

## **Big Birthday**


Kenny (Pepper) Lethlean turns 70 this week! Kenny lives in Mandurah.

## **ROAD WORKS AROUND THE SHIRE**

The next few months will be a busy time for the Shire and road work contractors who will be working on improving some of the Shire's road network. These roads include:-

- Merredin-Narembeen Road just north of Narembeen with the replacement of a culvert which is due to commence the week of 9 November 2020.
- Merredin-Narembeen Road just north of Narembeen with 6km of road widening and reconstruction which is due to commence on 11 December 2020
- Latham Road Longhurst Street Currall Street intersections realignment works

### NAIDOC WEEK

This week is NAIDOC week and the 2020 theme – Always Was, Always Will Be – recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years. This week is an opportunity for all Australians to come together to celebrate the rich history, diverse cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as the oldest continuing cultures on the planet.

'Always Was, Always Will Be', acknowledges this nation's story, began at the dawn of time and didn't begin with documented European contact. NAIDOC 2020 invites all Australians to embrace and acknowledge the true history of this country, a history which dates back thousands of generations. The very first footprints on this continent were those belonging to First Nations peoples and they have maintained ongoing spiritual and cultural connections to the land and sea.

All Australians should celebrate that we have the world's oldest oral stories and that our First Peoples engrave the world's first maps, made the earliest paintings of ceremonies, invented unique technologies and built and engineered structures that predate well known ancient sites such as the Pyramids or Stonehenge. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were Australia's first explorers, navigators, engineers, farmers, botanists, scientists, diplomats, astronomers and artists. It is about seeing, hearing and learning the 65,000<sup>+</sup> year history of this county, a country that was criss-crossed by generations of brilliant nations.

The county will be celebrating with various activities and ceremonies this week. However, our school celebration will not be until next Friday November 20 2020. This is due to our wonderful CRC accessing funding for us to be able to have some wonderful aboriginal elders in the school on this date, to run five workshops for all of our students, PP – Year 10. We thank them very much for their continual support of our school community. The students will be involved in dance/didgeridoo, face painting, making damper, art and story time.

#### 2020 TIME CAPSULE





## THE HEAD BUTT

Prodding the system.....

Footy clubs are good at a lot of things. From the small bush club out in the middle of nowhere right up to that big one on Punt Road they all do a lot of things well. A lot of things well. They provide a wonderful place for people to do so many things that they are rightly lauded for doing so. There is no doubt thought they need to keep evolving, keep changing and getting better. I read with great interest about the recent application of netball legend Lisa Alexander for the vacant senior coaching role available at the North Melbourne Football Club. It was a bold move by a high performance coach with a wonderful record. It was obviously a left field idea and one that was as intriguing as it was ambitious. Alexander was quoted in the media as saying that since North Melbourne wanted to win and few had more experience in winning than her then why wouldn't they consider her application. As soon as I read that I sighed and realised this wasn't what I thought it was.

Lisa Alexander's application for the North Melbourne coaching job was a mistake. It was dismissive and it was disappointing. She said in the article I read that she felt since she was a high performance coach, had watched footy and even played it made her a suitable candidate for the job. That's a terribly disappointing statement about how the biggest sport in Australia operates. It's also dismissive and disrespectful of the people who are working hard to get in the process and earn their stripes. Alexander said in the media she was ok with prodding the system. What a shame.



With respect, what Alexander should have done to 'prod the system' was to get on the inside and lead the change. She should have decided to get the accreditation she needed. Get the experience the clubs require and then make her statements. Imagine the story behind the former elite netball coach working her way through the coaching education program of the AFL with a desire to gain a head coaching position. She would have been rushed through and given all the support she needed. Maybe she still will, I hope so.

Sometimes systems need prodding, no doubt. There is a lack of female representation in high performance AFL coaching and administration from the bottom to the top. There are however women all over the country working hard to develop the skills and gain the knowledge required to break that ceiling and change that status quo. It's no doubt tough, tougher than it should be, but they will get there. Lisa Alexander missed an opportunity today, she could have helped all of these ladies by taking the lead and paving the way. She didn't do that and that's a shame.




