It has been announced that Queen Elizabeth II's funeral will take place on Monday 19 September.

A state funeral is a huge public memorial ceremony for an important person, to whom the whole country is paying tribute.

On Sunday, the Queen's coffin left Balmoral in Aberdeenshire for Edinburgh, where people will be given the chance to pay their respects to Her Majesty.

The Queen's coffin left Balmoral Castle on Sunday morning at the start of a six-hour journey, where it passed through towns and cities including Aberdeen and Dundee before arriving in Edinburgh.

It was driven to the Palace of Holyroodhouse - the official residence of the British monarch in the Scottish capital.

Thousands of people lined the streets along the way to pay their respects to Her Majesty.

Here's what will happen over the next few days.

On Monday, the Queen will be at rest in St Giles' Cathedral in Edinburgh so that members of the public can see her coffin - a tradition known as lying in state.

Her Majesty's coffin will then be taken to London where the Queen will lie in state at Westminster Hall for four days from Wednesday.

The public will be allowed to view the coffin during that time.

It is thought that hundreds of thousands of people will travel to London to pay their final respects. It has also been announced that King Charles III will tour all four nations that make up the UK before the Queen's funeral - starting in Edinburgh on Monday.

He will be joined by his wife Camilla, the Queen Consort and Liz Truss, the UK prime minister.







The government has said that a period of national mourning will last until the day of the state funeral. The Queen's lying in state will end on the morning of Monday 19 September, when the coffin will be taken to Westminster Abbey for the funeral.

Westminster Abbey is a historic church where many of Britain's kings and queens were crowned, and it was also the place where Queen Elizabeth II married Prince Philip in 1947.

As well as the Royal Family, politicians and world leaders including US President Joe Biden, will attend Her Majesty's state funeral - which will also be broadcast on TV.



It has also been announced that the day will be a Bank Holiday in the UK.

The Royal Family will observe a longer period of mourning for seven days after the funeral.

Huge crowds have continued to gather outside royal residences across the UK in order to lay flowers and remember the Queen.



## WEDDING BELLS

MOPPETT – BRISTOW 6.9.1947



Flowers, photos, congratulatory cards and messages flooded in on Tuesday 6th September, 2022 for Iris and Melvin Bristow as it had done at their wedding, 75 years earlier at St Pauls Church of England, Narembeen.

Last Tuesday morning immediate family, residents and friends gathered in celebration of their anniversary at Koolberrin Lodge, Narembeen, for a sumptuous morning tea, provided by the hospital staff and fit for royalty.

Forwarded congratulatory cards with messages were received from: the late Queen Elizabeth 11; the Governor-General of Australia, David Hurley; the Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese; the Governor of WA, Chris Dawson and the Premier of WA, Mark McGowan. The enormity of the occasion for Iris and Mel, gradually crept in as the mail began to arrive!

Sentiments echoed by each of the dignitaries were; the shared memories made over the years, and their marriage - as one of loyalty, commitment, patience and understanding - worthy of admiration and respect.

There was plenty of similar chat throughout the morning tea as guests relaxed and enjoyed an array of sandwiches, hot and savoury foods and sweet treats. Staff also streamed in to offer their congratulations. Clover Dold, acting Health Services Manager, expressed the enormity of pride in their achievement and how it was an honour to be a part of their day.

Champagne soon 'flowed' when a toast was proposed. In response, Iris sincerely thanked everyone and Mel recalled, as he often does, of the first day he spotted Iris. At about 17 years, and as the bus was about to leave Kondinin back to Narembeen from the annual sports day, there was one vacant spot up the back. This happened to be next to Iris and, as he says, the rest is history. It is also said that he skipped all the way home after he hopped off the bus - an obvious reason for the big spring in his step, more so than having just won open champion athlete on the day.



With thanks to the Co-op ladies, a large feather-light cream-filled sponge cake with clusters of decorative strawberries was cut, shared and soon devoured. A sweet and fulfilling conclusion to a memorable 75<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary.



Both born in 1925 (Iris now 97, Mel in a few weeks), they have lived around the Narembreen district all their lives with both families originating from South Australia. With Mel having gone to Muresk, then to the family farm (now owned by the Lynch family) and Iris to Northam High School then teaching; their marriage was the beginning of their rich family, farm and community involvement.

Three children: Kingsley (1948), Janine (1950) and Coralie (1951) soon became part of their lives instilling similar values and experiences growing up in a farming community.

There are trails of their shared achievements in the History Centre and catalogues and albums of their accomplishments and diarised forms of their busy lives, entrusted to the family. Citizens of the Year and Life Memberships have been earned and recognised. Office bearing positions readily taken and sporting trophies displayed. Overseas travels and country caravanning are still conversation topics.

To highlight, however, Iris saw the value in recording historical events, leading to the publishing of *Seedtime and Harvest; A History of the Narembreen District 1888-1988*. As a keen journalist, she also researched and wrote of Narembreen's early pioneer farming families, as well as sporting organisations and other civic booklets. Inaugurating *The Fencepost* and editing for many years followed. The Order of Australia Medal was awarded to Iris in 2003 for services to the Narembreen community.

Mel found time off the farm as a shire representative and later shire president and latterly his interest in the Wadderin Wildlife sanctuary. For his myriad other community achievements, including his JP work, Mel was presented with a Freeman of the Shire award in 2011.

*On behalf of Mum and Dad ... Kingsley and Eileen, Janine, and Coralie and Bryan again sincerely thank the hospital and the Koolberrin staff for organising the day.*

*We are immensely proud of our parents, as are their 8 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren. While Iris and Mel are a little more bone weary these days and further from sight, they still however, hold dear their memories and connections of almost a century in the making at Narembreen. They wouldn't have had it any other way.*

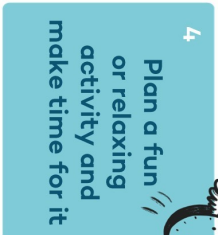
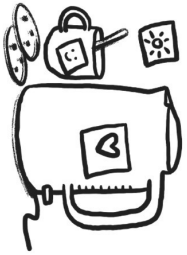

Story Time this month was scheduled for Fri, 30 Sep - unfortunately we have decided to cancel this session due to staffing shortages but will be back on the last Friday in October!

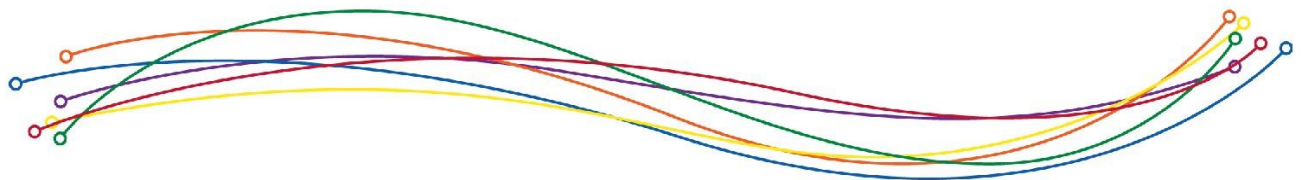
