## **EXCITING EVENT**

The [RAC WA](#) Rescue Experience is coming to Naremben during [SOCK Week 2022!](#)

Visit the town oval on Friday, 1st July from 3.30pm and get an insight into the incredible work of the RAC Rescue helicopters. The 360 degree virtual reality experience takes participants on an emergency rescue mission to transport a patient who has been in a car crash.

The RAC Rescue Experience is a reenactment of a rescue mission. While the footage doesn't graphically portray the patient's injuries the theme of someone being airlifted to hospital as a result of a car crash is a mature concept and was created with adults and children over the age of 12 in mind.

To ensure the experience is comfortable and safe for all participants we have the following controls in place:

- Children under 110cm in height are not permitted to view the virtual reality. A sign with the 110cm mark displayed will be there
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult also watching the virtual reality
- Children who aren't able to view the virtual reality are able to sit on the helicopter to view the inside

## **LIONS SKIN CANCER SCREENING BUS**

The Narembeen Lions Club hosted a successful visit from the Lions Skin Cancer Screening Bus last Saturday.

56 people were screened, with 13 (23%) of those screened having observed lesions and referred for further assessment. This compares with the last visit in August 2020 when 64 people were screened with 14% receiving referrals. Pleasingly we had 17 people attend who had never been screened for skin cancers before.

Our two screeners, Dr Alan and Diane Wright, are both volunteer retired medical professionals, and observed lesions are suspect only until proven by further investigation..

Whilst all screenings are free, we thank those who generously donated money to assist in the running of this service. The Narembeen Lions Club donated \$500 raised through funds from the glass recycling project.

Dr Alan and Diane Wright, and Administrators Peter and Lion Greg, thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Narembeen, feasting on tender steak on Friday night, scrummy fish on Saturday night, and a steady supply of food from both Lions and community during the weekend. The Wrights' were very complimentary of the facilities of the Morning Sun Motel, and as seasoned travellers praised the thought that had gone into planning it

It is planned that another visit will occur in two years time, and provide another opportunity for the Narembeen community to maintain vigilance in monitoring their skin for any possible cancers. Hopefully the venerable and well travelled bus will be replaced by a new and upgraded model for the next visit..

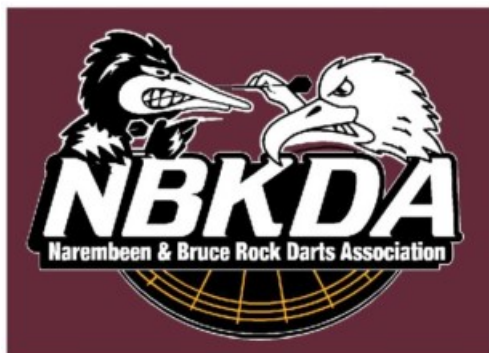

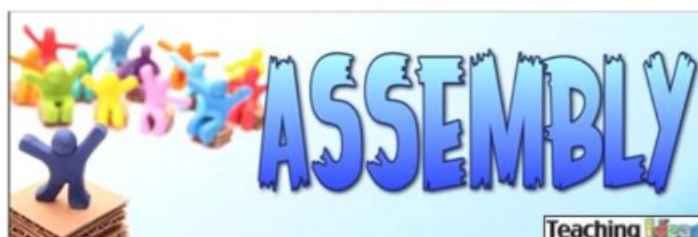


**AUSSIE OF THE MONTH: Molly Gmeiner**

## WHY IT'S SO IMPORTANT

When you wash your hands, you protect yourself from germs. You also protect people in your family. And with the coronavirus, when you stop the spread of germs at home, you protect people in the community too.
