## NAREMBEEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY— Part 1

Over the next two weeks we will be publishing this story written by Hazel TOOVEY (nee FRENCH).

Hazel is today the person who has lived the longest in Narembeen.

The "French Family" arrived in Narembeen in 1923, coming from Narrogin where they had settled in 1902 after coming from South Australia by boat. The menfolk came first with their teams of horses to do dam sinking and clearing in this new and fast growing district. The women followed (some now married and living elsewhere) some came with husbands and families.

The first dam they sunk was on Mr Bill KETTERINGHAM's property—now belonging to Mr Phil TRELOAR. Many dams were sunk

and clearing done over the years and the teams worked on the Wadderin Dam.

A farm was purchased and worked east of Narembeen and later one at Cramphorne—both these were sold.

**National Firearms Amnesty** If you have any unregistered or unwanted firearms including parts or ammunition this is an opportunity to hand it in with no questions asked, no unregistered firearm in our community is safe. Every Firearms Act offence is arrestable meaning DNA, photo, fingerprints and a meeting with the magistrate.

Please call us for an appointment so we know someone carrying a firearm towards us has good intention, otherwise it may get a little awkward for you lying face down in the dirt, arms out to the side with you palms facing up have them in the case, bag or wrapped so as not to alarm.

**Firearms Storage** Wheatbelt police have been conducting storage inspections with some non-compliance issues in the community. Just a suggestion for now, check your storage complies, use the storage and keep your storage locked. We appreciate those holding a firearms licence have a need but, there's always a but, should a non-secured firearm get stolen well there's a whole lot of unpleasant flowing on from that.

**Safety & Security Rebate** WA Seniors Card holders can apply for a rebate of up to \$400 on the purchase and installation of approved home security & safety items. The application is available either from the police station, online at seniorscard.wa.gov.au or from the CRC. The form provides items which are eligible, should you have any doubt feel free to give us a call.

**Road Safety** Narembeen has been allocated an additional 60% increase for the number of random breath tests so expect to see us out and about doing this more often. As police officers we simply do the testing, the driver dictates the reading!

We stopped two local drivers over the past fortnight on the wrong side of the road one the crest of a hill towards us. Regional WA has an over representation when it comes to our road toll which is why I target speed & drink driving. I can tell you the carnage is caused by two opposing vehicles with a combined relative motion of 200+ k/ph = no survivors and years of pain, come on folks you're better than that, be safe please.

**Illicit Drugs** Whilst media portrays the large drug busts, we need to also recognise the local users and dealers that impact our immediate community. We have a variety of tools at our disposal but this needs to be a whole of community effort to identify so we can isolate and disrupt offenders.

Police play another role in this space and whilst we remain staunch against illicit drugs in our community, we are also committed to long term strategies toward recovery for those whom seek it. Police can provide an avenue to supports and services and invite anyone that cannot see a way forward to please contact us for help.


# Mt Walker Golf News



The vote count will commence at 6pm sharp and results will be published on the website.


For those who may be unavailable to vote on the day due to other commitments, you can attend the Shire between 8:30 and 4:30pm Monday to Friday and cast an early vote.


