May Historical Highlights

On May 16th 9 members attended a productive meeting of the Historical Society. The main points from the meeting are as follows.

- · With the History Centre renovations completed we are now watching the Old Church undergo a major upgrade in accordance with Heritage Council Guidelines. This work is badly needed and we are very pleased that it has begun. Many thanks to those who, at very short notice, rallied to box up and move the contents of the church for storage while the work is in progress.
- · After seeding we hope to make a tour of the school sites in the district. This will enable us to direct visitors to these places and check on accessibility.
- · Thank you to the Shire for delivering and spreading gravel to the rear of the RSL museum.
- · We have had an enquiry from one of the town roadworks crew regarding his grandfather Sandy Gordon who farmed at Narembeen in the 1920's. With help from Hazel Toovey and the Centenary Book we are able to provide the relevant information.
- · Names and contact numbers for museum guides need upgrading on doors so that visitors may be directed to these in order to view museums.
- Thank you to Rhonda Cole for making curtains for the kitchen and laundry at the RSL museum and to Warren Milner for hanging them.
- · There is still much to do re sorting old machinery a work in progress.
- · Donations: Rhonda Cole 1953 Telephone Directory and Harvester Manual; Narembeen Hospital Catalogue of Instruments, Books and Other Objects; Bristow Family OAM and Other Medals, Projector, Horse Collar and Various Other Items; Buffalo Lodge via L.Maringoni Items of Office etc.; Elsie Palmer Small Metal Plaque from Fawcett Cottage with name of J.Fawcett and a number stamped into same. Many thanks to all donors.
- A very special visitor to the History Centre and RSL Museum recently was Mrs Iris Bristow. Iris was loud in her praise for the work being done by members and was delighted to see the renovated History Centre building. We in turn are grateful to Iris who was the inspiration in establishing the Historical Society in Narembeen in 1965. Also without the many publications written by her we would often be at a loss to answer the many queries which come our way. Thank you for this legacy Iris.

Narembeen Historical Society Schools over the Years

TAMPIA SCHOOL

Tampia School, like many others in farming areas, was an "Assisted" School when it first started in 1934.

Mt Arrowsmith School closed in December 1931 and the school building was moved to South Kumminin in 1934 as there were insufficient children at Mt Arrowsmith to re-open there.

There were, however, 3 MILLER children and 3 MOPPETT children who were without schooling. In point of fact, Fran MILLER was having correspondence lessons and Iris MOPPETT was boarding in Narembeen to receive her schooling. Both lots of parents had other children near school age.

Mr Alex MILLER constructed a building on his property, approximately 18 kilometres from Narembeen and about 5 kilometres west of the former Mt Arrowsmith School on the Reserve. Mr MILLER built the school himself with the aid of George SMITH, who had been a registered builder in South Australia, before taking up his farm at South Kumminin.

The schoolroom was constructed of corrugated iron, about 5 metres square with windows on either side and a fireplace. There was just enough room to place two long desks (4 or 5 children at each) plus a small teacher's table and blackboards on one wall. A small porch, which housed a cupboard and hat rack was added to the main building.

Equipment for the school was provided by the Education Department and was second-hand, coming from the then closed Jerry's Flat School (wherever that was).

There was ample room in the building for the first classes, comprising 2 families only – Frances (12), Alex (7), and Tom (5) MILLER and Iris (8), Ivan (6) and Mervyn (5) MOPPETT.

Later 2 other children from each family also attended – Betty and Jim MILLER and Gloria and Kingsley MOPPETT.

Applications were called for a teacher, and Miss Gwen IBBOTSON was selected. She was not a qualified teacher, as this being an Assisted School, parents were required to find their own teacher and subsidise her salary. At 17 years of age, this was Gwen's first experience in the country life, her father being a chemist in Victoria Park. However, her natural ability as a teacher was soon recognised by District Inspector Victor BOX. He granted an Inspector's Scholarship for Secondary School, to one of her pupils, and at the same time recommended Gwen to attend Teachers Training College to gain qualified teacher status. This she did in 1938 and was then sent to take charge of the newly opened school at Holleton in 1939. She later married another teacher Frank GODDARD, and on his death, returned to teaching in the metropolitan area. She had 2 children.

Following its opening, Tampia School gathered further pupils within a year or so. 3 WAGNER children – Audrey, Joyce and Rich travelled about 10 kilometres each way to school with a horse and cart.

Valmai, Danny and Tommy TOUCHELL travelled a similar distance in a jinker cart – a comfortable conveyance made from the back of an old car with shafts attached and pulled by a horse.

The SCHILLING children, Shirley, and Verna and also the GORDON boys were others who added to the numbers, also Ivan, Dorothy and Rhonda GALE and Malcolm HUNTER.

Miss Maidee HINE, also an unqualified teacher, took over in 1938 when Miss IBBOTSON left. With the expanding numbers of children space became a real problem.

The Education Department decided to organise a larger school to be situated on Government land. This they accomplished by moving South Trayning School building to the Mt Arrowsmith Reserve. Miss HINE resigned to be married on November 1, 1940.

A qualified teacher, Mrs McDONALD, was sent on November 3, 1940, to wind up Tampia Assisted School and transfer to Tampia State School at the Reserve. She taught at this Tampia School for several years until Mary P. COSGROVE (Pat) took over in February 1941. Later Miss Marie LAIRD became teacher until the school was closed on March 29, 1945, owing to low attendance figures. Most of the children were absorbed by the school bus service to Narembeen School.

In February 1950, Mr A. B. CRAIG bought the Tampia State School building from the Mt Arrowsmith Reserve to use as farm buildings. The school reserve at Mt Arrowsmith was cancelled.

Mr MILLER converted the first Tampia Assisted School building to workmen's quarters, after it had served faithfully and well, the purpose for which it was originally intended.

Recollections of Tampia

I can remember that the first Tampia School was built in a patch of timber, and at recess and lunch times, we children would wander through the bush finding orchids and other flowers, or play "hidey" among the bushes.

The MILLER house was about 150 metres south of the school towards Tampia Hill. The teacher and MILLER children would go home for lunch. We 3 MOPPETT kids looked forward to their return in summertime, because they brought ice blocks back for us. Mr MILLER had bought a kerosene fridge (the height of luxury in 1935). It has cost £30 (\$60), and dad promised that he would also buy one when the price came down....it never did – it was some years later that we had one!

One of the worst aspects of going to school....perhaps the only one because we all liked school....was having to evade the MILLER's dog "Gyp". She was a blue heeler and would lie in wait behind bushes quietly darting out to snap at our heels. We would go a long way out of our way to avoid her.

We, MOPPETTs', only had a couple of kilometres to walk to school when we lived at Buttsworth's (opposite MILLER's) but when we moved to "Bosses" east of MILLER's, we had about 5 kilometres or more to go. Having only one bicycle in the family, we had a unique arrangement for its use. Iris used to dink Mervyn half the way to school then walk the rest. Ivan and Gloria walked the first half then picked up the bike and rode the rest of the way, so all arrived about the same time.

Miss IBBOTSON, having come more or less direct from Perth Modern School, and untrained as a teacher, relied on her own recent past school lessons to teach us. I remember learning the words of the French song "Frere Jaqie" parroting the words. What a delight in later years when learning French at High School, to recognise this song. In the same way we learnt poems e.g. Do you remember the inn, Miranda? And stories from books far in advance of our years, which did us no harm at all. We had a smattering of algebra as well.

Miss IBBOTSON was a very able dressmaker. I remember her wearing a green spot slip dress with a sheer white ¾ coat over it – very smart! She taught us girls to sew nicely too. She would go to dances in Narembeen with my parents and was a popular member of the younger set of the day.

Gwen became engaged to one of Mr MILLER's employees, Syd GREENLAND. However, she later introduced him to one of her Perth friends who married him. Gwen married an old schoolfriend, Frank GODDARD.

Of interest is the fact that several pupils attended Tampia School in the mid-thirties for several months only. There was, apparently, a diphtheria epidemic in the metropolitan area and some children were sent to the country for a period to escape it. Alex A'VARD (brother of later Narembeen businessman Charlie A'VARD) was one of these children and he stayed with Mr and Mrs Charlie BRAINE (then on BUTTSWORTH's farm). Kitty and Myrtle CLEALE were also at BRAINE's and possibly some boys by the name HODGE.

Others who attended briefly were two of the HENDERSON girls from Bendering.

Brendon Grylls, MLA the Member for Merredin attended the Council meeting to discuss local issues. Brendon went on to be the leader of the Nationals party, a position previously held by Hendy Cowan.

The Narembeen South Road verge was cleared out in preparation for tree planting.

The minimum attendance fee of \$50.00 was paid to Councillors for all ordinary and special meetings.

Blocks in the industrial area were previously being sold at \$1 per square metre. If you wanted fill included, that was \$1.50. The last block sold was in 1996.

Shire of Narembeen Councillors met Tuesday 17 May for the Ordinary Council Meeting.

Review of Councillor Fees 2022/23

As per the *Local Government Act*, Councillors are entitled to be paid a fee for attendance to meetings and amounts to be paid are specified as a range which is determined by the size of the local government. A review of Councillor fees should be undertaken annually as part of the budget process.

The Council resolved to increase Council meeting attendance fees by 2.5%

Review of Caravan Park Fees

Caravan and camping travel has increased significantly since 2020, this combined with the improvements made to the amenities and surrounding areas, has seen Narembeen become a popular destination for traveler's exploring our State.

The employment of two passionate and friendly Caravan Park Managers, Jackie and Peter Jackson, has contributed to many positive comments being received from those who have enjoyed their stay. Staff are also aware of online forums where travelling groups have commented on the fantastic facilities and small-town benefits that Narembeen has shown them.

Roadworks will continue in the Narembeen townsite and road closures / detours in place while safety improvements are made to the two main town intersections.


Motorists and pedestrians are requested to exercise caution while in the area and follow the directions of traffic control operators.

Works are expected to be completed by the end of July 2022.



This Wednesday the ladies will play par for Carol Curries trophy and on Sunday the men will play a Par round for Ben Hunters trophy.





Promoting projects in regional WA by cutting headworks costs

18 May 2022

A long-term plan to support regional economic development has featured as part of the Opposition's response to the State Budget, with Leader Mia Davies saying the Government had dropped the ball on releasing land and underpinning development.

Announcing a Regional Headworks Investment Fund in her Budget Reply speech in Parliament, Opposition Leader Mia Davies detailed the plan to invest \$1 billion over ten years to unlock development in the regions.

"The high cost of delivering water, power, and sewerage connections is a constraint on development in regional WA," Ms Davies said.

"Our plan will allow local government authorities and the private sector to access funds to address these constraints."

Ms Davies said reducing the cost of utility connections would not only unlock the potential of commercial and industrial land but encourage the release of residential land and housing developments.

"This is a responsible, common-sense investment strategy to unlock projects that will address housing constraints and assist in supporting businesses that will diversify our State's economy," Ms Davies said.

"Rather than allocate funds to specific projects like the Regional Headworks Investment Fund and take a long-term view of development, the Premier decided to squirrel away money into Special Purpose Accounts that will no doubt be used to buy votes ahead of the 2025 State Election.

"The reason they do it is simple - dumping funds into Special Purpose Accounts is an accounting trick to make the budget surplus appear smaller.

"The Premier is hiding the fact the surplus is in fact much bigger, and that's shocking when you consider the challenges we face in the health and housing sectors."

Ms Davies said with a \$5.7 billion surplus, the McGowan Labor Government had missed the opportunity to take a long-term view on development.

"The Premier has so far showed he is capable of banking a surplus on the back of extraordinary mineral royalties and increased GST grants, but he has failed to set the State up for the future.

"At a time when the economy has the opportunity to diversify, grow and decentralise, this Government has chosen inaction.

"The Regional Headworks Investment Fund won't undo Labor's five years of neglect, but it will promote much-needed investment and development for WA's strong regional future."
