



NAREMBEEN SWIMMING POOL

The Shire of Narembeen has been advised by Western Power that it is safe to re-open the pool.

The pool has been closed for the past week to undertake works to improve equipotential bonding and to conduct a series of electrical tests.

Further tests are planned to be undertaken by the Shire of Narembeen and Western Power in the coming weeks.

PROJECT UPDATES

Apex Park

The Stargazing signage has arrived and it is envisaged this area will be finalised by the contractor in the coming weeks.

Apex Park / Caravan Park—Gravel Works

The Shire will be carting gravel to fill the low lying areas of Apex Park and the Caravan Park—this is to assist with safer, flatter ground for the Free RV campers as well as improved drainage.

Caravan Park

Over December, January and February the appointed contractor will be installing new solar bollards, landscaping, reticulation, the caravan park entry statement and improving the camping area at the Caravan Park. This project has been made possible with funding through the Drought Communities Program.

Churchill Street

Through January and February the appointed contractor will be repaving some of the side walk paving areas that have been identified as unsafe as well as installing a safer, compliant cross over. New street furniture has been ordered and this is expected to be installed in February. This project was made possible with funding through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

Town Hall / The Old Church

Tender documents for the restoration of these buildings have been finalised and it is expected we will go to tender in the coming weeks.

Lake Walker Shared Pathway / Ada Street-Brown Street Shared Pathway

These pathways will be installed by different contractors and it is anticipated that these works will take place in January / February 2022.

It will be a busy few months coming up for the Shire, town is really starting to look good and with the roadworks projects planned, be prepared for more beautification around the townsite!







FUNERAL OF KEVIN MORTIMORE

The Funeral for Kevin was held at Bowra & O'Dea, Midland on Monday, November 29, 2021.

Kevin died on Thursday, November 18 after a short battle with cancer.

The celebrant that married Kevin and his wife Divera led the service and spoke of Kevin's family and everything he enjoyed in life. Ian, Neil, Stuart and Ciara also spoke of memories they had of their brother and father.

Kevin has left behind his wife Divera, sister Yvonne, brothers Barry, Ian and Neil, children Stuart, Glyn, Giles and Ciara and grandchildren Xander and Theo.

IAN'S MEMORIES OF KEVIN as spoken on the day.

Thankyou everyone for taking time off work and travelling here today to pay your respect to Kevin and to all those that have offered their condolences to us all and everyone that's watching the livestream around the world.

I'm here to tell you what Kevin meant to me. To me as a small child he was known as Kegar, to most people in Narembeen he was always known as Tanny, to his Perth friends it was Morts. As I grew up, I always called him Kevin. He knew me for 61 years and 1 month of my life and I remember him for about 60 of mine. After finishing school in 1972 Kevin came home to work on the family farm with our parents. Dad and Kevin worked hard seven days a week in winter and six and half days a week in Summer only playing tennis as a summer sport on Sunday afternoons.

A trivial fact of the Narembeen Football Club is that we debuted and played our first game for the club on the first game of the year at Bruce Rock oval in 1975. A family friend Rex Metcalf called past and talked Dad into letting me go over to play junior football, which he reluctantly agreed to, so in their car I got to go to Bruce Rock. Dad, Mum and Kevin had a shower and got changed and came over to watch. The reserves side followed the junior's game, and they were short of players. Kevin was asked to play, so off with my boots, socks and shorts for him to wear and this was the start of Kevin's 237 game career for the club over the next fifteen years or so. He Captained the Reserves side and played in a couple of Grand Finals in his career. Kevin also played tennis, squash, baddie and enjoyed water skiing. A highlight of his tennis time was winning his country week championships division and his brothers winning other divisions just before dads passing in 1986.

I came home in 1978 and joined the family partnership, this was the only option Dad gave us to do otherwise it was to walk out the gate and stay out and never come back. Kevin and I took the option to stay and we worked in partnership for 42 years together on our farm, a huge achievement and many good and bad times shared. In fact, I have been married for 18 years, so I would have to stay married to Kellie and live for another 24 years to equal the length of time I've worked with Kevin which would mean I'd have to make it to 85 years of age. Every day I go to work many things on this farm will forever have your signature on it that you were part of our fathers dream and made the farm what it is today.

I think of Kevin as a lucky man sometimes in some ways, almost the same as Henry the eighth who had 6 wives. Kevin only had five, the only thing they do not have in common is, all Kevin's wives are still alive and well. I believe Kevin didn't want to be lonely and without someone by his side, I'm sure he truly loved every one of them very much. Divera you were the lucky last and on Thursday just 3 or 4 hours before he past I was holding his hand for some time, I asked Divera to come and sit with Kevin, he still had the strength and desire to whisper I love you with a kiss, a testament that he truly loved you till the end as well. Thankyou for spending the last of Kevin's years together and to the final breathe. Also, special mention to Yvonne who assisted Divera from Tuesday lunch time as well for your compassion to your brother and our third family member you have been with for the final minutes of life.

My parents had five children together, Yvonne, Kevin, Leanne, myself and Neil, Dad had an extra two Faye and Barry so that makes a chain link of nine. It has been broken now for the fourth time here on earth and is joined together as four in heaven. One day in the future our immediate family will be reunited together again.

With the special two hours on Saturday night and then on Wednesday night and Thursday we spoke together of our times we shared and acknowledged our respect for each other over the years and now is the time I say I forgive you, for any bad times, or issues we had together, love you mate, Thumbs up.

When I played my 500th game of football for Narembeen Club, Kevin was there on the day to witness this event, the ball which was used that day was signed by all players in the club even Kevin, he signed it Kevin Morty, I will cherish this football forever. I have given Kevin a football signed by me and placed it in his coffin so when you have had enough of golf and when my time comes to reunite with you, we can play football just as we did as kids.


Lastly, as you walk up the stairway to heaven you will walk out onto the fairway with a handicap of zero, cos you're up there playing with the very best mate.



Australia is the skin cancer capital of the world. Two in three Australians will develop skin cancer before the age of 70, and every year 2,000 people die from this disease.

Being SunSmart is a simple and effective way of reducing your risk of developing skin cancer. Most skin cancers can be treated if found early.



Common symptoms of Skin Cancer include:

- A new spot or mole on your skin
- A spot that is different from other spots on your skin
- Any crusty or non-healing sores

• Any spots, freckles or any moles changing in size (width), thickness (height), colour, or shape over a period of weeks to months.

Get to know your skin and what's normal for you. If you notice any of these symptoms or any other unusual changes, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. It doesn't mean you've got skin cancer – often they turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to get checked.


