





Generally the house is in good repair but intervention is necessary in the near future to avoid inevitable wear and tear as some of the posts are beginning to show signs of damage and parts of the roof need attention also. The shearing shed has parts of the roof lifting and wind is creating damage as well. A report will be made to the shire.
- There may be grant money available to us and we discussed life sized cut-outs for sporting or other notables as a good project should we be successful in our application.
- President Lorraine thanked our Secretary Kellie Mortimore for the articles she had published in the Fencepost regarding Pioneer families and the Brass Band. Lorraine then thanked all for their contributions throughout the year.
- A lovely lunch was enjoyed by members and partners at Myola. We were delighted that Joan Flint was able to be with us after her lengthy stay in Perth receiving medical treatment.
