The Nationals WA will give Country Age Pension Fuel Card a boost

The Nationals WA will boost the Country Age Pension Fuel Card if returned to Government in March 2021.

Making the commitment in Albany today, Leader Mia Davies said \$20 million of Royalties for Regions funding would be committed to boosting card values from \$575 to \$600 and re-linking it to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) from July 2021.

"The Country Age Pension Fuel Card supports regional pensioners, including age pensioners and people with disabilities, to remain active and involved in their communities," Ms Davies said.

"It enables recipients to travel to medical appointments, attend community events, participate in recreational activities and visit family and friends more easily.

"Our commitment recognises that regional pensioners continue to go without access to subsidised or free public transport enjoyed in the city and brings card values up to a level that reflects a fair increase since the Labor Government made cuts in 2017.

"It will help more than 55,000 card holders get out and about in their communities more – which after months of COVID-19 restrictions is more important than ever."

Ms Davies said there were more than 5300 card holders in Albany benefitting from the scheme.

The Nationals WA developed and delivered the policy in 2009 in recognition of the fact regional pensioners often face higher fuel and taxi charges and have limited or no public transport options.

Analysis of fuel prices has shown regional motorists continue to pay more at the bowser than those in the city and access to public transport is either constrained or non-existent.

Ms Davies said The Nationals WA continued to support vulnerable members of regional communities.

"Back in 2017 The Nationals responded strongly to the Labor Government's move to cut CPI indexation and called for the decision to be reversed," she said.

"We also called on the government to rollover unspent fuel card balances that had accrued this financial year as a result of travel and socialisation restrictions.

"Both of those requests were rejected, but The Nationals WA are prepared to fairly support regional pensioners and make sure they remain as connected to their communities as possible."

Ms Davies said The Nationals WA would also replace the issue of annual cards with a permanent card, saving an estimated \$2.3 million in production and distribution costs, as well as allowing for the immediate recharge of card values each financial year.

COUNCIL WRAP - AUGUST 2020

Narembeen RAV Rating & Conditions Review

Council agreed to form a RAV Working Group to assist with undertaking a review of all Shire RAV rated roads and the conditions that are applied to these roads. The Council RAV Working Group will include Cr S Stirrat, Cr R Cole, Cr A Wright, Chris Jackson & Arthur Cousins. SMEC will be engaged to assist with engineering advice and any route assessment submissions that may be required. It is anticipated that the working group prepare a report for Council's October 2020 Ordinary Meeting. Council will be reviewing the Council Policy 10.1.20 Approving Restricted Access Vehicles (RAV) oin Shire Approved Low Volume Roads as part of this process.

RFQ 03/2020—Supply & Delivery of Aggregate

Council approved that Hanson Construction Materials of Rivervale WA be awarded the contract for the Supply and Delivery of Aggregate (supply only) for a period of three years from August 2020 to June 2023, with an option to extend for a further two years, depending on satisfactory performance and service provided. The CEO is to obtain local and other quotes for the cartage of aggregate for the period of the contract with Hanson Construction Materials.

CRISP Wireless Telecommunications Project

Council were advised of CRISP Wirelesses successful application for this project which aims to deliver fixed wireless, enterprise-grade broadband into the Wheatbelt Shires of Merredin, Bruce Rock and Narembeen across an area of up to 9,800 square kilometres. The Shire of Narembeen will be working closely with Go Narembeen on this project.

Local Government House Trust—Deed of Variation

Council approved the Deed of Variation as provided by WALGA.

Narembeen Volunteer Fire & Emergency Services (Narembeen VFES) FES Ministerial Body Lease

Council approved a lease with FES Ministerial Body (DFES) for 24 Latham Road, Narembeen (Narembeen Volunteer Emergency Service Facility) and authorized the CEO to negotiate final lease amendments if required with DFES.

18 Hilton Way, Narembeen

Council approved that the CEO commence a process to dispose of Lot 40 (18) Hilton Way, Narembeen by way of sale in the 2020/21 financial year. Council also approved that the CEO negotiate with potential buyers where multipe offers are received based on presenting the highest offer to Council for review.

Disposal of Surplus Plant & Machinery

Council approved the disposal of one Howard Porter side tipper 43 tonne NB5708 and one Howard Porter 11m3 side and end tipping body with metal spreader. Council also acknowledged the disposal of two Nissan Navara utilities 1HAQ.077 and 1HAQ.076 and one Ford Transit Van NB295. Council approved that these items be disposed by public auction and that the CEO be authorised to set the required reserve price on each item. All proceeds of sale are to be transferred to the Plant Reserve Fund. The public will be provided with the auction information in due course.


