



NAREMBEEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY— Part 7 Final

Story taken from 'The Democrat' October 1, 1963 of Sir Charles Latham by Bill Courtney.

THE NINE-YEAR-OLD ORPHAN MIGRANT WHO BECAME A LEGEND WITHIN HIS LIFETIME.

HONOURS

He remained M.L.A. for York until 1942, and became Deputy Premier and Minister for Lands and Health between 1930-33.

He was Leader of the Country Party 1930-42; Leader of the Opposition 1933-42; represented the W.A. British Empire Parliamentary Association at the Jubilee of King George V in 1935.

The history that Charles Latham made in those years will become part of our heritage.



In 1942 he went to Canberra as a Senator from Western Australia, and in 1943 became the Deputy Director of Commonwealth Loans and National Savings—in charge of W.A.

In 1946 he became the Member of the Legislative Council for the Central Province—and President of the Legislative Council in 1958.

The Hon. Charles Latham became Sir Charles in 1948.

Sir Charles was now retired from the role of active statesman. He lives in West Perth today with two great interest remaining.

The first is the Country Party—for in the Country Party he sees the true stability of Australia, the vital importance of giving the primary producer a strong voice in the Parliament.

The other is children. Sir Charles has served as chairman of the Save The Children Fund and other organisations that devote their time and energies to helping underprivileged children.

Sir Charles is today treasurer of the Country Party; he is our senior member—but above all he is an inspiration.

If he can create the record that stands behind his reputation, then so can any other young man—if he has what it takes.

Few today can begin with so many handicaps—and the opportunity for service still remains.

We will always need men of the calibre of Sir Charles Latham in Australia.



Sir Charles was an early visitor to the 1963 Perth Royal Show.

We caught him at the Wesfarmers' stand with Bert Armstrong of Wesfarmers and Fred Frank, Salesmanager for the firm manufacturing these ali metal mesh sheepyards, ARC Engineering, of Welshpool.

Sir Charles, a foundation Wesfarmers Shareholder, is a keen advocate of W.A. produced products.


Nominations are being accepted in the following categories:





GEOLOGY - GC DRILLING PROGRESS







Government must act to ramp up vaccination rates for Wheatbelt, says Davies

Local Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA has called on the Labor Government to ramp up efforts to increase vaccination rates in Wheatbelt communities.

She said vaccination rates needed to rapidly improve, calling for alternative delivery methods to be considered to ensure people living in all corners of the State could get the jab.

"The fact that only 19.4 percent of eligible people are fully vaccinated in Merredin and 25 percent in Northam is simply not good enough," Ms Davies said.

"Low vaccine rates and a struggling health system are a recipe for disaster.

"The Government should consider implementing measures like targeted pop-up clinics in rural and remote areas to quickly boost accessibility and uptake of the vaccine."

Ms Davies said the Opposition had made suggestions to set up walk-in clinics at major regional events, but the Labor Government had rejected the idea.

"We know a majority of West Australians want to roll up their sleeves and get the job done, but that is difficult to do when we have regional clinics that are only open a few times a week," she said.

"It needs to be made as simple as possible for everyone, and the figures released over the weekend demonstrate there's more work to be done.

"The Health Minister says that targeted walk-in clinics may eventually be part of the solution and I'm asking why it isn't part of the solution already."

"Vaccination and investment in our crumbling health system are key to WA avoiding what's happening in NSW, and we should be making every effort to do this while we are COVID-free," Ms Davies said.

"Labor must be more creative when it comes to vaccine accessibility, otherwise we will continue to see these low rates in communities."

COMMUNITY SPORT IN THE EASTERN WHEATBELT

BACKGROUND

The Wheatbelt Provision of Community Sport project was initiated in 2019/20. The project identified the **common factors of success in rural**Winter sports clubs and associations; specifically how competitions and governance could lead to improved participation both on and off the field and reduced volunteer fatigue. In 2021 the project now offers on the ground, local support to develop and implement solutions local Winter sports clubs and associations face.



- Case studies presented to Wheatbelt Winter sports clubs and associations focusing on different competition and governance arrangements
- A Community Return to Sport workshop in Narembeen to address challenges and develop solutions to Winter sports participation (volunteers, players and spectators) in the eastern district.
- Formation of a **Winter Sports Working Group** to further progress whole of community solutions in sport in the eastern Wheatbelt.
- Three rounds of one day sport in season 2021 were achieved
- Presentations to local clubs and associations to continue the conversation about strengthening community sport

WINTER SPORTS WORKING GROUP

The WSWG met for the first time in early August 2021. The purpose of the group is to activate Winter sports participation in the communities of Kellerberrin, Merredin, Southern Cross, Narembeen, Bruce Rock, Corrigin, Kulin, Kondinin, Hyden and Lake Grace.

Members of the group include: Tanya Butler (Bruce Rock), Craig Mayfield (Hyden), Allen Smoker (Kondinin), Yvonne Bowey (Kulin), Tash Crees / Brodie Roberts (Southern Cross), Craig Last (Merredin), Kate Crees (Merredin), Tim Cusack (Narembeen), Jason Syred (Kellerberrin), Tracy Taylor (Lake Grace), Nicole Connelly (Corrigin), Jaime-Leigh Strickland (Netball WA), Paul Reid (WAFC), Kristen Jerkovich (Hockey WA), Chair – Jenifer Collins (DLGSC Wheatbelt), WSWG Support – Caroline Robinson (150Square)

At the meeting there were three agreed actions:

- 1. Teams and grades for each sport in the catchment area to be collated
- 2. Hockey WA, Netball WA and WACFL to write to associations in the project catchment area to encourage flexible fixturing and game times in season 2022 and beyond and encourage one day sport at the same venue
- 3. Develop a set of guiding principles for Winter sports fixtures in season 2022

The WSWG will meet in person again in October to develop a series of draft fixtures for clubs and associations to consider and comment upon for season 2022.



LABOR REJECTS CALL TO IMPROVE G2G APPLICATION PROCESS

The Minister for Police has today rejected calls from the Opposition to improve the transparency of the G2G application process following questions in the Parliament.

Opposition Leader Mia Davies called on Labor to explain why G2G pass applications made by West Australians complying with entry requirements were being rejected multiple times.

"The Minister for Police dodged questions in Parliament today and refused to consider a suggestion from the Opposition that an independent and transparent appeal process be introduced," Ms Davies said.

"We pointed to just one example of a woman in Sydney who had to resort to calling talkback radio to share her frustration and we know she's one of many.

"This is just one example of someone trying to return home for compassionate reasons yet was rejected multiple times within minutes of applying."

Ms Davies said it should not take speaking to the media and raising these issues in the public sphere to get an application reviewed, particularly to see a relative in palliative care before they pass.

"The Opposition had been calling for an independent appeal process to be instated for months to ensure the G2G application system was operating as efficiently as possible," Ms Davies said.

Shadow Emergency Services Minister Martin Aldridge also raised concerns in Parliament regarding the lack of transparency and consistency for G2G passes being approved.

"We know around 160,000 applications have been rejected or remained pending since the beginning of this year," Mr Aldridge said.

"Unfortunately, we don't know how many of these requests have been for compassionate circumstances, or how many have subsequently been reviewed and approved, as the State Government is unwilling to release detail around G2G applications."

Mr Aldridge also took exception to the Minister for Police labelling unsuccessful G2G applicants as "talk back radio whingers" after many had taken their stories to the media in recent weeks.

"When you hear the often tragic and desperate circumstances these people are faced with, the last thing they want to do is share their stories publicly, but the lack of transparency or fair appeal in the G2G process leaves them with no choice.

"It shows a Government and Minister lacking in compassion for West Australians in need and reiterates the need for an independent appeal process which can review G2G applications in a fair, consistent and compassionate manner."
