



- Narembeen Lesser Hall Precinct & Interpretation Project



CHRISTMAS SHOEBOXES




The shoeboxes will be sent to very needy children who live in extreme poverty due to floods, war and dire circumstances.

Wadderin Bushwalk project Can You Help?

Volunteers are needed to assist with further work to be done on Thursday 20th and Friday the 21st of August with the help of local building contractor Chris Batty. Work will probably start at 8am on these days, but any help at any time would be welcome.

- At least 2 people will need to help Steve Fry and Chris with constructing the pavilion.
- There are two walks leading from the pavilion; 1km and 1.6km following kangaroo trails, and Michael Mortimore will use a bobcat to clear logs and bushes. At least 3 people, possibly with chainsaws, will need to stack the cleared material along the sides of the trails.
- Three posts should be concreted in place, which 2 people could do.
- To mark the walks there are 30 stainless steel animal cut-outs which will be bolted onto star pickets along the way. Peter Hall and the Men's Shed will fabricate these, and at some stage these will be put in place.
- The Burgin Road access gravel road has been widened and graded by the Shire, volunteers will need to clear the sides.
- The walks may have litter from the past which volunteers could clear.

The meeting place will be at the pavilion site which is located on the gravel road to the left as Cusack Drive changes from bitumen to gravel.

If anyone has any photos of the Wadderin Dam from many years ago Steve Fry would be keen to hear from you.

HISTORICAL HIGH LIGHTS

The August meeting of the Historical Society was held in the newly renovated 1927 District Road Board Building. The renovations are still to be completed but we are able to conduct our meetings in the Old Council Chambers room, The old display cabinets have had most of the items returned to them and it is looking very welcoming thanks to Kellie and Ian Mortimore who worked hard to replace the items. The lighting and the airconditioner makes it a very pleasant meeting room. It is good to be able to put our flag up too so if you see the flag flying, it means the centre is open and you can pop in to have a look.

We had a good number of people attend and it was great to see our life members, Iris and Melvin Bristow, brave the cold to attend.

The main business matters discussed were as follows:-

Our Billericay information bay is still to be finished.

- There are still some minor renovation items to be completed. These do not prevent us from going ahead and completing the display. Our next room is to be a sporting theme and we will fill our newly donated cabinets with the enormous amount of memorabilia.
- Paperwork is still being stored in the Railway Shed and this needs to be transferred back to the History Centre and filed in the necessary files. A busy bee will be held on 14th September to sort out some of these papers,
- More photographs were found of the Wadderin dam and forwarded to Steve Fry who is collating together historic facts to put on display.
- The organ from the Masonic hall has been installed in the Church Museum. Thanks goes to the men who helped move the furniture around for us. Ian Mortimore used his flat top trailer and Ian Barnett and Peter Steady, visitors from Perth, helped move the table and cupboards as they are too heavy for our members to move.
- Lyn Burford was visiting the town and wanted to return to see where the house used to be when she lived with her parents, policeman Ted Hernden and his wife. Lyn had members of her family with her and Margaret Butler offered to show them around our museums. They were all very impressed with the Spotters Hut, Road Board Building, Grain Discovery Centre and could not speak highly enough of the chalet accommodation at the caravan park. Unfortunately we did not have a great deal of information on the old police station.

Items are being collected for a raffle that will be held late in September.

- Ian Cambell has forwarded us a book he has written including chapters about his grandfather Andrew Cambell who was a miner in the Goldfields and lived in Narembeen in the mid 20's. He is buried in our cemetery..
- The 100 years of local government will be celebrated in 2024 and the members are asked to add to the information already listed.
- We look forward to the Kings Tours visit that is planned to come through the town for a visit early in September. We hope to be able to include a visit to our newly renovated museum and showcase our town to them.

Rosie takes hang

Rosie Hunter has played a lot of football. I mean a real lot. 300 plus games in fact for the Narembeen Footy Club. When you factor in ten years of representative footy this number gets closer to 350. There have been many defining moments in what has been a glittering career. Premierships early on where he played a key role in what was a powerful side. He became the talisman for a club that struggled to replicate that success. Premierships, representative football, fairest and best awards, they have all come Hunters way.

However, there is one event, one memory, one incident that he will, for many, be best remembered for. Rosie Hunter is the man George Reppa took a massive hang on in the 2009 Grand Final in Corrigin. Well on Saturday last at the same venue where he was used as that step ladder some eleven years ago Hunter got his chance and he seized it. Deep in the left forward pocket at the end with the great big drop off Rosie Hunter took a hang. It was one of those hangs where the player seems to stay up there just for that little bit longer to either savour the moment or allow the cameras to click. He hit the ground with a deft touch and then was quick to play on and put his team first.

Now I know what you're all wondering, I know what you're all thinking. How high up did he get, who was the hulking Corrigin player that Hunter used as his step ladder to immortality. Oscar Stone is from good Quairading stock. The Stone's are a strong farming family from a good part of the world. He's also 17 years old and a bit of a little bastard. Indeed, there are yellow shorters in the competition who are bigger than Stone. Stone no doubt has a long career of footy in front of him whether it be at the Tiges or back at his local Bulls. However, one can only wonder whether he will now become known as, the bloke Rosie took a hang on.



VIRTUE OF THE MONTH - CONFIDENCE



- Trust that all things work together for good.




