





HAWK TALK

Craig Gmeiner

Just remarkable.....

Just remarkable. Have you ever sat back and watched people do things and just thought to yourself, 'Just remarkable'? That was what went through this reporter's mind as I sat back and watched the Ressies win the most remarkable of premierships on Saturday. It would be the club's eighth Ressies flag, it's fifth since 2007 and when you couple that with the fact that Narembeen have not forfeited a Ressies game since round two 2005, a feat only one other EDFL club can claim to have achieved, it is a wonderful effort by a wonderful club. Or as some might say, just remarkable.

Let's start with the context of the year. The Ressies, coming off a losing grand final in 2021, were always the second best side in it. They lost to Nukarni, as everyone did, and also to Burracoppin in Burracoppin. They won eleven of their fourteen home and away games to get the double chance. They lost a second semi to Nukarni by four odd goals and achieved an against the odds preliminary final win against Burracoppin to get back into the big dance.

Their opponents on the day would be Nukarni. The reigning premiers at this level who had won their previous 39 games of footy. They were supremely talented and had a beautiful mix of youth and experience. No one had really come anywhere near them for nearly three years. They would be very very hard to beat.

The game was played in wet and freezing conditions and was quickly an arm wrestle. The Ressies got their numbers up around the ball and were able to defend like their lives depended on it. Will Gray and Mike Mortimore were assigned the task of curtailing Jack Puglia and Matt Harrod for the day and did a wonderful job. They were helped by some



intense midfield pressure. It was rare that the Demons midfield was able to find space and time to deliver the footy and this was a huge step towards the end result.

At half time the Ressies would go in nine points in front. They had fought and scrapped and committed their way through a remarkable first half of footy. Sammy Bald was providing a strong target in front of the footy and Ri Green was leading a midfield that was as committed to the contest and to each other as any you would ever see. They were standing up against a very good side and proving to be just as good.

Whenever something great is achieved there are moments. Moments of definition where individuals or groups can either stand up or get pushed over. Which way these moments go is often shown by the body language that comes in a reaction to the event. In the second half of the Ressies Grand Final on Saturday there were two such moments. The way the side reacted to these moments went a long way to getting them what they were after.

The first such moment was right on the three quarter time siren. Chris Shaw was crudely shirt fronted off the ball. As Shaw lay prone on the ground the maroon and gold jumpers were quick to descend on the scene and make the point that they weren't copping that. The siren went and more arrived. Club veteran Sam Bald gathered the players together. The tightness of the group was obvious. Eyes were up, absorbing what Sam said. The message from Bald and the other senior players focussed the group on the most important thing, hitting the scoreboard.

The final quarter saw the Demons mount their inevitable challenge, showing how good a side they were. In a pulsating final term they would draw level. Extra time looked on the cards as the clock ticked away. The Ressies kept fighting though, kept pushing, kept competing. They created another opportunity with under two minutes to go. Rosie Hunter would kick the goal. The same lads who had stood up for Shaw would then descend on Hunter, knowing the gravity of the situation. They then ran back to their spots ready to fight with all they could to hold on to their lead.

The last two minutes was footy of the greatest desperation from each side. The Demons did all they could to create a score and the Ressies did all they could to hold on. Then the siren rang. The outward euphoria of all Narembeen people who had made the trip and descended on the players at the final siren showed the size of what they had achieved. When everything said they really shouldn't be able to do it, all the odds were against them, they gritted their teeth, smiled and did it anyway. It really was remarkable.






