchboards) containing asbestos

***NOTE:** Household vacuum cleaners **must never be used** where asbestos is or may be present, even if they have a HEPA filter.

***NOTE:** High speed abrasive power and pneumatic tools such as angle grinders, sanders, saws and high speed drills **must never be used**.

The type of decontamination required will depend on the type of asbestos (friable or non-friable) and the work method employed. Details of decontamination considerations which must be taken into account are contained in the National Code(s) of Practice. All contaminated materials must be disposed of as asbestos waste in accordance with legislative requirements and as described in the National Codes of Practice.

16. Consultation, Information Sharing and Training

Advice regarding ACM is to be included in Shire induction training procedures and follow up briefings are to be conducted after each review of the ACM register, after any material change in the ACM register, or each three years after initial survey. Induction training in regards to ACM must encompass;

- The use and location of the ACM register
- The Asbestos Management Plan
- The legislative requirements
- The National Codes of Practice [NOHSC:2002 and 2018(2005)]
- The occupational safety and health consequences of exposure to asbestos and appropriate control measures
- Licensing and competency requirements
- Safe Work Methods when dealing with ACM

Induction briefings for employees or contractors who may work within, or on, the building(s) containing ACM are to be conducted prior to the commencement of any works.

All provision of training, including participants, training content and results shall be recorded and maintained in the Shire training register.

Updates, where a change to the Asbestos Management Plan, ACM Register, or extensive work to buildings is planned, are to be delivered by:

- Shire employee newsletter
- Notice placed on safety notice boards
- Toolbox safety and health meetings
- Employee training sessions

17. Shire Operational Considerations

As the definition of a 'workplace' includes any location where employees are likely to be in the course of their work, this plan also needs to consider and account for any work undertaken outside of the standard scope of works.

All Shire operations should be reviewed as listed in **19.1 Appendix A** of this plan, and particular precautions and control measures identified for each operation.

Aspects to be considered could include the potential for previously unidentified ACM to be discovered, such as asbestos cement water pipes, work on brake or clutch friction components containing ACM, or during external sub-contracted works that the Shire may engage in. The National Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces [NOHSC:2018(2005)] contains a useful listing of examples of asbestos containing materials in Appendix A of that document. Although not an exhaustive list, the listing does contain many examples of where ACM may be found and should be considered prior to the performance of works outside of the scope of ACM locations contained in the ACM register.

If potential ACM is located, then a competent person should perform a formal identification and risk assessment process and the findings included in the ACM register as appropriate.

18. REVIEW

The register of ACM is to be reviewed in desktop form in **March 2017** and fully reviewed with inspections onsite before **May 2017** or when a change to the register is necessary.

The asbestos management plan is to be reviewed in desktop form in **March 2017** or when a change to the register has been recorded, to ensure effectiveness of management processes in:

- Preventing exposure to airborne asbestos fibers;
- Controlling maintenance workers and contractors;
- Highlighting the need for action to maintain or remove ACM;
- Raising awareness among all workers; and
- Maintaining the accuracy of the register of ACM.

19.2. Attachment B - Health aspects of Exposure to Airborne asbestos Fibres

Extract from Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces INOHSC:2018(2005)] Part 6

Asbestos is a known carcinogen. The inhalation of asbestos fibers is known to cause mesothelioma, lung cancer and asbestosis.

Malignant mesothelioma is a cancer of the outer covering of the lung (the pleura) or the abdominal cavity (the peritoneum). It is usually fatal.

Mesothelioma is caused by the inhalation of needle-like asbestos fibers deep into the lungs where they can damage mesothelial cells, potentially resulting in cancer.

The latency period is generally between 35 and 40 years, but it may be longer, and the disease is very difficult to detect prior to the onset of illness.

Mesothelioma was once rare, but its incidence is increasing throughout the industrial world as a result of past exposures to asbestos. Australia has the highest incidence rate in the world. Lung cancer has been shown to be caused by all types of asbestos. The average latency period of the disease, from the first exposure to asbestos, ranges from 20 to 30 years. Lung cancer symptoms are rarely felt until the disease has developed to an advanced stage.

Asbestosis is a form of lung disease (pneumoconiosis) directly caused by inhaling asbestos fibers, causing a scarring (fibrosis) of the lung tissue which decreases the ability of the lungs to transfer oxygen to the blood. The latency period of asbestosis is generally between 15 and 25 years.

Asbestos poses a risk to health by inhalation whenever asbestos fibers become airborne and people are exposed to these fibers.

Accordingly, exposure should be prevented. The National Exposure Standard (NES) of 0.1 fibers/mL should never be exceeded, and control measures should be reassessed whenever air monitoring indicates the 'control level' of 0.01 fibers/mL has been reached. The National Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos [NOHSC:2002(2005)] provides additional information on control levels.

ACM can release asbestos fibers into the air whenever they are disturbed, and especially during the following activities:

- Any direct action on ACM, such as drilling, boring, cutting, filing, brushing, grinding, sanding,
- Breaking, smashing or blowing, with compressed air (State and Territory legislation prohibits most of these actions, and the relevant laws should be checked before performing any activity on ACM);
- The inspection or removal of ACM from workplaces (including vehicles, plant and equipment);
- The maintenance or servicing of materials from vehicles, plant, equipment or workplaces; or the renovation or demolition of buildings containing ACM.

Non-friable ACM that has been subjected to extensive weathering or deterioration also has a higher potential to release asbestos fibers into the air.

19.3. Attachment C – Awareness Training for Employees, Contractors and Others

Extract from Code of Practice for the Management and Control of Asbestos in Workplaces [NOHSC:2018(2005)] Part 7.2

Information and training must be provided to workers, contractors and others who may come into contact with ACM in a workplace, either directly or indirectly. Depending on the circumstances this asbestos awareness training may include:

- The purpose of the training;
- The health risks of asbestos;
- The types, uses and likely occurrence of ACM in buildings, plant and/or equipment in the workplace;
- The trainees' roles and responsibilities under the workplace's asbestos management plan;
- Where the workplace's register of ACM is located and how it can be accessed;
- The timetable for removal of ACM from the workplace;
- The processes and procedures to be followed to prevent exposure, including exposure from any accidental release of asbestos dust into the workplace;
- Where applicable, the correct use of maintenance and control measures, protective equipment and work methods to minimise the risks from asbestos, limit the exposure of workers and limit the spread of asbestos fibers outside any asbestos work area;
- The NES and control levels for asbestos; and
- The purpose of any air monitoring or health surveillance that may occur.

SUMMARY

For council to endorse its approach to the design of the Narembeen Townsite Project.

BACKGROUND

At the December 2015 ordinary meeting Council resolved;

That Council;

1. Reaffirms endorsement of the Grain Freight Narembeen Townsite project being the North link through property location 18164 to the Merredin Narembeen Road with Latham Road to continue on to the new Fricker Road (by-pass) and that Soldiers road will have a T junction on to this new through road as per drawing 201508-1451 18/11/15.
2. Endorse that the townsite project be developed with a staged approach with the intersection on the Merredin Narembeen Road, new Fricker Road, new CBH northern access construction and CBH southern end improvements being part of stage one.
3. Instructs staff to commence the formal process of the naming of the new section road as Fricker Road.
4. Develop a strategy to approach the state government with how to best approach access to the rail corridor to allow the Narembeen Townsite project to proceed as planned.

As previously advised because of the delays with any approvals from Brookfield Rail, Main Roads have agreed with a staged approach to allow the project to begin this financial year. This includes:

- Excluding any rail crossing, as any improvements/upgrades crossing the rail will involve rail (PTA) land and thus Brookfield Rail (BR). Although not ideal, the existing private crossing will have to stay as is.
- Upgrading the southern entrance to CBH is included in the proposal.
- Latham Road, from the CBH entrance on the western side of the railway line can be reconstructed/improved only, e.g. overlay, seal widening and shoulder improvements within the current 10m road reserve.
- Vehicles travelling from the south on Latham Road and vehicles travelling from North east on Soldiers Road will follow the same pattern as current.
- Vehicles travelling from Merredin will use the new link. At the bin they will follow the same pattern as above vehicles (travel down the east side of CBH) to enter the site at the new proposed entry at the southern end.

Design work on this approach will be presented to Council at the meeting.

Following the December meeting an approach was made to local member MLA Mia Davies who approached the Minister for Transport. The following response has now been received.

Thank you for the email of 22 December 2015 from your Electorate Officer, Ms Kathy Brown after receiving an approach from the Shire of Narembeen regarding their Grain Freight Townsite Project.

The Public Transport Authority (PTA) has advised me that the Shire of Narembeen, with engineering support from Main Roads Western Australia (MWRA), submitted a proposal to the PTA for the upgrading and extension of Latham Road, Narembeen as part of their Grain Freight Townsite Project which required land to be excised from the freight rail corridor. Before the PTA referred the proposal to Brookfield Rail (BR) it was made clear to the Shire that although a satisfactory outcome was unlikely, the option presented, in terms of minimal taking of rail corridor land, was considered to have a better chance of acceptance by BR.

Accordingly, BR reviewed the proposal and concluded that the land could not be excised from the rail corridor and in that regard cited a number of freight Network Lease clauses. Importantly BR advised that the narrowing of the rail corridor may affect future rail operations and cause interference. The issues BR raised included the absence of an allowance for track duplication and track upgrade constraints due to the narrow clearances. BR also suggested that the Shire's proposed road design may constrain future growth of and any additional connection to the rail corridor for CBH's facility at this location. Furthermore and until the access issue to Tier 3 rail lines is resolved it would be premature to constrain the railway and the CBH rail siding, a position that the PTA supports.

While it is recognised that heavy haulage vehicles need to be removed from the town road network, hence the proposed upgrade, it must also be acknowledged that where land is subject to the Network Lease under BR's management, the State cannot compel BR to change their position. If BR was to concede and the effect and interference on their future rail operations were proven, BR could seek compensation from the State.

I understand the Shire is currently investigating alternative routes to the east of the CBH facility with MRWA and in light of the above issues I would encourage this to be further pursued.

Critical Gaps in Concessional Networks

Local Government Update – Issue 3

In Issue 2 of the Local Government Update we covered the Accredited Mass Management Scheme (AMMS), which is the new concessional loading scheme introduced in April 2015.

The implementation of AMMS has seen the introduction of new concessional networks, with the scheme utilising a network approach to approved routes.

The initial concessional networks for mass levels 2 & 3 have been created from the roads that were already approved under the previous Concessional Loading Bulk Products Scheme.

Access arrangements for Local Government roads under the previous scheme have been maintained, with any access conditions that applied to a road being transferred across to the new concessional networks. For example, the network condition CA07 has been applied to all Local Government roads i.e. all operators must carry written approval from the Local Government authority permitting use of the road.

Creating the concessional networks has identified a number of critical gaps mostly related to 'last mile' connectivity where the distributor road is approved for concessional access, but the local road into a particular site is not.

Many of the sites that do not have connectivity are key infrastructure that has been there for many years, such as CBH grain bins.

Although these roads may have been used by concessional loaded vehicles in the past, the roads have not previously been approved by

Main Roads and may not have been endorsed by the Local Government.

We are working closely with key stakeholders who have also identified these gaps and are taking a proactive approach to improve connectivity and overall network efficiency.

For this reason, transport operators requesting these roads to be added to the AMMS concessional networks will be required to obtain Local Government endorsement prior to Main Roads considering the application.

What does this mean for Local Governments?

It may be possible that you will receive an increase in applications from transport operators requesting roads to be added to the AMMS Concessional Networks. In some cases this may simply be a formality, as it may have been assumed the road was already approved. However, Local Governments should still consider the following:

- Is the road the primary access to a site, such as a CBH facility, fuel station/depot, mine site, etc., where concessional access would be expected?
- Has there been any history of concessional loading vehicles operating on the requested road/s in the past?
- An increase in mass will result in additional impact to pavement and culverts if a road is approved. Is the road owner about to maintain the road for the level of access being requested?



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Providing the road owner supports the application, Main Roads will conduct an assessment of any bridges on the requested roads to ensure the load capacity of the bridge is suitable for the level of access being requested.

General description

The Minister for Planning has granted approval to the declaration of a planning control area over land to be protected for the future primary regional road reservation for the Armadale Road deviation (section between Knock Place and Solomon Road, Jandakot), as shown on Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) plan number 1.7415.

Purpose

The purpose of the planning control area is to—

- protect the future Primary Regional Road reservation for the Armadale Road deviation from adverse development outcomes,
- facilitate improved land use and transport planning within Cockburn Central; and
- allow for the final road design and land requirements to be confirmed prior to a Metropolitan Region Scheme amendment being initiated.

The WAPC considers that the planning control area is required over the whole of the land to ensure that no development occurs on this land which might prejudice this purpose until it may be reserved for future primary regional road reservation in the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

Duration and effects

The declaration remains in effect for a period of five years from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* or until revoked by the WAPC with approval by the Minister, whichever is the sooner.

A person shall not commence and carry out development in a planning control area without the prior approval of the WAPC. The penalty for failure to comply with this requirement is \$200,000 and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further fine of \$25,000 for each day during which the offence continues.

Compensation is payable in respect of land injuriously affected by this declaration, and land so affected may be acquired by the WAPC in the same circumstances and in the same manner as if the land had been reserved in the Metropolitan Region Scheme for a public purpose.

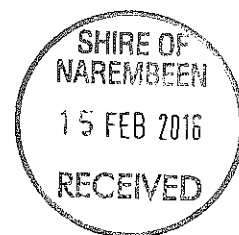

SUMMARY

Amendment and implementation of staff policies to ensure equality across the work force.

BACKGROUND

During the annual review and development of Council's 2016/2017 Salaries and Wages budget, it was uncovered that there are a number of discrepancies between Council documents in relation to housing allowances and superannuation contributions.

COMMENT

Council's current Enterprise Bargaining Agreement for 2014, 2015 and 2016 was registered on Tuesday 6th October 2014 and encompassed all staff under the Municipal Employee Award, ie: all outside staff.

The Shire of Narembeen's Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) references an amount of \$50 per week to all staff under the EBA who do not reside in a Council owned property. There is currently no documentation that indicates what housing allowance should be given for staff who do not fall under the EBA, ie: administration staff, however, in recent years an amount of \$30 per week for admin staff and \$25 per week for the Pool Manager have been paid.

To ensure equity across the organisation, it is suggested that a policy be adopted that states that all staff eligible for the housing allowance receive \$50 per week.

The EBA also references a superannuation contribution of 5% when the staff member contributes an additional 5% of their wage to superannuation.

Council's current Policy 4.3.9 for Superannuation only references a matching of 3% when 5% is contributed from the staff member.

Council's EBA supersedes the Council policy which means that all staff employed under the EBA may be receiving a greater superannuation than benefit administration and other staff.

It is recommended that Policy 4.3.9 be amended to say that when an additional 5% superannuation is contributed by staff, Council will match this contribution to 5%.

SUMMARY

For Council to review outstanding rates on expired mining tenements, previously owned by Goldmine Pty Ltd.

BACKGROUND

For several years Council have been carrying outstanding rates on a number of non-current assessments for mining tenements which were once owned by a company known as Goldmine Pty Ltd.

Council received notification in 2012 that five of the seven tenements were 'closed' on August 2012. This was amended on Council records in October 2012. At the time, there was still outstanding rates on these assessments and the company in question was pursued to receive payment.

One tenement was 'closed' in July 2014, also with outstanding rates.

All six assessments mentioned above have continued to accrue interest at a rate of 11% per annum despite being non-current assessments.

It has since been discovered that the company known as Goldmine Pty Ltd ACN:138 226 276 was deregistered in 2011. Staff have made several attempts since that time to make contact with the proprietors with no luck. A second Goldmine Pty Ltd has since been created, however they have no connection with the original company.

Staff were advised by Landgate that the final tenement in the name of Goldmine Pty Ltd was 'closed' on 2 February 2016. Prior to this, staff have made several attempts to discuss the tenement with Landgate and The Department of Mines and Petroleum regarding having the tenement closed as the company did not exist. Unfortunately, due to the procedures involved in closing a tenement, staff were informed it was not possible to close without a Tenement Holder.

COMMENT

Below is a breakdown of the funds owing on each of the assessments in question:

Of the abovementioned assessments, the rates raised are all consistent with the revaluations Council has received from Landgate. Rates have not been raised on any assessment following notification of the tenement death. Interest does continue to accrue on these amounts however.

Assessment A5083 was the tenement that until March 2016, remained 'alive' according to Landgate and as such rates continued to be applied to the assessment, despite not having a current company to send the rates to. An amount of \$3,726.68 was raised in this assessment which would not have been raised had, the tenement ceased when the company Goldmine Pty Ltd did. Additionally, interest on \$1,182.73 was applied to that amount.

Given the time this has gone on for and that it is now clear there is no avenue to recover these funds, it is recommended that Council write off all amounts on the mining tenements as listed.

- (2) Regardless of any determination made under section 6.28(1), the basis for a rate on a relevant interest is to be the unimproved value of the land, except as provided for in subsection (3).

- (a) the Minister has determined under section 6.28(1) that the gross rental value of the land is to be used as the basis for a rate on that interest; and

- (4) The Minister cannot determine under section 6.28(1) that the gross rental value of the land is to be used as the basis for a rate on a relevant interest in a portion of land if another estate in that portion of land is rateable on the basis of the gross rental value of the land.
- (5) For the purpose of subsection (3)(b) a determination is to be taken to expressly exclude the application of subsection (2) if the determination —
- (a) was made before the commencement of the Local Government Amendment Act 2009 section 38 1; and
 - (b) specifically applies to the particular relevant interest.

Where during a financial year —

- (a) land that was not rateable becomes rateable land; or
- (b) rateable land becomes land that is not liable to rates, the owner of that land —

- (d) is entitled to a refund of an amount proportionate to the portion of the year during which the land is not rateable land,

as the case requires.

STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 (FMR)

Reg 11. Payment of accounts

1. A local government is to develop procedures for the authorisation of and the payment of accounts to ensure that there is effective security for and properly authorised use of:
 - (a) cheques, credit cards, computer encryption devices and passwords, purchasing cards and any other devices or methods by which goods, services, money or other benefits may be obtained; and
 - (b) Petty cash systems.
2. A local government is to develop procedures for the approval of accounts to ensure that before payment of an account a determination is made that the relevant debt was incurred by a person who was properly authorised to do so.
3. Payments made by a local government
 - (a) subject to sub regulation (4), are not to be made in cash; and
 - (b) are to be made in a manner which allows identification of -
 - (i) the method of payment;
 - (ii) the authority for the payment; and
 - (iii) the identity of the person who authorised the payment.
4. Nothing in sub regulation (3) (a) prevents a local government from making payments in cash from a petty cash system.

Reg 12. Payments from municipal fund or trust fund

1. A payment may only be made from the municipal fund or the trust fund –
 - (a) if the local government has delegated to the CEO the exercise of its power to make payments from those funds by the CEO; or
 - (b) otherwise, if the payment is authorised in advance by a resolution of the council
2. The council must not authorise a payment from those funds until a list prepared under regulation 13(2) containing details of the accounts to be paid has been presented to the council.

Reg 13. Lists of accounts

1. If the local government has delegated to the CEO the exercise of its power to make payments from the municipal fund or the trust fund, a list of accounts paid by the CEO is to be prepared each month showing for each account paid since the last such list was prepared
 - (a) the payee's name;
 - (b) the amount of the payment;

- (c) the date of the payment; and
- (d) sufficient information to identify the transaction.

2. A list of accounts for approval to be paid is to be prepared each month showing:

(a) for each account which requires council authorisation in that month -

- (i) the payee's name;
- (ii) the amount of the payment; and
- (iii) sufficient information to identify the transaction; and

(b) the date of the meeting of the council to which the list is to be presented.

3. A list prepared under sub regulation (1) or (2) is to be -

- (a) presented to the council at the next ordinary meeting of the council after the list is prepared; and
- (c) recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

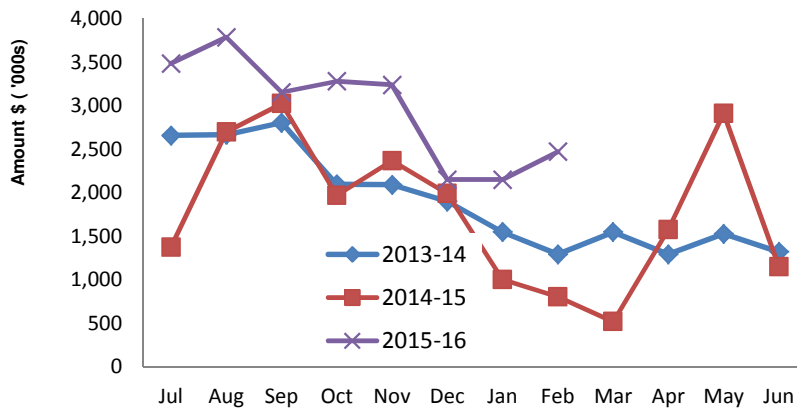

Liquidity Over the Year (Refer Note 3)



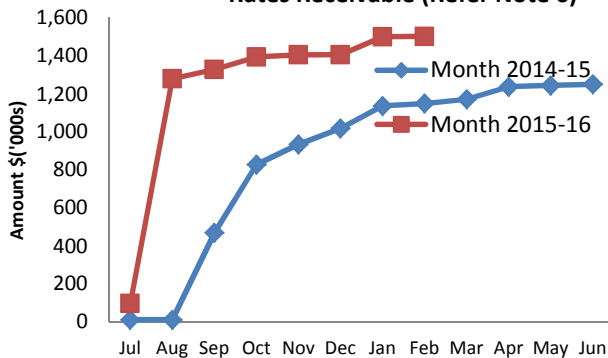

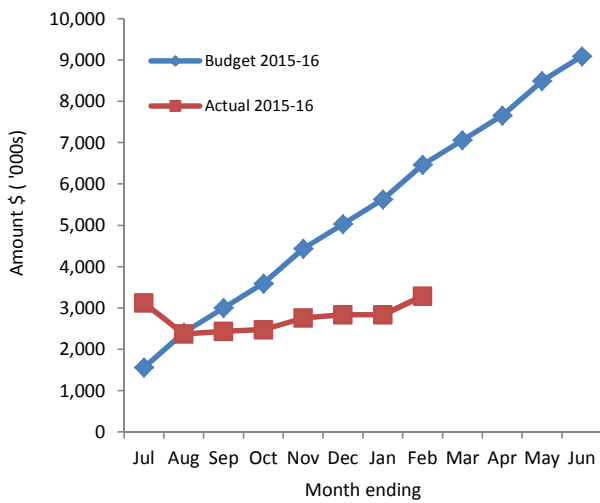

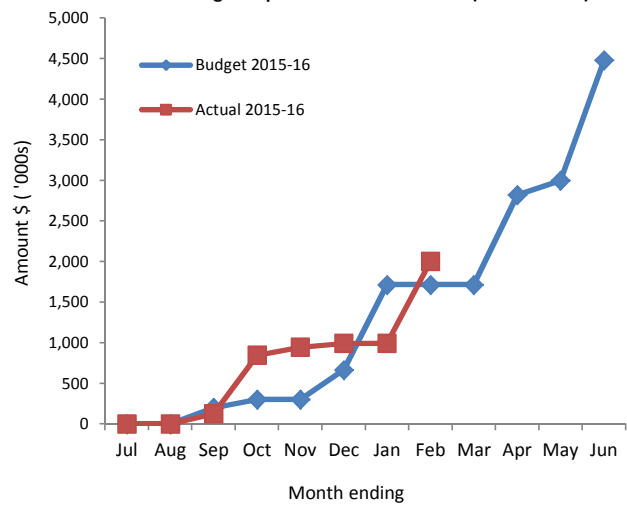

Budget Operating Revenues -v- Actual (Refer Note 2)

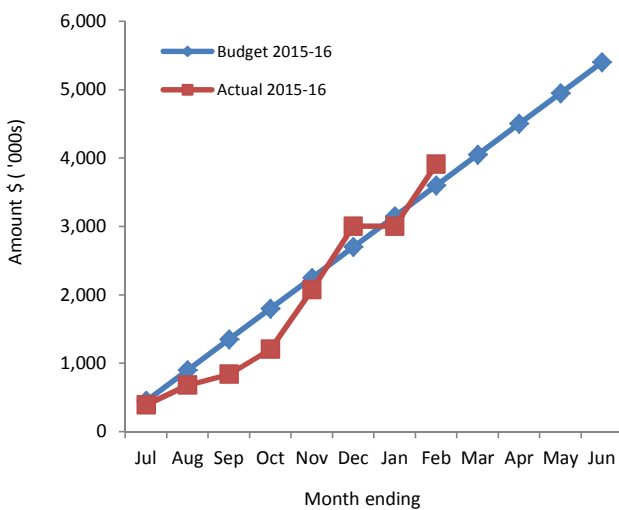


Budget Capital Revenue -v- Actual (Refer Note 2)

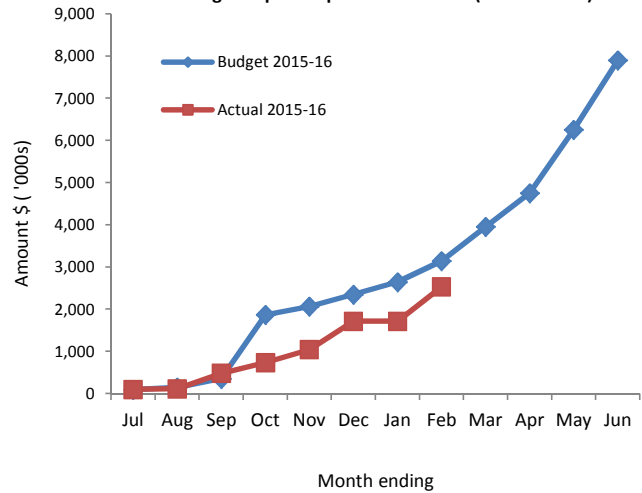

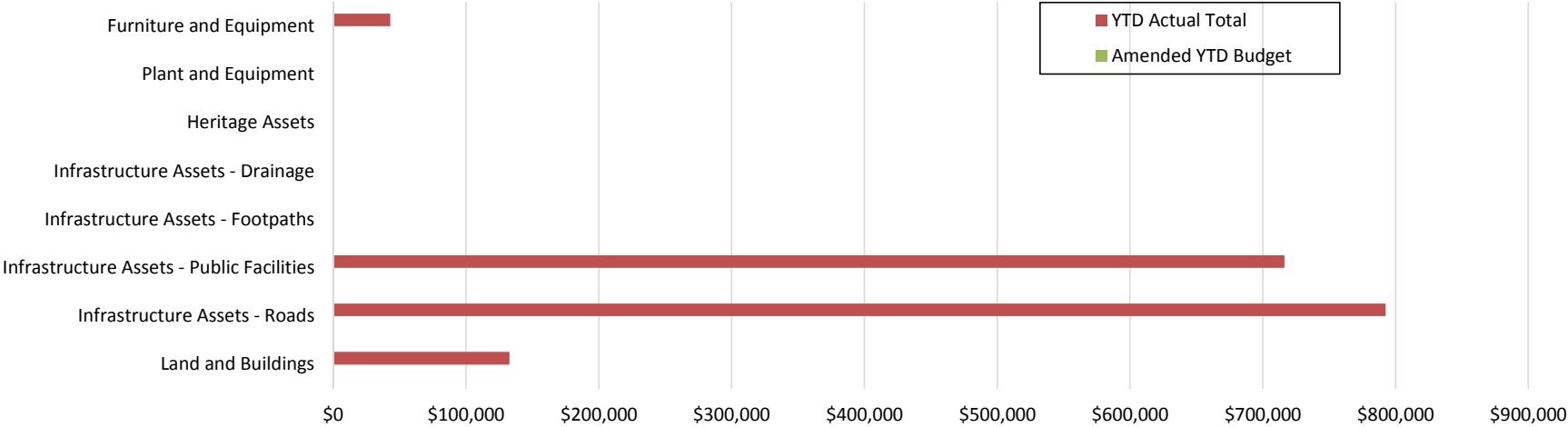

This statement comprises a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities), Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the Local Government Act 1995 and accompanying regulations. Material accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this statement are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the report has also been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities.

Critical Accounting Estimates

The preparation of a financial report in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that effect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances; the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

(b) The Local Government Reporting Entity

All Funds through which the Council controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this statement.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the statement, but a separate statement of those monies appears at Note 12.

(c) Rounding Off Figures

All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

(d) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions. Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon receipt of the rates.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST receivable or payable.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, cash at bank, deposits available on demand with banks and other short term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and bank overdrafts.

Bank overdrafts are reported as short term borrowings in current liabilities in the statement of financial position.

(g) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from ratepayers for unpaid rates and service charges and other amounts due from third parties for goods sold and services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Collectability of trade and other receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectible.

(h) Inventories

General

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Land Held for Resale

Land held for development and sale is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development, borrowing costs and holding costs until completion of development. Finance costs and holding charges incurred after development is completed are expensed.

Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss at the time of signing an unconditional contract of sale if significant risks and rewards, and effective control over the land, are passed on to the buyer at this point.

Land held for sale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(i) Fixed Assets

All assets are initially recognised at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the local government includes the cost of all materials used in the construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

Certain asset classes may be revalued on a regular basis such that the carrying values are not materially different from fair value. Assets carried at fair value are to be revalued with sufficient regularity to ensure the carrying amount does not differ materially from that determined using fair value at reporting date.

(j) Depreciation of Non-Current Assets

All non-current assets having a limited useful life are systematically depreciated over their useful lives in a manner which reflects the consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in those assets.

Depreciation is recognised on a straight-line basis, using rates which are reviewed each reporting period. Major depreciation rates and periods are:

Buildings	25 to 50 years
Construction other than Buildings (Public Facilities)	5 to 50 years
Furniture and Equipment	4 to 10 years
Plant and Equipment	5 to 15 years
Heritage Assets	25 to 50 years
Roads	25 years
Footpaths	50 years
Sewerage Piping	75 years
Water Supply Piping and Drainage Systems	75 years

(k) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Council prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Council becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured, are recognised as a current liability and are normally paid within 30 days of recognition.

(l) Employee Benefits

The provisions for employee benefits relates to amounts expected to be paid for long service leave, annual leave, wages and salaries and are calculated as follows:

(i) Wages, Salaries, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Short-term Benefits)

The provision for employees' benefits to wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave expected to be settled within 12 months represents the amount the Shire has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees services provided to balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on remuneration rates the Shire expects to pay and includes related on-costs.

(ii) Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Long-term Benefits)

The liability for long service leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits and measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date using the project unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and salary levels, experience of employee departures and periods of service. Expected future payments are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows. Where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, the liability is recognised as a current liability.

(m) Interest-bearing Loans and Borrowings

All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the fair value of the consideration received less directly attributable transaction costs.

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities that are yield related are included as part of the carrying amount of the loans and borrowings.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the Council has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the balance sheet date.

Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs are recognised as an expense when incurred except where they are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset. Where this is the case, they are capitalised as part of the cost of the particular asset.

(n) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when: The council has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is more likely than not that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses.

Where there are a number of similar obligations, the likelihood that an outflow will be required in settlement is determined by considering the class of obligations as a whole. A provision is recognised even if the likelihood of an outflow with respect to any one of item included in the same class of obligations may be small.

(o) Current and Non-Current Classification

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities where Council does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for resale where it is held as non current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(p) Nature or Type Classifications

Rates

All rates levied under the Local Government Act 1995. Includes general, differential, specific area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears and service charges.

Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

Non-Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

Profit on Asset Disposal

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

Fees and Charges

Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, sewerage rates, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

Service Charges

Service charges imposed under Division 6 of Part 6 of the Local Government Act 1995. Regulation 54 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 identifies the These are television and radio broadcasting, underground electricity and neighbourhood surveillance services. Exclude rubbish removal charges. Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

Interest Earnings

Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

Other Revenue / Income

Other revenue, which can not be classified under the above headings, includes dividends, discounts, rebates etc.

Employee Costs

All costs associate with the employment of person such as salaries, wages, allowances, benefits such as vehicle and housing, superannuation, employment expenses, removal expenses, relocation expenses, worker's compensation insurance, training costs, conferences, safety expenses, medical examinations, fringe benefit tax, etc.

Materials and Contracts

All expenditures on materials, supplies and contracts not classified under other headings. These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as contract services, consultancy, information technology, rental or lease expenditures.

Utilities (Gas, Electricity, Water, etc.)

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

(q) Nature or Type Classifications (Continued)

Insurance

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

Loss on asset disposal

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets.

Depreciation on non-current assets

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

Interest expenses

Interest and other costs of finance paid, including costs of finance for loan debentures, overdraft accommodation and refinancing expenses.

Other expenditure

Statutory fees, taxes, provision for bad debts, member's fees or levies including WA Fire Brigade Levy and State taxes. Donations and subsidies made to community groups.

(r) Statement of Objectives

Council has adopted a 'Plan for the future' comprising a Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan to provide the long term community vision, aspirations and objectives.

Based upon feedback received from the community the vision of the Shire is:

"A wonderful place to live, work, invest and visit with the community working together to achieve shared objectives"

The Strategic Community Plan defines the key objectives of the Shire as:

"Economic: A strong, resilient and balanced economy.

Environment: Our unique natural and built environment is protected and enhanced.

Social: Our community enjoys a high quality of life.

Civic Leadership: A collaborative and engaged community."

(s) Reporting Programs

Council operations as disclosed in this statement encompass the following service orientated activities/programs:

GOVERNANCE

Expenses associated with provision of services to members of council and elections. Also included are costs associated with computer operations, corporate accounting, corporate records and asset management. Costs reported as administrative expenses are redistributed in accordance with the principle of activity based costing (ABC).

GENERAL PURPOSE FUNDING

Rates and associated revenues, general purpose government grants, interest revenue and other miscellaneous revenues such as commission on Police Licensing. The costs associated with raising the above mentioned revenues, eg. Valuation expenses, debt collection and overheads.

LAW, ORDER, PUBLIC SAFETY

Enforcement of Local Laws, fire prevention, animal control and provision of ranger services.

HEALTH

Health inspection services, food quality control, mosquito control and contributions towards provision of medical health services.

Parks, gardens and recreation reserves, library services, television and radio re-broadcasting, swimming facilities, walk trails, youth recreation, Shark Bay World Heritage Discovery and Visitor Centre, boat ramps, foreshore, public halls and Shark Bay Recreation Centre.

TRANSPORT

Construction and maintenance of roads, footpaths, drainage works, parking facilities, traffic control, depot operations, plant purchase, marine facilities and cleaning of streets.

ECONOMIC SERVICES

Tourism, community development, pest control, building services, caravan parks and private works.

OTHER PROPERTY & SERVICES

Plant works, plant overheads and stock of materials.

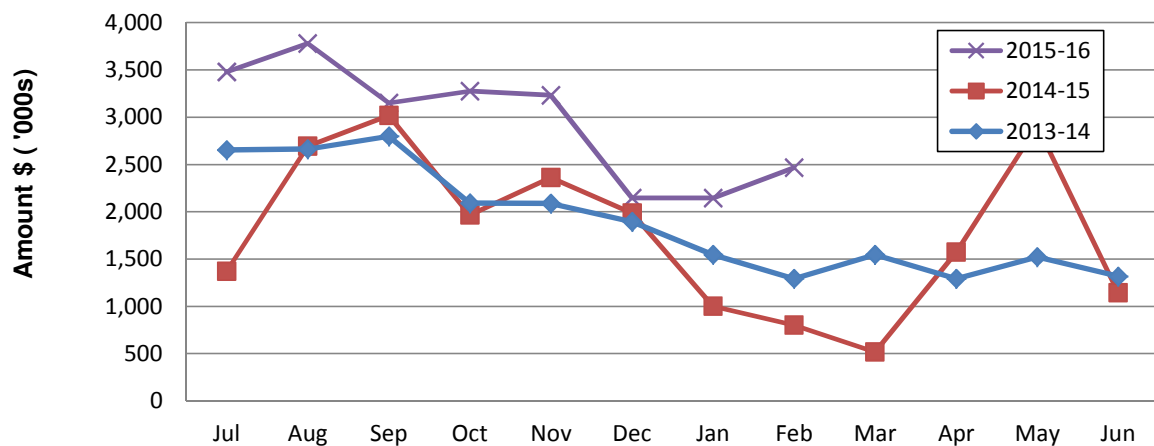

SUMMARY

Council to consider a reduction in electricity charges for the Narembeen Recreation Centre.

BACKGROUND

The following letter has been received from the Narembeen Club Inc.

"I refer to Garry Gregan's letter dated 1st March requesting payment of the outstanding balance due for electricity reimbursement in the sum of \$17,284.44

The matter has been discussed with the committee and we would like to request that consideration be given to dispensation of works during construction of the bowling greens, by way of discounting the electricity fees generated during this time.

Ultimately, we would like to work together with council in order to resolve this issue and come up with a payment plan in order to clear this outstanding debt.

Please find attached a budget forecast providing some indication as to how we expect to be trading by the end of the financial year."

COMMENT

The Narembeen Club commenced operations at the Narembeen Recreation Centre on the 2nd October 2015. Since that time works to complete the recreation centre have continue with works including the construction of fencing and the new bowling greens.

It would be reasonable for Council to consider a reduction of the electricity cost given that power has been used during this period to completion the construction of the facility. It is recommended that Council approve a 10 % reduction in the cost of electricity that has been billed to date providing a reduction of \$1,728 to compensate for power used as part of construction. The power bill has now been transferred into the name of the Club.

It is also recommended that staff be authorised to negotiate a repayment plan with the club for payment of the outstanding amount.

The recreation complex will continue to have high power costs given the large cool room, other refrigerators and lighting. Serious consideration should be given to the installation of solar panels to reduce or offset the cost of power consumption and that a power usage plan/policy is introduced to look at ways to minimise the cost of electricity.
