





APEX PARK RE-DEVELOPMENT

The Shire is continuing to work with the contractor to complete the works at Apex Park. There has been a delay with the supply of the shade structures, this has hopefully been rectified and the new shade structures should be installed over the next 2 weeks. Following this, the remaining concrete works will take place as well as the installation of a BBQ and furniture. The replacement shade sails over the playground are due to be installed later this week.

You might have noticed that the Skate Park equipment has been relocated to the new Skate Park pad, we feel it gives the kids much more space to ride bikes/scooters/skateboards. The Shire is looking forward to working with the Wheatbelt Health Network's in the delivery of a Street Art Workshop which aims to bring the skate park equipment back to life! Officers are also working on the new community stargazing area as well as the new information bay signage.







Preparing Students for a Changing World

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Term 4 has started and we will, as always, be heading straight into some hard work and will not be winding down until Week 10! I hope that the students are all rested up and ready to go with their learning ☺. Enjoy the next few weeks because then this old town of ours gets so busy, there is harvest for our farmers followed by the silly season, while here at school, we will have practice for the end of year concert to add to our already busy days. Cricket, tennis, swimming and basketball sessions will all be starting and the break will be a distant memory!!

NAPLAN 2021 PRETTY HAPPY WITH THIS ☺

I have mentioned that our NAPLAN results in 2021 were in general good, but now I have data that indicates **just how well we have done in most areas, in most year levels**. I would ask that you maybe have a quick read, even if your child/ren did not do the tests. It gives you an indication of **how your school is doing and it reflects very well on our current programs and teaching practices**.

A summary:

- In Year 3, 5 & 9, our class average was **above or well above the Australian average for all five tests**.
- In Year 3 we had **no students at or below the National Minimal Standard** in any of the five tests.
- In Year 9 we had **no students at or below the National Minimal Standard** in four of the five tests.
- In Year 5 we had **no students below the National Minimum Standard** in four of the five tests.
- In Year 7 we had **no students below the National Minimum Standard** in three of the five tests.
- We had **greater than 20%** of our class scoring in the **top 20%** of all students in Australia in **16 out of the twenty tests!!** We only have more than 20% of a class scoring in the bottom 20% of all students in Australia in three tests. In Year 3, 5, & 9, we had **more than 20%** of our class in the top 20% of all students in Australia in **ALL TESTS**, and **less than 20%** of our class in the bottom 20% in **ALL TESTS**. 
