CHILD PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS PRESENTATION with ANDREA MUSULIN

Date: Wednesday, 23 March 2022 Time: 10am – 12 Noon, Venue: Narembeen CRC Centre.

Cost: FREE. Morning Tea provided.

The Western Australian Child Protection Society in partnership with the Narembeen Autumn Club have invited Andrea Musulin, director of WA Child Protection Society, to address our community.

Andrea resigned from the WA Police after spending 30 years in uniform. She served at a time when police women were very thin on the ground and still wore skirts and high heels.

As a sworn police officer Andrea gained extensive experience in responding to sexually abused children and a large part of her career was spent developing crime prevention programs designed to protect children. She worked extensively with women and children, both reactively and proactively, specialising in areas of domestic violence and child abuse, going on to head the WA Police Family and Behaviours Units.

Andrea was instrumental in developing the first on air child protection program, and in doing so has presented a series of Protective Behaviours Lessons to children living in rural and remote locations of WA utilizing resources and support of The Carnarvon School of the Air.

While Officer in Charge of the WA Police Family Unit, Andrea was nominated as the first ever WA Police Officer in the WA Customer Service Industry Awards in 1998, and was successful in becoming a finalist for her extraordinary dedication and service to indigenous children and families in the Pilbara above and beyond the call of duty.

During this presentation Andrea will share accounts of her journey and leave you empowered to speak to your children, grandchildren or someone else's children about personal safety.

As a mother of 6 children Andrea openly shares her many humorous and endearing life experiences of raising resilient children in a modern, ever changing ever challenging world.

This presentation is a must and will assist with understanding the causes of child abuse and neglect, not only for educators but also for service providers working in children's services

Go Narembeen held its Annual General Meeting on Monday 28 February 2022.

Congratulations to everyone who was elected.

President, Aaron Lyon presented his President's Report for the 20/21 year:

Firstly I would like to welcome everyone to the AGM of the Go Narembeen Progress Association.

2021 was a very busy and interesting year for Go Narembeen. The committee was approached by Hugh Trivett from Ramelius Resources, to see if we would be interested in cropping the 1000 ha of land they had purchased from the Hooper family at Mt Arrowsmith. Acquiring more land has always been one of the goals of the committee. Syd Parsons took on the job of dealing with Ramelius Resources to get a lease drawn up between the two parties. Thankyou you Syd for your time on this it was much appreciated.

Having the opportunity to crop the extra land over and above the usual 200ha at Avoca would be a big logistical project for Go Narembeen alone. The cropping committee had several discussions on how we could attract more people from the Narembeen District to help. With limited time until the crop had to be planted the committee came up with the idea to pay Contractor rates to interested parties/groups. Expressions of interest were sent out to Sporting/Community Groups for seeding, harvesting, spraying and spreading of the crop.

With everything that is new we appreciate that there will need to be changes/modifications to the model. We probably didn't get everything right but the opportunity it presented for money to be earnt far outweighed the negatives. Go Narembeen paid out \$70,504.50 to

Sporting/Community Groups after harvest was completed. This couldn't have happened without a massive community effort so we pass on our thanks to everyone who was involved and thankyou also to the Go Narembeen Committee.

The Barley averaged 2.88T and the Wheat 2.28T which has now all been sold. Thank you again to Ramelius Resources for the opportunity and we look forward to the 2022 cropping season. During the year, Go Narembeen also contributed \$27,000 to Wadderin Wildlife Sanctuary for the purchase of an Electric People mover. This will allow better and safer access for visitors to the Sanctuary.

The Co-op continues to go from strength to strength and is a great addition to the main street. We are currently in the process of purchasing the Co-Op building which will be a valuable asset to Go Narembeen. Thank you to Sheree, Bianca, Amy and Lynda and their staff for their continued commitment and support.

Go Narembeen made the decision to appoint Sharon Bagshaw via Ray White Hopetoun as our property manager for the Roadhouse. This took the pressure off the Committee members who were doing this. It was working well until unfortunately Sharon became very ill and tragically passed away. We have since taken this role back on ourselves.

The Narembeen Roadhouse had a change of ownership on the 16 December 2021. Josh Irving and his family decided to pursue other business opportunities. Go Narembeen would like to thank Josh and his family for their support and wish them all the best in the future.

We welcome Harry and Garry and their families to the Roadhouse and Narembeen, we look forward to a successful working relationship. Go Narembeen has also undertaken some research into improving the technology in the Grain Discovery Centre. The Ipad's are outdated and don't work. This is an ongoing project which, we will decide which is the best way forward to continue to promote the GDC.

A Community Chest fund was also set up between Go Narembeen, the Narembeen Shire and Ramelius Resources. This would allow for submissions of sponsorship twice a year to the Shire. The submissions are then decided upon by the selection committee. In its first year there was \$40,000 available, we hope this will grow over to time.

To ease the workload and prevent volunteer burnout Go Narembeen decide to appoint a paid Executive Officer which would encompass the Secretary and Treasurers role. After the interview process we appointed Laura Cala to the position. Unfortunately, Laura resigned from this position in December 2021. Thank you for your time Laura whilst you were in the role.

Thank you to Peter Hall and Sheree Thomas who were Treasurer and Secretary when I took on the role. Your support for my first year as President was muchly appreciated. The efforts you give to your respective roles are a credit to you. They are both back doing the roles temporarily as we currently don't have a EO until we decide what we do with this position.

To my Committee, a massive thankyou as well, we are all volunteers and we should never forget that. You always make yourself available to lend a hand whatever the occasion.

Peter Lines thank you for your time on the Go Narembeen Committee, Peter resigned last year, your input and sometimes hairbrained ideas will never be forgotten.

That's enough from me here's to a bigger and better 2022.

CHILD PROTECTION WORKSHOP

It is a sobering reality that in Australia 1 in 4 children will be sexually abused in some way during their childhood and most will never speak about it. In 2019/2020 the Australian Institute of Child Health and Welfare reported 486, 300 child abuse and neglect reports were made to the civil authorities.

The Western Australian Child Protection Society in partnership with the Narembeen Autumn Club are providing this session with an aim to assist teaching staff and organisations to develop child protection and safety practices that can assist in creating child safe environments for children, young people and staff.

This workshop will assist with understanding the causes of child abuse and neglect and to develop appropriate education intervention strategies to assist prevention and empower individual children and young people by using Protective Behaviours or Keeping Safe prevention education.

As such this workshop is a must not only for educators but also for service providers working in children's services, the youth sector, child protection, family services, childcare, relationship services, indigenous services, crime prevention, faith-based services, health and accommodation services.

Using the 10 Child Safe Standards this workshop will equip staff with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through education and will assist staff to respond to disclosures and the legal requirements relating to disclosures.
