My Aged Care

A guide to accessing aged care services

As you get older, living independently in your own home can become more challenging. If you are finding it harder to do the things you used to, ask for help from My Aged Care! Asking for help does not mean losing your independence. Getting support with your daily activities means you can stay independent in your own home for longer. Your GP or local health service can assist you with this process, if needed.

Step one: Learn about the different services available

- meals and other food services
- · personal care services
- · nursing care services
- Allied Health/therapy services
- short-term care
- domestic assistance
- home and garden maintenance
- home modifications/goods, equipment and assistive technology
- transport services
- social support services.

Step two: Apply for an assessment

Contact My Aged Care either online at myagedcare.gov.au or over the phone on 1800 200 422. You will need your Medicare number for this. They will confirm your eligibility for an assessment.

Once your eligibility and needs have been confirmed, you may receive an in-person assessment from:

Low Care - Regional Assessment Service (RAS) for services provided through the Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP).

Higher Care - Aged Care Assessment Team for a Home Care Package or residential aged care. You will be notified of your assessment outcome by letter.

Step three: Find a provider that is right for you and arrange your services

If you are approved for CHSP services, your local CHSP provider will contact you to commence services. The services that CHSP can provide will depend on their funding and staff availability.

If you are approved for a Home Care Package, you will be placed on a waiting list and contacted by letter when a package becomes available in your area. CHSP services will be put in place and will continue until a package is made available to you. If you are having difficulty finding a package provider, contact the Wheatbelt Aged Care Unit on 9690 1318 or email WACHS-WheatbeltACAT@health.wa.gov.au.

Step four: Manage your services

Once you are receiving services, there may be times when you need to make some changes to them. Your care needs may increase, or you may have regained some aspect of your independence and no longer need a particular service. If these changes occur, please discuss this with your service provider.

100 Goals.....

Correct me if I am wrong but I think Chris MaGuire was the last one to do it. Simon Dawson back in the day I am pretty sure did it. After that I think you may have to go back a fair way to find a forward who kicked more than 100 goals in an EDFL season. Tough to do in only fourteen games no doubt but could it be possible in 2021? I think it could.

Three facts make me think that it may well happen. Fact one, the league competition is sixteen a side. This rule naturally makes the game at this level more open and conducive to ball movement. With coaches seemingly unwilling to drop a spare player back, that would leave you with only four forwards, this rule pays the way for forwards to move into space, get on out and get more shots on goal.

Fact two, the six-six-six rule, or in the case of the EDFL five-six-five rule. It is plain to see at the higher levels that if a side can get on top in the middle of the ground then they can give their forwards a great look at early shots at goal. 


