NAREMBEEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY— Part 4

Over the next few weeks we will tell the story of the Narembeen Brass Band



Mr John HOSKINS became the conductor of the Narembeen Brass Band and in 1932 Ern EDDY was the Secretary. The Band flourished for a time, but interest waned gradually until it practically became defunct. With the advent of BURLINSON (Chemist) to the town interest again quickened. At a meeting held in November 1936. Jack HOSKINS (Jnr), George HARDINGHAM,

BURROWS, W. CONNELLY and George PIPPETT were elected to form a committee and Mr BURLINSON consented to be the bandmaster.

Mr BURLINSON bought the Chemist Shop from Mr GLASCOCK who was the first Chemist in Narembeen. The shop was originally Bradbury's Grocery shop which had a small room added to the side to act as a post office before the official post office building was erected. Present holder of this site is Butcher, Phil Payne.

Mr BURLINSON soon had the bandsmen practicing twice weekly on Wednesday evenings and on Sunday mornings, in the old Westralian Farmers Building (present hairdresser's)

In 1938 at the Annual meeting of the Narembeen Brass Band, Mr E.C. WILLIAMS was elected as President, Mr E. EDDY as Secretary with committee of R.L. BURLINSON, W. CONNELLY, and J. HOSKINS. Bandmaster was Mr BURLINSON.

In 1938, Narembeen Brass Band provided music at the Merredin Fire Brigade Demonstration and in January 1939, also attended the Northam Fire Brigade Demonstration. Mr Ernie ILES provided the transport and Rod RUSE was mentioned as being drum major.

The Band was always smartly turned out in uniform of all white with a red stripe on the trousers.

Inspiration Studio by Drug Aware

Two young project coordinators in Narembeen recognised there was a huge array of artistic talent in the Wheatbelt they could harness. Together, they organised a series of workshops for young people to explore, try new things, develop new skills, and make new friends along the way.

The 'Inspiration Studio' by Drug Aware was held in September 2021, coordinated by 13-year-olds Sari Cusack and Lucy Currie. Working alongside the Narembeen Community Resource Centre, the girls met after school to design and plan the workshops and resulting art exhibition.

Developing skills in graphic design and advertising, the two girls designed posters and flyers to hand out around their school and pin up on community notice boards looking for participants. They advertised in the local newspaper and in the Narembeen District High School newsletter while Narembeen Community Resource Centre helped promote the events through social media.

It was a success. Each workshop attracted at least 10 young participants and over 50 friends, family, and community members came along to the final exhibition to admire their hard work.

Workshop participants were treated to a series of workshops on photography, acrylic pouring, and scrap metal sculpture, each facilitated by a professional creative from the Wheatbelt.

Photography workshops were held with De Strange from Strange Images over two sessions, teaching participants about black and white abstract photography and flat lay photography. Young artists learned about photography angles, shooting techniques, detail editing, and creating photo displays.

Shannae Jasper from Remote Society led the acrylic pouring workshop as participants learned how to mix colours and stir paint, and practiced pouring, blowing, and rotating techniques.

The final session of the workshop series came from well-known sculptor Jordan Sprigg, who taught the eager crowd what was involved in the process of creating sculptures out of scrap metal.

"I loved how they encouraged craziness. The mistakes that people made in their artwork was welcomed." – Participant, 15

All the workshops were a huge success and workshop participants left inspired and eager to continue practicing what they had learned. In fact, many participants said they wanted to keep doing acrylic pouring as a hobby at home!

Sari and Lucy were proud to wear their Drug Aware T-Shirts at the workshops to highlight the important message. They also printed the Drug Aware messages onto colourful pieces of paper to display around the venues so everyone could read and interact with them.

At each workshop, participants were provided with Drug Aware notebook and pen so they could take notes during the presentations... and many notes were taken by the eager creatives, who took their notebooks home filled to the brim with inspiration and ideas.

Coordinating with Narembeen Co-Op Café, the girls offered a catered experience for the final exhibition by providing healthy food, snacks and drinks to all the visitors.

The project coordinators were excited to be able to be part of such a big project and to develop and learn new skills in project management, grant writing, marketing, and advertising. Each facilitator said they enjoyed teaching the participants new skills and were excited to share their own passions.

"This project didn't only increase drug awareness it also brought many different new development opportunities to the youth of Narembeen and the opportunity to connect with other likeminded teenagers."

Police encourage consultation with peers and health professionals to increase the uptake of vaccinations, in particular within our vulnerable Regional WA communities as 2022 looks to bring more challenges for us in this space, Narembeen isn't immune.

Our obligations to check in via the Safer WA app or sign Mandatory Registers has not changed and will remain part of what we do in the foreseeable future.

Emergency Management – Fire Season

90% of WA is bushfire prone. Bushfires are unpredictable and happen every year. The single biggest killer is indecision. What will you do if there is a bushfire? A bushfire plan can help keep you and your family safe. Creating one in under 15 minutes at mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au is a good start.

Domestic Violence

White Ribbon Day – I will stand up, speak out and act to prevent men's violence against women, this is 365 days a year as far as I'm concerned.

Victim, perpetrator or concerned about someone else there are so many support services out there maybe we can simply point you in the right direction for help before we need to come in a police enforcement capacity.

Road Safety

Harvest time brings more heavy vehicles onto the road this time of year so we all need to be vigilant and patient especially on gravel surfaces. Allow for extra braking, slow moving vehicles, wide loads and various other hazards that can come your way.

Business as usual on our traffic patrols with 120 breath tests, 3 infringements and a drug test for the month to date.

Electric Rideable Devices

The Road Traffic Code is being amended just in time for Christmas to regulate escooters and e-skateboards with new offences created.

- Exceeding 10km/h on footpaths
- Exceeding 25km/h on carriageways, bike and shared paths
- These are unable to be ridden on roads with speed limits exceeding 50km/h
- Riding a device without a helmet

An electric rideable device is defined as having one or more wheels, limited to a maximum speed of 25km/h on level ground. Where an electric rideable device does not meet the definition and it is driven on a road, it is an unlicensed motor vehicle, penalties apply.





Mr Chick would like to remind us all of the importance of watching your kids around water.

Over the weekend there were two near drownings at commercial pools and last week a toddler drowned in a backyard pool.

At our pool if you have a child under 5 you must accompany them in the water, under 10 they must be within arms reach. The nearer you are to your child if something goes wrong the better.

Near drownings spark calls for extra vigilance

Take care with your kids around water. That's the message from WA Police Minister Paul Papalia after two children nearly drowned on Saturday.

The young girls were resuscitated and taken to Perth Children's Hospital within hours of each other after separate incidents at commercial pools.

It's understood a lifeguard pulled an unconscious four-year-old from a pool at Perth's Crown Towers at 3.30pm. It came after a five-year-old girl was pulled from the main pool at Adventure World in Bibra Lake about noon, an incident witnesses described as "horrible".

The girl who survived the Adventure World ordeal has since been discharged from hospital while the other was in a stable condition on Sunday afternoon.

It came just a day after The Royal Lifesaving Society issued a safety warning following a backyard pool drowning tragedy that claimed the life of a toddler in Greenfields. His absence had sparked a major police operation in the Mandurah suburb, before he was found about 2pm at a Kookaburra Drive property.

"I just urge everyone take care with your little ones around water," Mr Papalia said on Sunday.

"Don't leave them alone, be careful and keep them safe.

"I urge everyone, if you are the owner of a pool, to ensure it's safe and make sure it complies."







New climate outlooks from BoM set to aid farm decision making

Australian grain growers will be able to better prepare for the onset of extreme climate events following the Bureau of Meteorology's (BoM) release of two comprehensive new seasonal forecasting tools recently.

Minister for Agriculture and Northern Australia David Littleproud announced the new climate outlook tools saying they would offer agricultural producers access to regionally relevant information beyond the traditional seven-day forecast.



The tools have been developed through the \$14 million industry-wide research project Forewarned is Forearmed (FWFA), led by Meat and Livestock Australia (MLA) and funded through the Australian Government Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment's Rural R&D for Profit program with co-investment from 14 project partners including the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC).

It draws together the extensive knowledge, experience, skills and contact networks of all major Australian rural research and development corporations, key research organisations, farming systems groups and the BoM.

GRDC has had representatives from the three GRDC Regional Panels provide input to the development in recent years.

The project is set to deliver five new multi-week and seasonal forecast products relating to heat, cold and rainfall.
