



Machinery repair work aids farmers

A UNIQUE employment programme by Narembeen's biggest business, Nichols, is helping local farmers make ends meet.

The owner of the business, Mr Terry Nichols, said that the scheme began this year.

Farmers from the area experiencing financial difficulties were employed in the Perth workshop.

Harvesters

They have been making repairs to combine harvesters.

Mr Nichols said that country businesses in general were experiencing a downturn in trade.

"We decided to set up this business repairing concaves from harvesters and importing parts," he said.

"There is no such thing as qualified staff in this field but there are workers with the necessary experience.

"These two men have been working for me over the past three months. "It is seasonal work but we will expand as much as we can."

Repairs to concaves, which thresh the crop, are usually carried out in the off-season and just prior to harvest.

Mr Nichols said that this season work began at the Perth business in September, but next year it was planned to begin work in July.

Productive

"The system helps the men get out and be productive for the three to four months of the year that they are not working on the farm," he said.

The programme began with a general expansion of the Nichols business and the need to have experienced workers repairing concaves.

"I would have set up the business here in Narembeen but there are big problems of decentralisation," he said.

"Farmers can save money by sending their parts to Perth and sav-

ing the cost of having to send them on to Narembeen."

He said that he was hopeful of employing more local farmers at the Perth end of the business to give them a helping hand.


The farmer thus maintained an income during a lean time and the business gained experienced staff.

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

AUTUMN CLUB GUEST SPEAKER

DIRECT REACH ETHIOPIA

Des Pauley, Rural Ambassador and Director of Direct Reach Ethiopia – a farmer from Dudinin was our guest speaker last Thursday giving us a wonderful insight into the programme run by Direct Reach Ethiopia. This is an Australian "not for profit" organization which supports AIDS Orphans in Ethiopia.

Group Homes have been set up and through the power point presentation that we saw, these are nothing more than *hovels* which are gradually being improved by the intervention of DRE. Eight to ten children live in a group home with a group mother. Some are not strictly orphans but have become disassociated from family through AIDS. Approximately 130 children are housed in this way in this particular project. Approximately half are HIV positive. There are 5 million children affected by AIDS in Ethiopia.

Explaining his involvement, Des told us that for many years he gave Christmas gifts to his nieces and nephews. As they grew older he discussed with them the idea of using the money to sponsor children in Third World countries. After some time he became disenchanted with the red tape and waste of funds on administration, then he discovered Direct Reach Ethiopia, and over the past few years has visited Ethiopia with another member of the group – Sara Franklyn (Managing Director). A lawyer from Perth, Sara has worked as a volunteer with DRE since it was founded in 2013 and has visited Ethiopia on over 23 occasions.

Ethiopia being a landlocked country it is impossible to send donated items by sea. There are also many government protocols in place presenting more difficulties. However with fundraising and visits by members of DRE a great deal has been achieved. When Des and Sara Franklyn travel to Ethiopia they take limited personal belongings and as much other as they can manage for the children. Luggage is usually about 50 kg into Ethiopia and 3kg returning. We saw a picture of a group of children totally dressed in clothing donated from Australia. This had to be sent by air.

Priorities of the organization:

Support of basic education with after school tuition - subjects being English, Computing, Art, Crafts, Cultural dance, Music, Sport.

Practical training in edible gardening production. There is a lack of protein in their diet so this is a tool to alleviate this to a degree.

Raising chickens and egg production (diet and for sale).

Life skills training.

Health and nutrition.

Girls' empowerment. (Previously during menstruation girls had to miss school due to lack of required toiletries). The group has provided sanitary packs (washable), so that their schooling is not interrupted.

Budgeting - first around meals/housekeeping. This is then broadened to encompass small business enterprises eg. coffee stalls, the production of board games, material shopping bags, sewn using old Singer sewing machines, roadside hairdressing etc.

Old computers are also utilized. The students can download at uni and then study at home. Power is a problem but with some of the new solar gadgets and other hardware bits and pieces this is being addressed albeit slowly.

Des told the story of 'The lame boy who walked' - a young lad who had been lame for years and had received no medical intervention. From somewhere the group procured calipers and after months of application he finally took some steps and eventually walked.

Another bittersweet example was of the young man who had done very well at school and was to graduate from university. His father had died and his mother was living in another area. He was able to make contact with her and the night of the graduation she rang her son. How proud she must have been! She died the next day.

Des is looking forward to the travel restrictions being lifted so he can once again visit Ethiopia. The general comment after the presentation concluded was 'I could have listened for another hour or two'. Des has promised to keep in touch and tell us how our contribution will be spent. The Autumn Club will also provide some comfort items when he is able to travel and distribute them.

The tower will be installed by CRISP Wireless, a Network owner/operator licensee for Wireless Broadband services in Western Australia.

CRISP provide a telecommunications service that utilises point to point secured wireless connectivity between sites as well as community wireless services and subscriber broadband.

SHIRE OF NAREMBEEN AMENDMENT LOCAL LAWS

Pursuant to Section 3.12(3) of the Local Government Act 1995, notice is hereby given that the Shire of Narembeen Amendment Local Laws as listed below be made:-

Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2021

The purpose of the Local Law is:-

To amend the principal local law to ensure that its provisions are within the powers provided to the Shire of Narembeen under the enabling legislation.

The effect of the local law is:-

To ensure that the Shire of Narembeen can effectively enforce compliance by all persons engaged in the administration of the cemetery, burying deceased in the cemetery, or otherwise providing services to or making use of the cemetery.

Justification for the local law is:-

Following the making of the Shire of Narembeen Cemeteries Local Law on 20 May 2020 and the review of the Local Law by the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation, it was advised that amendments were required to the Local Law.

Fencing Amendment Local Law 2021

The purpose of the local law is:-

To amend the principal local law to ensure that its provisions are within the powers provided to the Shire of Narembeen under the enabling legislation.

The effect of the local law is:-

To ensure that the Shire of Narembeen can effectively enforce the established minimum requirements for fencing within the district

The justification for the local law is:-

Following the making of the Shire of Narembeen Cemeteries Local Law on 20 May 2020 and the review of the Local Law by the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation, it was advised that amendments were required to the Local Law.

Copies of the Amendment Local Laws may be inspected or obtained from the Shire of Narembeen, 1 Longhurst Street, Narembeen.

The Amendment Local Laws were gazetted on Friday 19th March 2021 and will come into operation on Friday 2 April 2021.





Phase 1B COVID-19 vaccine rollout begins in Durack next week.

18 March 2021

Phase 1B of the rollout will begin across Durack next week, with a focus on the elderly, indigenous people, those with underlying medical conditions and more healthcare workers.

Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price, said services will begin from next Monday, March 22.

"Phase 1B of the rollout will see 6 facilities initially available in Durack including the Broome Respiratory Clinic, Broome Regional Aboriginal Medical Service and in Kununurra at the Ord Valley Aboriginal Health Service, and Wunan Health and Geraldton's Respiratory Clinic", she confirmed.

"Nationally over 100 Aboriginal Health Services and 130 Commonwealth operated GP-led Respiratory Clinics, who have been instrumental partners in the COVID-19 response to date will be progressively added as additional vaccine providers," Ms Price said.

Those eligible for Phase 1B will be able to find a vaccination provider through the new national vaccination information and location service, at the Department of Health website.

This will enable people to locate their nearest general practice providing General Practice Respiratory Clinic vaccinations and link through to their online booking system or phone number to make the appointment.

Appointments on the service finder will increase as general practices establish their systems and vaccine supply. More appointments will become available as more clinics come on-board.

People will still be able to book their vaccine appointments directly at a participating general practice – as they do now, for instance, to get a seasonal flu vaccine.

As the rollout moves into Phase two, additional general practices and selected community pharmacists will also participate in the program. No-one will miss out, whether they live in a city or country town or a very remote area.
