





HISTORICAL CBH - THE BLACK GANG

The CBH Black Gang were a very important part of CBH in its early days from approx. 1937 – 1950's. Life for the workers was very different when compared to the conditions today

The "Gang" were actually the same permanent workers who manned the "Bins" at receival time and trucking out. They became so called because a big part of their job was to spray the floor of the "Bin" after it was emptied plus all around the "Bulk Heads". It was sprayed with creosote, which is a very black and sticky substance. It stuck to everything, including the workers and was very hard to get off. All the bins in this area had to be done so of course the men had to camp out. In those early days there was no accommodation or washing facilities so it was a bucket of water on the open fire but they were not much cleaner after the wash.

The "Bins" were being sprayed to kill the weevils before the next harvest.

The cooking of meals was also done on the open fire. There was nowhere to sleep, so it was in the "Bin" with the weevils, or on the back of the International truck. Some decided to empty out what was called "The Beatle". This held all the railway truck liners etc. To sleep in there was luxury accommodation for some of the men.

The weevil spray smelt terrible and it is a wonder it did not kill them all, however the country was just coming out of the depression and jobs were hard to get.


By the time the men got home on Saturday they were all covered in black creosote - so - a big hot bath and lots of scrubbings - hence the name the "Black Gang" stayed and became almost official. There were about twelve men in this gang.

The other interesting piece of machinery for the gang at receival time was the "Clarke Shovel". Learning to use this piece of machinery to truck the wheat out was a very hazardous process. The "Clarke Shovels" had a mind of their own and it usually took a lot of skin off and meant being thrown around a lot before one mastered the art of pushing the wheat into the elevator and into the rail trucks. It was fascinating to watch a really good "Clarke Shovel" operator, they made it look so easy.

It was certainly not an easy life style, but many great friendships were forged around the camp fire by the "Beatle" after a hard day's work.

That gang of men could never imagine the accommodation that CBH provides for its workers today in 2020.

- Visitors have been shown around our museums by our dedicated members. Bob Franz may be a name some remember; he worked at the Soil Conservation Office and was involved in the Salt Reclaim Levy Banks.
- Bill Lethlean and his wife Lyn together with friends from Perth also visited the town. Bill had 2 Silver Cup trophies that the family has had for some years gathering dust. These were presented at the Bruce Rock Agriculture Show in 1931 1933 to Mr Jack Lethlean for the best Clydesdale Horses. These will be offered to the Bruce Rock Agriculture Society for their historical records.
- Hazel Toovey has written an article about the Beetle at the CBH. This is very interesting reading and makes us appreciate what facilities there are available at the CBH today.





Such beliefs can lead to significant discrimination against people living with dementia.

Dementia Action Week 2020 will demonstrate that many people living with dementia can continue to live well for many years after their diagnosis. Many continue to make significant contributions to our community, they engage, make their own choices and live rich and active lives.

Community organisations, partners and supporters will be able to spread the word and help us reach even more people by sharing our content across their own channels and networks throughout the week. As part of Dementia Action Week, Dementia Australia will be releasing a new tip each day on how everyone can help people living with dementia live well.

RESTRICTED Burning Period (permit required)

19th September to 31st October

The Shire of Narembeen has entered its restricted burning period which runs from 19th September to 31st October. A permit for burning is required and may be obtained from the Shire of Narembeen.

Burning period dates may be varied due to climate or weather conditions. Variations will be advertised via SMS, the Shire website and facebook page.

The Shire of Narembeen Bushfire Notice states that under the Bush Fire Act 1954 that between the 1st day of November in any year until the 30th day of April in the year following fire breaks are to be in place. If it is considered impractical or undesirable to provide firebreaks as required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained for any variation. Approval will only be granted up to or before the 15th day of October, and will not be granted unless prior consent of the appropriate Fire Brigade Officer has been obtained.

Please be advised that inspections of properties will again take place this year and notices will be set if required.

The PENALTY FOR FAILING TO COMPLY with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the costs of performing the work directed by this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner and/or occupier by the date required by this Notice.
