

NAREMBEEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY — Part 3

Story taken from 'The Democrat' October 1, 1963 of Sir Charles Latham by Bill Courtney.

THE NINE-YEAR-OLD ORPHAN MIGRANT WHO BECAME A LEGEND WITHIN HIS LIFETIME.

PROFILE

The aunt in far-off Hillstone had her own problems too—little ones. She had a family, and times were hard. So the extra mouths from the old country were expected to feed themselves with the shortest possible delay.

They did—they all got jobs, toeholds it is true, but you have to start somewhere in carving a career.

Young Charles got the job with the dairy supplier for Hay—that was the job where he worked for an average of 102 hours a week for food and clothing.

Sir Charles, looking back, can still remember those winter mornings of frost, stumbling half asleep and bare -foot across the ice-white paddocks to round up the cows.

Soon the young newchum was milking a cow every ten minutes—and every one cleanly stripped too.....the medicine of the legrope was not reserved for unauthorized naps in working hours alone.

MOONLIGHT

He can also remember the summer heat of Hay—it can be hot and dusty, too, out on the western plains.

Charles stood that job for two-and-a-half years. Then, at the age of 11½ he decided that he and the cows of Hay would part.

They did—one moonlight night. Then came a succession of jobs; the kind of job an active youngster may expect to get it he has ambition and very little education.

There was the job of teamster's offsider with brother Dick; hauling stores over the blacksoil plains with a team of horses from the rail head to outlying stations and settlements. Some hauls were 170 miles east of the railhead; days of heat and dust, or bogged in black bottomless glue of the blacksoil after rain, nights around the camp fire—and anyone who has not camped in a swag under those glorious starts has missed something magnificent.

There was the interlude—at 15—of taking any sort of job that would bring in an honest shilling.....fencing and wellsinking, working with the banjo, and holding his own with grown men.

Those were the days when a man had to stand on his own feet—and a boy of fifteen needed to eat.

Times were still hard, but like most times in Australia.....you could always manage to keep going if you were prepared to work.

Charles can remember today the fight he had then to keep ahead—in those days the young man who wanted to get out of the rut had just as many hurdles to face as today.

But a willingness to work—and work hard—was never a handicap in Australia. It was not then, it is not today.

25 West Aussies a week diagnosed with bowel cancer

Cancer Council WA is encouraging adults in the Wheatbelt region to familiarise themselves with the common symptoms of bowel cancer, with data revealing more than 25 people a week are diagnosed with bowel cancer in WA. Wheatbelt Regional Educational Officer, Melissa Pickering said bowel cancer, also known as colorectal cancer, is the second most common cancer in Western Australia, affecting both women and men.

"Our latest data reveals that in 2017, more than 1,300 Western Australians were diagnosed with bowel cancer and close to 400 people lost their lives from the disease," Ms Pickering said. "In the Wheatbelt in 2017, 51 people were diagnosed with bowel cancer and 15 people died from it.

"We know people living in regional Australia have <u>lower rates of five year survival for all cancers combined</u>, compared with people living in major cities, so we urge anyone in the wheatbelt experiencing a symptom to visit their doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker."

Common symptoms of bowel cancer include: blood in your poo (even just one time)or, for more than four weeks; a new pain, lump or swelling in your tummy; feeling tired; looking pale; losing weight without trying; problems breathing; not feeling hungry; and a change in normal bowel habits such as runny poo, pooing more often or finding it hard to poo.

Ms Pickering said people from regional WA were particularly likely to delay going to a medical clinic when they were experiencing symptoms, with many thinking the symptom could be due to something else.

"If you're unsure about a possible symptom you should make an appointment to discuss the change with your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible," she said.

"Being bowel cancer aware and knowing the symptoms could help find bowel cancer early, which increases the chance of successful treatment."

Bowel cancer champion Mary French from Geraldton knows all too well how important it is to react quickly to unusual body changes and recommends regional men and women listen to their bodies.

" Please do not hesitate seeking medical help when you have bowel irregularities" she said.
