





PUBLIC NOTICE CURRALL STREET FOOTPATH CONSTRUCTION



Rainfall in agricultural areas of Western Australia has been below average with many areas receiving inadequate winter rainfall to fill on-farm supplies and community dams.





Kids of the 80s and 90s failing the Slip Slop Slap message

Cancer Council WA is encouraging parents of young children to be SunSmart this summer with new national data showing that 25 – 44 year olds have worrying sun protection habits with one in four (25%) getting sunburnt on summer weekends and more than four in ten (43%) saying they like to get a tan, a sign of harmful UV damage.

Cancer Council WA Wheatbelt Regional Education Officer, Melissa Pickering, said it's important that adults remember to look after themselves, but also to be good role models for their children. "We know parents are pretty good at covering their young kids these days, but often forget to wear their own hats or sun protective gear. That effectively tells kids that adults don't need to bother about sun protection – which is the wrong message in Australia's harsh UV," Ms Pickering said. "No matter where you are, what age you are, or what you're doing, when exposed to UV levels of 3 or above, your skin is being damaged, even if you don't get burnt. This damage is not reversible and it builds up over time and increases your risk of skin cancer. The stronger the UV radiation, the faster the damage is occurring, and that can happen in as little as 10 minutes on a summer day in WA. We are all role models to someone. We know that kids look to parents and older adults and will copy what they see. Role modelling is the easiest way to get kids and the younger generations to use sun protection, so remember to slip, slop, slap, seek and slide when the UV is 3 or above."

David Bolt, a former Corrigin cereal and sheep farmer is no stranger to skin cancer. Being a red-head who had always worked outdoors, David knew he was at high risk of developing skin cancer. Each time he or his wife Chris noticed a new or changed spot on his skin, David would make it a priority to see a doctor. Over the past 20 years, David has had several melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers removed from his back, shoulder, cheek, chest and inner thigh. 'If you're suspicious of anything, just go to the doctor," he said. "I don't understand blokes putting it off."

Ms Pickering said it's important to know what symptoms to look out for. "Get to know your skin and what's normal for you," she said. "If you notice a new spot or mole, a spot that is different from other spots, a crusty or non-healing sore, or any spots, freckles or moles changing in colour, thickness or shape, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker."

"It doesn't mean you have skin cancer, often they turn out to be something less serious, but it's important to get checked."

Great for brunch, a picuic or as a party canapé

Ingredients

- alive or canala ail spray
- I leek, white part only, cut lengthways and linely sliced
- ▲ 600g peeled pumpkin, cut into 1cm cubes
- ▲ 6 eggs, lightly beaten
- ▲ ¾ cup low-fat milk
- 95g reduced-fat feta cheese, cut into 5mm cubes
- ▲ 1% cup chopped basil leaves
- small green salad, to serve

Method

Prehear oven to 200°C (180°C fan forced). Spray a 12 hale, ½ cup capacity muffin pan with all. Spray a non-stick frying pan with all and place on medium heat. Add leek and cook for 3 minutes, stiming occasionally, until softened. Add pumpkin, spray with all and stir to coal vegetables. Add ½ cup water, cover pan and steam for 10 minutes until just tender. Meanwhile, in a medium sized jug, whisk together eggs and milk; season with black pepper. Remove pumpkin mixture from heat and stir through feta and basil. Place muffin pan on a flat baking tray then spoon pumpkin mixture evently into 1.2 holes. Carefully pour over egg triudure to almost fill muffin holes. Bake for 2.5 minutes, or until firm and golden. Cool in the pan for 5 minutes before turning on a wire rack. Serve warm or cold with a green solad.

Variation

Vary vegetables to include any combination of diced sweet potato, peas, corn kernels, chopped mushrooms, spinach, asparagus or semi-sundried tornations, or even leftover roast vegies.

Hint

Use flyme or sage in place of basil. Substitute 2 chapped red anions for leek. Vary vegetables to include any combination of dicad sweet potato, peas, com kernels, chapped mushrooms, spinoch, asparagus or semi-sundried tomatoes, or even leftover roast vegies.

Ingredients

- ▲ Olive or canala oil spray
- ▲ ½ cup brown sugar
- ▲ ½ cup cocoa powder
- ▲ ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ▲ ½ teaspoon baking soda (bicarbonate)
- ▲ 1 cup plain flour
- ▲ 1 cup whalemeal plain flour
- ▲ 3 eggs
- ▲ 200mL plain yoghurt
- ▲ 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- ▲ 3 tablespoons alive or canala oil
- ▲ 2 cups grated zucchini
- ▲ ½ cup sultanas

Hint

There will be little green flecks in the muffins. If this is a problem you can peel the zucchini. Once completely cooled, place in an airtight container and keep for up to 3 days. Freeze muffins in snap lock bags and keep for up to 3 months.

Variation

Try other dried fruit like cranberries or raisins. Add 2 toblespoons chopped nuts or seeds.

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced).
 Spray mulfin tins with oil.
- Place sugar in a large bowl and break up any lumps. Sift in cocoa, baking powder, baking soda and flours, returning husks from the sieve to the bowl.
- Lightly beat eggs in a cup with a fork then add to flour mix with yoghurt, vanilla and oil. Sfir to combine (mix will still be quite dry), then mix in zucchini and sultanos.
- Spoon mixture into prepared muffin tins (makes 18) and bake for 20 minutes or until a skewer poked into the centre of a muffin cames out clean. Coal in tin for 5 minutes then turn onto a wire rack to coal completely.

Preparation time: 10 minutes Cooking time: 20 minutes Makes: 18 muffins

Ingredients

- ▲ 250g high-fibre penne or spiral pasta
- ▲ 3 tablespoons store-bought basil pesto
- ▲ 2 x 250g punnet cherry tomatoes, halved
- ▲ 400g can artichokes, drained, quartered
- ▲ 2 cups rocket leaves

method

- Bring a medium-sized saucepan of water to the boil, add pasta and cook for 10-12 minutes or according to packet instructions.
- Drain well and add to serving bowl and mix through pesto while pasta is warm.
- Add remaining salad ingredients, toss until well combined. Serve immediately or enjoy cold the next day.

Variation

Replace rocket with baby spinach leaves. Serve with a source of pratein to make a complete meal e.g. cooked chicken, fresh or finned fish, white beans, bocconcini or nuts.

Other Mediterranean ingredierts that work well in this salad include chargrilled eggplant, roast capsicum, sundried tomatoes, olives and shredded basil.

Christmas comes early for Durack Agricultural Shows and Field Days

4 December 2020

Shows and field days cancelled because of COVID-19 are about to get some Australian Government funding to ensure they can bounce back in 2021.

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon. Melissa Price is thrilled that 9 of these Durack events will receive more than \$190,000 for administrative support.

"I am a huge fan of the many annual Ag shows held in Durack and I am so glad the first payments under the 'Supporting Agricultural Shows and Field Days' program will roll out before Christmas to support these terrific events," Ms Price said.

This significant package 'Supporting Agricultural Shows and Field Days' program will reimburse eligible costs for shows and field days who had to cancel because of COVID-19.
