Pulse oximeter What you need to know!





If you answered YES to any of the above – collect a free pulse oximeter from your local government today!

What is a pulse oximeter?

It is a small, peg-like device that clips onto your fingertip to read your heart rate and blood oxygen level. It takes only one minute to work, is reusable and can be shared between other people in your household.

Why do I need one?

If you become COVID-19 positive, you may need to be remotely monitored through the WA COVID Care at Home program. By having a pulse oximeter already in your home, a health professional can assess you and provide health advice from the comfort of your home.

Visit WA COVID Care at Home for more information.

Where do I get one?

Visit your local government to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household (each eligible household can receive one pulse oximeter but supplies are limited).

Do **not** pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. If you have already received a positive COVID-19 test result, the Department of Health will contact you and provide further information.

CHILD PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS PRESENTATION with ANDREA MUSULIN

The Western Australian Child Protection Society in partnership with the Narembeen Autumn Club have invited Andrea Musulin, director of WA Child Protection Society, to address our community.

Andrea resigned from the WA Police after spending 30 years in uniform. She served at a time when police women were very thin on the ground and still wore skirts and high heels.

As a sworn police officer Andrea gained extensive experience in responding to sexually abused children and a large part of her career was spent developing crime prevention programs designed to protect children. She worked extensively with women and children, both reactively and proactively, specialising in areas of domestic violence and child abuse, going on to head the WA Police Family and Behaviours Units.

Andrea was instrumental in developing the first on air child protection program, and in doing so has presented a series of Protective Behaviours Lessons to children living in rural and remote locations of WA utilizing resources and support of The Carnarvon School of the Air.

While Officer in Charge of the WA Police Family Unit, Andrea was nominated as the first ever WA Police Officer in the WA Customer Service Industry Awards in 1998, and was successful in becoming a finalist for her extraordinary dedication and service to indigenous children and families in the Pilbara above and beyond the call of duty.

During this presentation Andrea will share accounts of her journey and leave you empowered to speak to your children, grandchildren or someone else's children about personal safety.

As a mother of 6 children Andrea openly shares her many humorous and endearing life experiences of raising resilient children in a modern, ever changing ever challenging world.

This presentation is a must and will assist with understanding the causes of child abuse and neglect, not only for educators but also for service providers working in children's services

BURNING PERMITS

Shire of Narembeen advises that we are now in the **RESTRICTED** (**PERMIT REQUIRED**) burning period from 1 February 2022 to 15 April 2022.

The following additional requirements for burning are also in place.

 1st February includes grass and raked cereal stubble and header windrows of non-cereal stubble including canola and legumes.

1st March is header windrows and chaff dumps and cereal stubble fires.

Burning during restricted periods is allowed on Sunday's and Public Holidays with a permit.

RANGER REPORTING

Hi, for those that don't know me my name is Sarah and I have been the Ranger in Narembeen since August 2021. I have really enjoyed my experiences in Narembeen so far and look forward to helping residents in the future.

The main issue I have consistently been asked about is feral cats, which is not an isolated problem in the wheatbelt.

In my time here I have taken over 70 cats and kittens to rescue groups in Northam and Shenton Park. These groups are usually run by volunteers as Not for Profit organisations which rely on donations to operate, and they are at full capacity receiving more cats and kittens than are being adopted.

These cats are often stray and are sometimes fed by members of the public. I strongly recommend against feeding stray and feral cats as under the Cat Act, <u>you are considered the animals owner if you are feeding it!!!</u>

Responsible and legal cat ownership requires all cats over 6 months to be sterilized, microchipped, and registered with the Shire of Narembeen. Sterilization is the most important thing you can do for these animals as this will protect native animal and ensure the problem doesn't get worse. Letting stray cats breed and then contacting the Ranger Services to remove kittens is simply not sustainable.

Arrangements can be made with the Merredin Vet to sterilize cats and discounts are offered for those people who qualify financially.

Under the Cat Act it is also an offence to give away kittens. The reason for this law is to ensure responsibility on the part of the owner as often a family receives a kitten, doesn't get it desexed as "it costs too much money" then lose interest in the kitten as it gets older. This can result then in the kitten becoming a feral animal.

For those of you having issues with feral cats, The Shire of Narembeen owns a number of traps which are available for use, and I encourage you to contact me on 0400 240 787 to discuss their use or if you have any other questions.



COVID INFO © WHAT IS A CLOSE CONTACT?

As is to be expected, COVID is here and don't forget, no one wants to be ill, no one deliberately is spreading the virus, it is just going to happen! The school will not close if we have a positive COVID case, only close contacts will need to quarantine for 7 days (7 x 24 hours from the date and time of last exposure). For students who are close contacts, or have tested positive (which we hope doesn't happen), we will be providing work for them to continue on with so that they will not fall behind in their work. All other students are to continue to attend school as usual. For your information, a close contact in a high case load setting is one who:

- is a household member of a person with COVID-19 who has had contact with them during their infectious period.
- Has had close contact with a person in their infectious period, including:
 - ✓ at least 15 minutes' face-to-face contact where a mask was not worn by the exposed person and the person with COVID-19.
 - ✓ greater than two hours within a small indoor space or classroom environment, where
 masks have been removed for this period by the exposed person and the person with
 COVID-19. (Note: others wearing masks in this scenario would not be a contact).
- Someone who is directed by WA Health that they are a close contact.

Bowel Cancer

Bowel cancer is the growth of abnormal cells in the large bowel (the colon or rectum). Bowel cancer is one of the top cancers affecting men and women in Western Australia. In 2017, 1307 people were diagnosed with bowel cancer and 390 died from bowel cancer. The chances of getting bowel cancer by the time you are aged 85 (lifetime risk) is 1 in 13.

Risk factors

The exact cause of bowel cancer is not known however, there are a number of factors that are known to increase the risk of developing bowel cancer. Your risk is increased if you:

- smoke
- use alcohol
- · have a poor diet, including inadequate fibre or too much red and processed meat
- don't exercise
- are above a healthy weight

Other risk facts that you cannot control but that increase your risk:

- age most people with bowel cancer are over 50, and the risk increases with age
- having a previous history of bowel cancer or polyps
- · a strong family history of bowel cancer
- chronic inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease)
- a rare inherited genetic disorder, such as Familial Adenomatous Polyposis (FAP) and Lynch syndrome

Symptoms

Symptoms of bowel cancer may include one or more of the following:

- Bleeding from your back passage (anus) or any sign of blood after a poo/bowel motion (this could be red to black)
- A change in bowel habit, for example, straining to go to the toilet (constipation) and/or looser bowel motions (diarrhoea)
- Abdominal pain and bloating
- · Loss of weight for no obvious reason
- · Loss of appetite
- Symptoms of anaemia, including unexplained tiredness, weakness or breathlessness

If any of these symptoms are unusual for you, and they persist for more than 4 weeks, it's important to see your doctor right away.

The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program invites eligible people starting at age 50 and continuing to age 74 (without symptoms) to screen for bowel cancer using a free, simple test at home. Do the home test when you receive it in the mail – it could save your life!

- ▲ 1 head broccoli, cut into florets
- ▲ 1/3 cup water
- ▲ 2 tbs plain flour
- ▲ 2 cups reduced-fat milk
- pepper, to taste
- ▲ 1/2 cup reduced-fat cheese

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- Place cauliflower, broccoli florets and water into a microwave safe and ovenproof dish. Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 5 minutes. Carefully drain off the water and set aside.
- 3. Put flour into a tall microwave safe jug. Add 2 tablespoons of milk and whisk to a smooth paste with no lumps. Season with pepper. Add the remainder of the milk and stir.
- Microwave the milk mixture on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute. Stir. Heat again for 1 minute and stir. If needed, heat again for 30 seconds intervals and stir until thick and creamy.
- 5. Add grated cheese and stir until melted through.
- Top cauliflower and broccoli with cheese sauce.
- 7. Bake in oven for 15 minutes or serve immediately.
