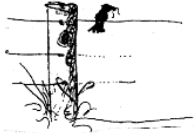

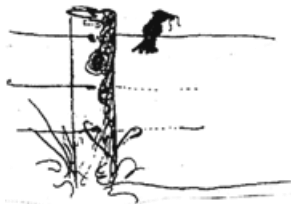

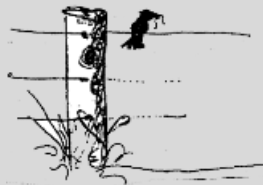

We have now located all of the sites for the campsites of JS Roe. These will be placed on an easily accessible map for visitors to discover where they are should they want to visit them.

The Old School notes that have appeared in our Fencepost have generated a lot of interest and we hope to get a list together of old schools and request information from residents who may know of any schools that we have overlooked and then create a map of the sites. We are looking forward to going on the trip around the district and uncover the markers for these old sites but will wait until the weather is a bit warmer.

Brian Commons has written a short history of his family that will be published in the Fencepost. This is a very interesting piece and for those who knew Basil (Bat). A very community minded man he was.

The next busy bee day will be on Monday 11th July at the History Centre where we will go through the files of the Sporting Clubs and other Organisations also collate the photographs in categories. The men may get together to re organise the equipment in the shed at the rear of the Community Shed.

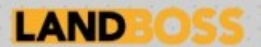

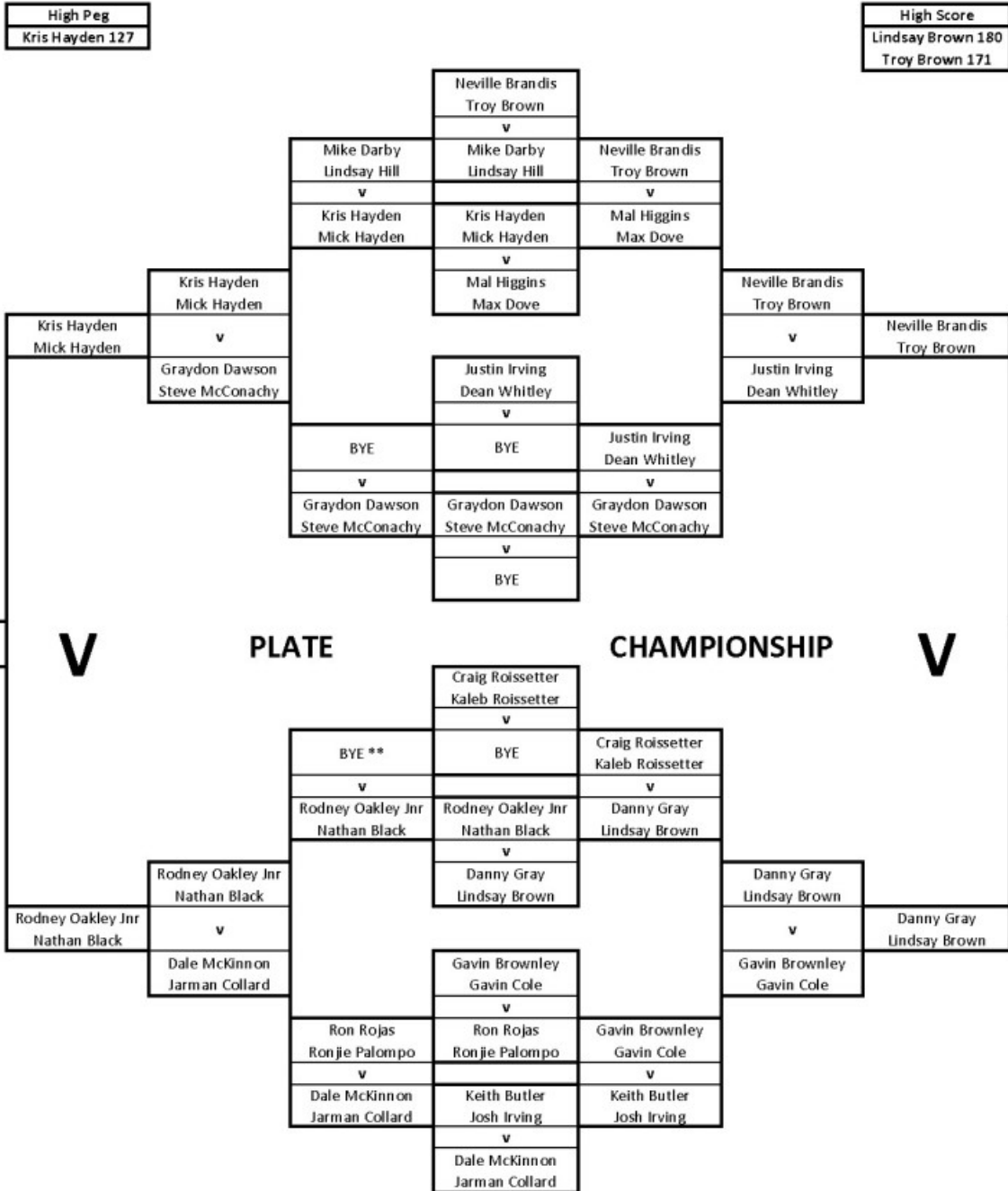

LIONS SKIN CANCER SCREENING BUS

SATURDAY JUNE 25th

The Narembeen Lions Club is pleased to announce that the Lions Mobile Skin Screening Bus is scheduled to visit Narembeen on Saturday June 25th. The bus last visited Narembeen in August 2000, when 64 people were screened, with 14% of those that were screened referred for further assessment.

15 minutes is all the time that is required for screening, a small amount of time to be screened by a medical professional for an all over body check for skin cancers. This is an entirely free service. Up to 70 people can be screened in a day, so we hope that Narembeen residents make the most of this opportunity.

The Commons family.

Basil's father Robert (Bob) Commons was born in Bute South Australia in 1889. His father and grandfather were wheat farmers in South Australia. His grandfather James was a Cornish miner who came to Australia in 1856 hoping to find gold when he didn't became a wheat farmer. Robert married Laurel Galliford in 1913 they had 4 children all born in Bute S.A.

Mary b 1914, **Colin** b 1917 **Lorna** b 1919 who died at 18 months of age and **Basil** b 1921. Robert moved his family from S.A in 1928 to virgin land at Holt Rock in W.A. to grow wheat. The land was too salty so in 1931 he sold it and in 1932 moved to Muntagin again to grow wheat. When Basil left the farm in 1942 to join the the RAAF Robert could not cope and sold the farm to Mary's husband Ned Dixon he then moved to Bunbury and grew potatoes until his death in 1965. At the Centenary Eddie Dixon said the farm was still in the family being farmed by his grandson. Both Robert and his wife Laurel who died in 1966 are buried in the **Naremben Cemetery**.

Mary's story My life is on page 70 of the Naremben 100 year Family history book.

Colin's story is on page 45 written by his daughter Barbara Schwartz.

This is Basil's story

After arriving in WA from SA he started his final years of schooling at the Muntagin school in 1932.

After he left school he worked on his fathers farm until he left and went into the RAAF in 1942.

During the war Basil went to New Guinea in 1944 as a truck driver mechanic.

While he was on leave in Victoria in 1944 he met and married Nellie Peacock.

After the war ended in 1945 they moved back to a farm between Bruce Rock and Naremben.

He was driving the School bus for the Moppett's and was also working as a mechanic for them which he continued to do up until his death.

Basil and Nellie had four children Brian b 1946, Dennis b 1948, Melvin b 1949 and Shirley b 1951.

Basil and Nellie moved into Naremben around the time Brian started school. The house was a State Housing home at 16 Longhurst St which they later bought with a war service loan in 1958.

Basil, Dennis, Melvin and Nellie's brother Tom Peacock all drove the Moppett school buses.

Besides being a Motor Mechanic was a self taught Panel beater and Spray painter.

He was the movie projectionist when movies were shown in the Town Hall.

Later when the town opened a Drive In Cinema in 1968 he continued on as the projectionist.

Basil was in many of the local clubs including Masonic Lodge, ROAB, Cricket and Football Clubs.

He was a volunteer Ambulance Driver and a Life member he was also a volunteer Fire Fighter.

The Ambulance was housed in the the building over the road from his house so he was often called upon to drive it to accidents and with regular runs to Perth.

He was an Opening batsman in the Cricket team and Curator for the cricket pitch and was a Life member of the Cricket Club.

He was the Manager of the Junior football team at the Burley Carnival.

Basil was a Boundary Umpire for the football initially for the Warriors and Rovers and then for the single team when the two clubs merged and became the Hawks. When he finished umpiring he became a trainer and was doing that job for the Hawks when they won the 1972 premiership.

Nellie died in 1973 from Breast Cancer and Basil in 1975 from a Heart Attack both are buried in the **Naremben Cemetery**.

Brian started school in the Masonic Lodge in 1952 as did all first graders for a number of years.

In his second year in 1953 he moved to the main school over the road where it is today.

Brian sat his junior exams in 1962 in a room in the South East corner of the Town Hall.

After leaving school he worked at the CO-OP for 12 months before joining the RAAF in Dec 1963.

Brian married Delphine Mitchell in 1966.

They have four children Glenn, Joanne, Natalie and David.

In the RAAF he played Football, Basketball, Vollyball, Badminton and Golf.

He was based at Pearce WA, Williamtown NSW, Butterworth in Malaysia, Williamtown again and Edinburgh in SA, Promoted to the rank of Warrant Officer Engineer in 1982.

He worked for Westralian Sands for 20 years in between had smaller stints for Loves Bus Services, TotalWest Transport and Bunbury Mitsubishi. He was a volunteer for most of his life was the Head Trainer for the South Bunbury Football club for a few years volunteered with the Scouts and Leschenault Swimming club he spent 20 years with the Salvation Army doing whatever was required he towed their emergency trailer with food and drinks to fires, natural disasters, murder investigations and anywhere else they were required. She married Colin Pryce from Merredin in 1970 and later moved to Bunbury. They had two children Todd b 1972 and Chloe b 1975. Shirley married a second time to Murray Ward a Dairy farmer in 1991. She worked in Accounts Payable at Westralian Sands for a number of years then was the Office Manager for Bell Fire Equipment . She also worked for Marindi Fabrications as an Office Manager from 2000 until she retired in 2020. Interestingly Miranda Fabrications has a Narembeen connection it is owned by Peter Menegola son of Valli and Bobby Menegola. She still lives on a farm just south of Bunbury raising a small herd of beef cattle.
