You may notice that there are no minimum temperatures this week?! The gauge is out of action. With the heat yesterday it probably wont be a problem!!







There were business matters discussed and these included: -

- The outcome of the Tidy Town judging inspection of The Road Board Building, Cemetery and Lesser Hall Precinct is not yet known but it will be decided in December. We feel sure that our efforts do warrant a place.
- A design for the "Museum Open" sign has not been decided as yet. It needs to be quite large and noticeable for the passing traffic to be interested.
- A raffle is to be conducted on Friday 20th November. 2 large hampers of Christmas gifts and a fruit cake on a glass platter are the prizes. Since this meeting the raffle has been conducted and the winners were Joan Cusack, Maurice Harper and Lorraine Lethlean. Over \$300 was raised for our society and this will go towards our signage.
- The donors for the cabinets have approved the signage that will display their contribution to the Road Board Building. This sign will be on display for all to acknowledge their contribution.
- The History Centre was open to the public on 31st
 October the day of the market in the town hall.
 There were several people who called in to have a look around and were quite impressed with what they saw, especially in the Sporting Section.
- We are still working on updating the information for the 2024 anniversary of local government in Narembeen. Members have been asked to add their input to the already growing collection of data. If you have an event that has occurred since 1974 when the Golden Jubilee was celebrated, we would love to hear about it. 50 years is a long time to remember back but there must be some significant memory that is triggered. eg. The opening of the new Recreation Centre, the closing of Mt Arrowsmith Tennis Club, the birth of the Thomas Triplets, demolition of the Old School Building etc etc. All contributions are welcome

PRESIDENTS REPORT 2020

2020 has been an unusual year as President due to COVID 19. The inability to hold monthly meetings for the first half of the year has reduced opportunities for new projects however we have actively sought community projects to fund in an endeavour to lessen the financial impact of COVID 19 on our community.

This year we have approved funding for a number of projects:-

- \$5,000 for display cabinets for the Narembeen Historical Society (Road Board Building)
- . \$15 000 for the Shire to assist with the future telecommunication project
- \$25 000 to the Narembeen District High School for upgrading all classroom air conditioning systems
- \$70 for every student from year 5-10 towards camp and country week as a one-off payment in light of COVID to help parents who may have been under financial stress, totalling \$3,570
- · 1,000 for the Narembeen CRC Ladies Long Lunch

The Grain Discovery Centre has continued to run without too many issues this year which is a direct reflection of the contribution of Margaret Butler. I would like to thank Margaret for the many hours she has put into this project, cleaning and keeping the centre looking neat and tidy as well as keeping things up to date and user friendly. Margaret has done this voluntarily for many years and we are very grateful for her efforts. Margaret is resigning from this role and she will be greatly missed. On behalf of the committee I thank you.

After discussions about the lack of industrial land in Narembeen, a sub committee was formed to aid in discussions about future possibilities. Much time and effort was put into this and I would like to thank those people involved.

This year, The Co-Op was also impacted by the restrictions put in place by COVID-19. The doors were shut for a few months but since re-opening it continues to be well supported by our locals as well as tourists passing through town. I think it adds so much atmosphere to the main street and is a business we should look after into the future. I thank Sheree Thomas, Amy Hardham, Bianca Currie and Lynda Cornish, who has taken over from Caroline Robinson. The Co-Op would not operate successfully without their support and commitment.

The Roadhouse has taken up much of our time this past year. We are in the process of appointing a property manager and re-drafting a new lease. I thank Sheree Thomas who has done all the work for

this. It is not an easy task and she has spent many hours and days organising and attending meetings, it continues to be a work in progress.

The cropping program has gone smoothly this year once again. Thanks to Azza Lyon, Thommo (Bevan Thomas) and Dylan Cole for their organisation of this and to all the people who donated machinery and time for the project.

Financially we are still doing really well and we are in a position to take on big projects as needed by the community. My vision for these funds would be to buy a small block of land so that we may in future be able to release the Avoca farmland to sporting clubs or the like.

Looking ahead to next year we have talked about reducing the committee down to a smaller number in order that meetings can be run more efficiently. I think this may be an option worth considering.

Thanks to Peter Hall, our Treasurer, thank you for time and input over the many years you have been in this role. Thank you to my Secretary, Sheree, the time and effort you put into your role is invaluable and very much appreciated. You've been working with a President who at the best of times struggles to keep up, only sometimes gets back to you and probably frustrates you immensely. The winner was **Julie Miller** (complaining that her shirt had the aroma of men's deodorant!) Runner up to Julie was **Miranda Noack.**


