



#### **The Foreign Legion**

One of the great strengths of the Narembeen Footy Club over the last twenty years has been the annual involvement of the foreign legion. For years the club had an annual intake of four or five exchangees who had been told by the farmer they were working for, to expand their Aussie experience by playing footy.

They however haven't been the only internationals who have been part of the legion. The way the club has also been improved by Kiwis who are in town shearing has been just a beautiful part of so many Hawks seasons since the turn of the century.

Who remembers Dario? In 2005 Dario, who as Brazilian and sorry I have forgotten his last name, came to town as an exchange worker for one of the big Mt Walker famers and was the most wonderful addition to the club. He was larger than life



both on and off the field and from memory had the most infectiously positive outlook on life. I have thins memory of the whole crowd going absolutely bananas when he kicked his first, and only, goal at Narembeen. He was presented with a ball at the wind up that year and the whole joint erupted into chanting his name. I wonderful bloke.

Then there was big Eon Smith. Eon was a big blonde Afrikaaner who worked for the Cowans in 2008. With

a background in Rugby Union, Eon was quick to get a handle on the physical side of the game. He was also quick however to become one of the better kicks I have seen of the legion. Billy Cowan tells a story of Eon kicking a footy at work watching it bounce and trying to control it on the run. Eon played in a Ressies flag that year I am pretty sure and was a wonderfully addition to the footy club.

Gareth Okane was a little Irish bloke with a heart that filled his chest. He worked for the Cowans as well, maybe we should buy Billy and Pete a beer, and was perhaps the quickest international to get his hands on our great



game. Gareth did play in a flag and also played some league footy. He was tough, ran in straight lines and applied his understanding of Gaelic footy to our footy wonderfully well.

Of the Kiwis that have played for our great club Lindsay Brown has led the way. Now, in what is a wonderful part of country footy, he finds his two eldest boys playing good senior footy for the club while he plays as well. Linds is as tough as they come and has always been the ultimate team man. Linds has played good league footy and in a couple of Ressies flags. He will play his 100<sup>th</sup> game for the club soon which will be a tremendous effort by a quality blokes.

I could go on forever as I know I have left out many great blokes from all over the world that have played footy for the Hawks. So many from Europe, so many great Kiwi fellahs and even a coupe of fellahs from South America. More than once if it wasn't for the Foreign Legion the Hawks would have struggled to field a Ressies side. Unfortunately, the pandemic has limited the inflow of internationals for the second season now but a couple have still made their way down to the footy. The whole club is a whole lot better for it.

#### GRANT OPPORTUNITY—POWERING COMMUNITIES

Grants of \$5,000 to \$12,000 are available to help **not-for-profit** community organisations reduce energy use, improve energy productivity and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Up to 12 projects in each federal electorate will be funded to a total value of \$67,700.

#### Who is eligible?

Organisations must have an ABN and be either an incorporated not-for-profit or an incorporated trustee on behalf of a trust with responsibility for a community asset or property.

#### What can the grant be used for?

The grant can be used for:

- energy generation projects including solar photovoltaic panels and battery storage
- new split system air conditioners to replace some older types of units
- · solar and heat pump bathroom and kitchen hot water heaters to replace older units
- replacement of non-LED lighting with LED lighting
- control upgrades for air-conditioning and lighting
- appliance replacements including induction cooktops and commercial refrigeration
- other activities including energy audits and installing metering equipment.

### **Courtesy Speed Display Signs**



Do the right thing and SLOW DOWN!

#### New speed signs set to help reduce travel speeds on Latham & Merredin-Narembeen Road, Narembeen

The Shire of Narembeen is continuing its commitment to creating a safe environment for all road users by installing the courtesy speed display signs on Latham & Merredin-Narembeen Road in Narembeen during the month of June 2021.

Excess speed has been an issue in this area, with road accidents and death tolls increasing in country towns and the courtesy speed display signs, on loan from WALGA's RoadWise, aims to help reduce average travel speeds in Shire.

By recording the speed of approaching vehicles, displaying the recorded speed, and informing the driver if they need to change their driving behaviour (using a 'thank you' or 'slow down' message), the courtesy speed display signs serve as an immediate reminder for drivers to slow down.

The courtesy speed display signs will support other road safety activities in Narembeen including SOCK (Save Our Country Kids) Week 2021. An initiative by the Narembeen Community Resource Centre to promote road safety and inform children as well as all other members in the community and surrounding communities of the importance of doing the right thing on the roads.





#### More funds flow for Durack's Local Governments

#### 8 June 2021

Durack Local Government Shires and Councils have been receiving very good news of their further budget allocation of the Morrison Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program.

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon. Melissa Price said local councils will directly benefit from the funding boost.

"All 51 Shires in Durack will receive a share of an additional \$1 billion through Phase 3 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program. By now local councils would have received confirmation of their extra LRCI funding which means even more money for upgrades to local roads, bike paths, community halls, playgrounds, parks and sports facilities, as well as improved accessibility to public facilities," Ms Price said.

"Providing more time for planning and construction will enable local governments to consider a broader range of priority projects and potentially undertake larger, more complex developments to deliver even great benefits for their communities," she said.

"The extra funding from the Morrison Government is all about supporting the resilience of regional local economies like Durack, by delivering even more jobs to help communities bounce back from COVID-19, with the additional funding and a longer delivery window to provide greater flexibility for communities to address local priorities." Ms Price said.

Councils will be able to access funding through LRCI Phase 3 from 1 January 2022, with Phase 3 projects to be completed by 30 June 2023.
