TELECENTRES will be established in Hyden, Nurembeen and Katanning following grants made the Federal Government

The rederal Covernment.
The three new centres will bring in 11 the number in WA.
Telecentres provide remote communities with access to infornation technology such as multiourpose computing and telecom-nunications facilities including word processors, photocopying equipment, facsimile and elecronic mail services.

Announcing the grants for the centres Primary Industries and Energy Minister Simon Crean id the grants would help increase

business management and mur-kering of local products.

In some cases the centres, he said, would help local people gain access to distance education and other training helping them gain new skills and qualifications. The new Hyden Resource and

Telecentre will be located in a new community resource centre currently nearing completion.

In conjunction with TAFE the centre will be used to facilitate delivery of distance education program to the community.

The facility will also be used to

provide IT training to local stu-dents.

The telecentre will provide sup-port to small businesses in the area, particularly for marketing initiatives such as those related to promoting local tourist attractions such as Wave Rock.

The centre will also be used to help local farm management in-cluding administration of seasonal labour contracts.

The new Katanning centre will serve the town and surrounding districts of the Central Great Southern region.

Building on Knowork's existing record in the field of distance edu-

cation and 1T training the relecentre will address these needs using up-to-date technology.

The new facility will be located at Reidy House providing facilities for training and individual



Expressions of Interest - Industry Funding Scheme committees (Biosecurity)

Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees and/or the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

Industry Funding Schemes enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and others with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

The Review Panel reviews applications for payments made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, where the applicant is dissatisfied with the outcome of their application and requests a review.

The Minister for Agriculture and Food appoints members for a period of up to three years. The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development provides support to the schemes, committees and panel.

During 2021, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

- Cattle Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)
- Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)
- Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

From 1 July 2021, there will be three vacancies on the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

The Management Committees meet quarterly on dates agreed by members. The Review Panel convenes when a review of an application for payment, made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, is requested.

Members of the Management Committees and Review Panel are remunerated, including sitting fees and travel expenses.

More information, including the terms of reference and selection criteria, is available on the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website at agric.wa.gov.au. Search for 'Committee membership EOIs'.

The Western Australian Government is committed to ensuring diversity on Government boards and committees and, in particular, increasing the representation of women to 50 per cent.
