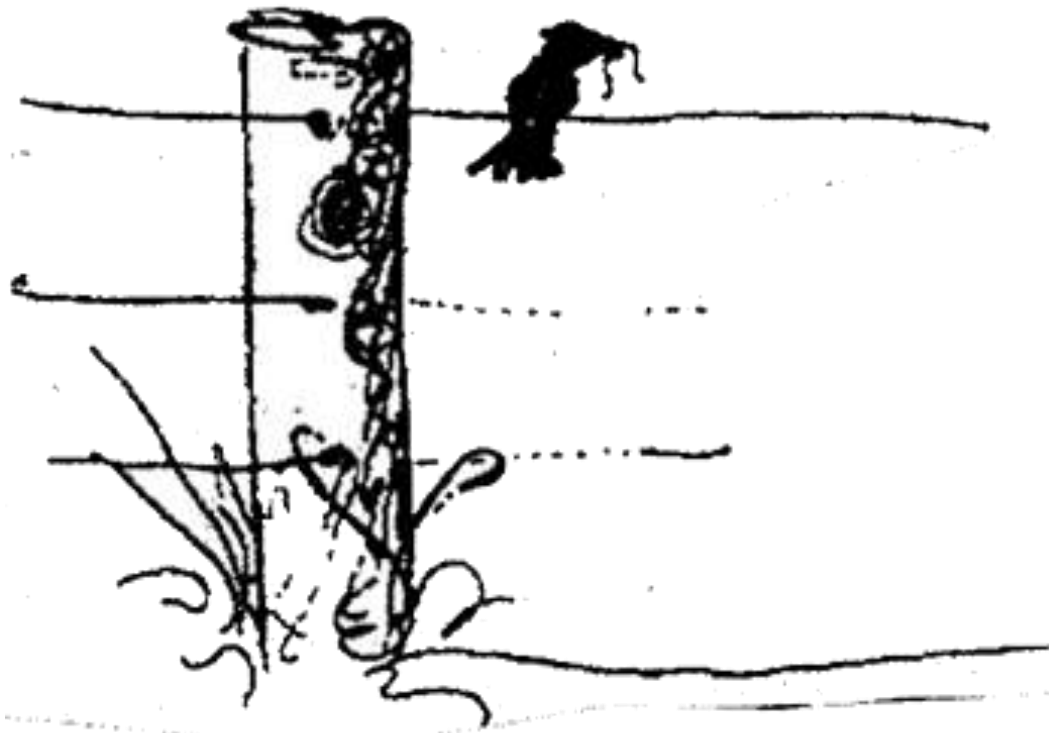

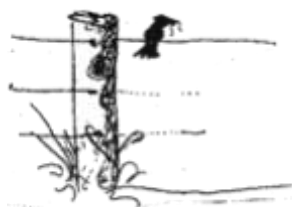

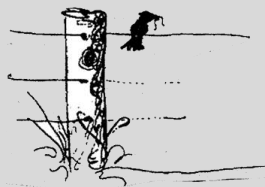

HISTORICAL HIGH LIGHTS

The monthly meeting of the Historical Society was held on Monday October 19th 2020 in our newly refurbished building. It is now finished apart from the signage that is to go out of the front to let people know that it is the History Centre.

There were business matters discussed and these included: -

Our building was inspected by the committee for the Tidy Towns judging, along with the rest of the town of course. We do not know the outcome yet, but they were very impressed with what they saw.

The Sydney Longhurst Sundial Memorial that is positioned at the moment near the Lions Town Clock, is not very visible to the public and it was suggested that we place it in the front of the Road Board Building as he was the first secretary of Narembeen and held this position for several years. As it is a sundial and there is quite an amount of shade in front of the building, it would not be the most suitable position for it. Other sites were suggested but this will need to be discussed with the Shire Council. It would have been very nice to have it there though.

Museum Open signs are being sourced to be displayed outside the museums when they are manned. We have had a lot of people pass through the town in the past couple of months to visit the museums. All the visitors have been impressed. Sylvia Jackson who worked at the hotel in the late 1950's visited and was delighted to find that we still had the information on file that she supplied about 20 years ago. Chas Osborne called in to see if we had any photographs of machinery about 1940's as he is writing his biography and needed some photos to add to the story. The Osbornes had a farm in South Kumminin opposite the farm owned by Moyses. Several other tourists have been shown around the museums by our members and have been astounded with the information that we have.

A glass engraved "Narembeen Hotel" was given to us by Jill McGregor, it came via a friend, Loretta Hambly. The Hamblys were the publicans in the late 40's early 50's. Also donated was an ensemble of jewellery owned by Mrs Babs Hambly.

Aa very interesting letter was donated by Val Bow. It was written by her mother, Mrs Ruby Fidge, giving details of her family, Escott, and some details of early times.

We are still working on updating the information for the 2024 anniversary of local government in Narembeen. Members have been asked to add their input to the already growing collection of data.

Dick Slade has made a wonderful stand for our plan drawers. This saves us bending down to the floor to retrieve the plans, photographs and memorabilia. THANKS DICK. Thanks also to Ian Mortimore, Peter Hall and Michael Lethlean for lifting the drawers , not an easy task.

As the Shire are working on the road near where we are to put the information for Billericay. The installation of it will be put on hold until the works are completed.

The History Centre will be open on the Community Market Day 31st October for visitors to call and in see what has been achieved. Our raffle tickets will be sold on that day. - **COME IN AND HAVE A LOOK AROUND**



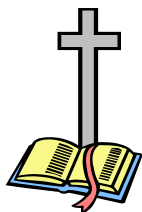
