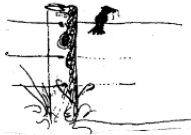

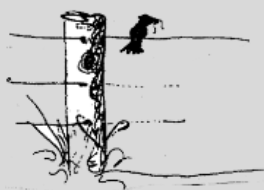

Sport Byes

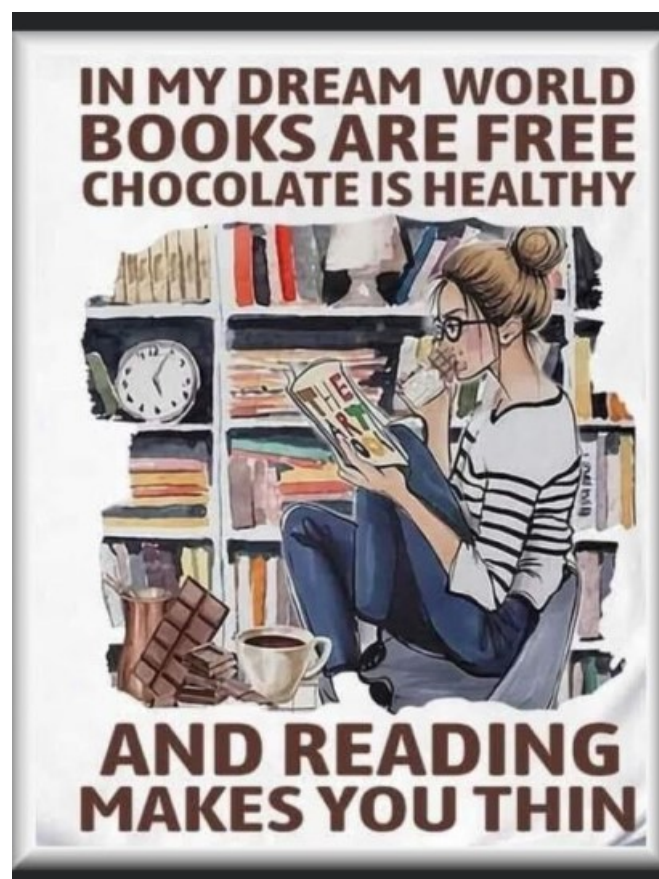

PLANNED POWER OUTAGE—WESTERN POWER

Western Power will be conducting maintenance on power poles in town on **Wednesday 14 July 2021** between 7:30am and 5pm

If you have not received a notification and believe your property may be affected, please call **Western Power on 13 10 87**.

Handy tips for how to prepare:

- Cordless phones, including NBN phones won't operate without mains power, so we recommend having an alternative phone available.
- Power fluctuations may occur when power is restored, so it's helpful to unplug sensitive appliances such as computers and TVs to reduce the risk of damage. • Unplug electric heaters or air conditioners so they are off when power is restored.
- Adjust your fridge and freezer to the coldest setting.
- If you have solar panels, check your system is back on after the outage. Not all solar inverters will switch back on automatically after a power outage.
- If you have automatic garage doors or security gates, make sure you know how to operate them manually, or leave your car parked outside.
- Leave a light on inside your house, so you know when power is restored.
- Alarm systems, lifts and escalators may not operate during the power outage or may need to be reprogrammed once power is restored.

Building Maintenance Officer

The key objectives of this position are:

- Responsible for ensuring the Shire's building assets are maintained to a high standard.

Project Defib provides every sporting club, school and not for profit in Australia with an opportunity to access over \$1,000 worth of subsidy to put towards the latest Lifeline Defibrillator package.

This will enable sporting clubs to safeguarded their players, spectators and coaches with the most comprehensive defibrillator program. This program will assist every sporting club in Australia in reducing the number of fatalities resulting from cardiac arrest.

WATER CORPORATION—ESSENTIAL WORKS

Water Corporation will be conducting essential works in Narembeen.

There will be a temporary water supply interruption for up to five hours.

Wednesday 21 July at 8pm

Before the water supply interruption, customers are urged to turn off the main tap at the water meter. If you have an electric hot water system, we recommend that you turn off its power supply.

Other handy tips:

- Fill kettles and store some drinking water in the fridge
- Use showers or baths before the water supply is interrupted
- Store water in buckets or other large containers to flush the toilet

During the water supply interruption

- Toilet cisterns will need to be refilled from a bucket
- Do not use automatic dishwashers or washing machines

After the water supply interruption, turn the main tap at your water meter back on, run your inside taps for a minute to remove any air that may be trapped in the pipes before turning your electric hot water system power supply back on.

MIA'S LOCAL HERO GRANTS HELPING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Forty community groups across the electorate of Central Wheatbelt are set to benefit from grants awarded under the latest round of *Mia's Local Hero Grants*.

Local Member Hon Mia Davies MLA set up the grant scheme in 2020 to help support local community groups based across her electorate, and this is the fourth round of the program.

"Our team designed the program to target local community groups with small but meaningful grants that assist them run events, pay for equipment, buy supplies or host visitors to the region to coach or speak at forums," Ms Davies said.

"These groups support and enrich our local communities and the grant is my way of saying thank you for that work.

"The *Local Hero Grants* program has provided grants of \$250 per applicant in this round, and we received some really wonderful submissions."

Ms Davies said successful applicants in this round included the Better Bencubbin Progress Association, Koorda Primary School P&C, Lake Yealering Progress Association, Pingelly Tourism Group and Popanyinning Progress Association.

"I'm looking forward to visiting with some of these organisations as I travel around the electorate, they are doing some fantastic work," she said.

"Projects like the new community garden space in Brookton is encouraging people to join up and get involved, attracting gardeners of all ages, and sharing skills and connecting community.

"The Kellerberrin Riding and Pony Club are constructing a new gate for the grounds to meet their insurance obligations and make it easier for members and guests to access the facility."

Ms Davies said each applicant was doing something to connect, nurture and support a strong community in the Wheatbelt.

"There will be additional rounds announced later in the year, so if you missed this round, I'd encourage you to apply when we re-open another down the track," she said.

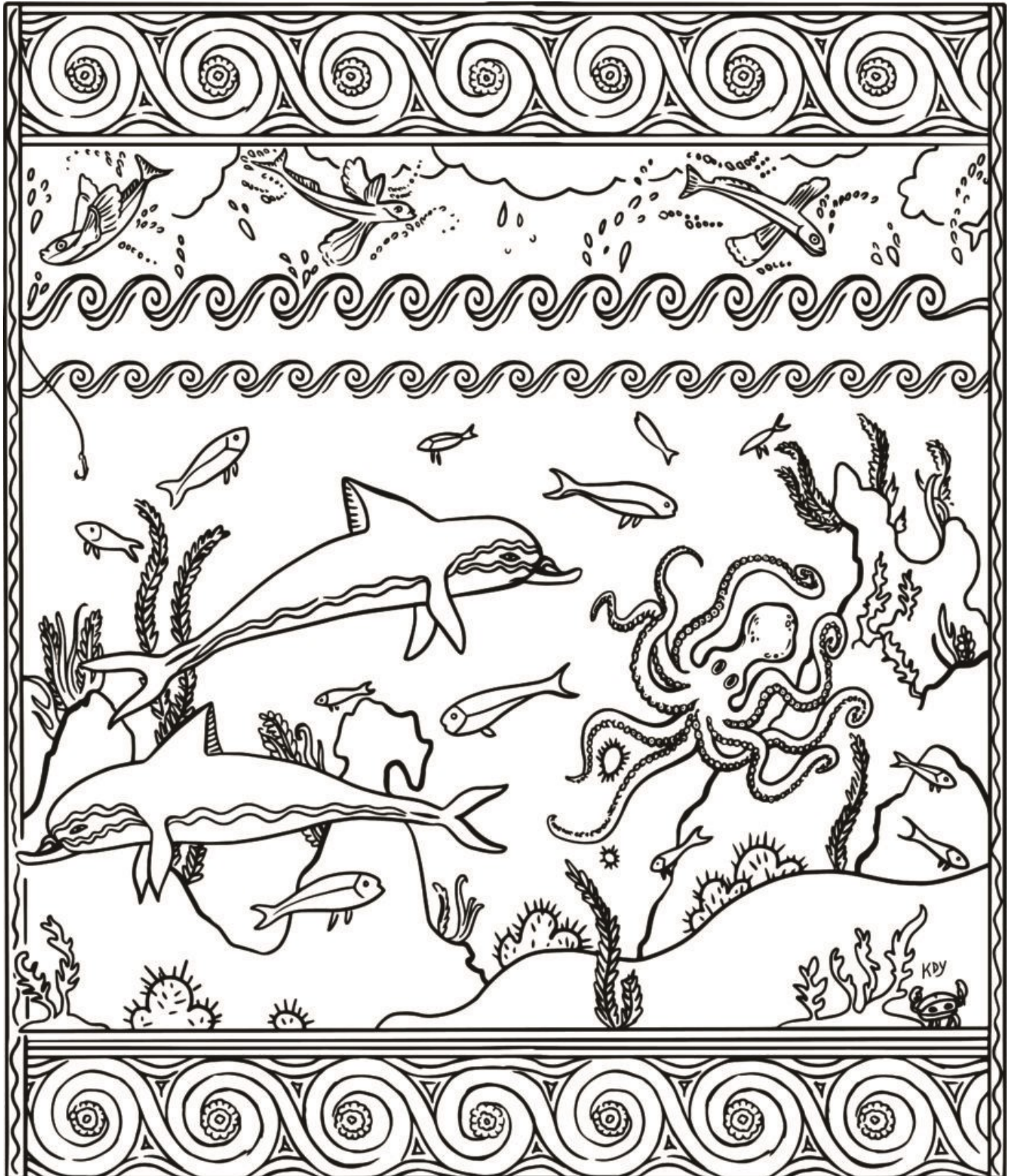

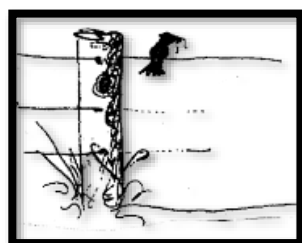
