COUNCIL WRAP UP—SEPTEMBER 2022 continued

Housing Strategy

Council has identified the ongoing and increasing requirement for housing options within the town for employees. In consultation with planning consultants and the Housing Strategy Working Group, Council resolved to undertake this following with a view of increasing housing options.

1. Agree to investigate building a mix of smaller two or three bedroom properties for employee housing;
2. Identify Lot 104 (27) Currall Street, Narembeen as the preferred location of the employee housing project, subject to further site investigation;
3. Direct the CEO to approach Go Narembeen as a potential partner to the project in the first instance followed by CEACA and report outcomes;
4. Allocate \$15,000 in the February 2023 Budget Review for improvements to 16 Hilton Way, Narembeen
5. Council and CEO actively lobby the State to invest in new housing stock for public servants in the region in collaboration with Roe Regional Councils.

Narembeen Homes for the Aged Inc

In an effort to support Narembeen Homes For the Aged Inc to continue to provide a high level of service to the Narembeen Community, council resolved to continue discussion with Narembeen Homes for the Aged Inc to provide administrative and building maintenance support, ensuring the sustainability of the program in Narembeen and invite CEACA to present to Council.

Multipurpose Sports Facility Feasibility and Concept Design

Council received the first draft of the Multipurpose Sports Facility and concept design. Council has raised a few questions regarding the reports and have resolved to:

1. Receive the Multipurpose Sports Facility Feasibility and Concept Design report subject to Staff seeking clarification on refurbishment of existing tennis and hockey field costs, any variations to draft plan to reduce costs, reduction in building blueprint and similar projects costs
2. Once information received, refer the report to Narembeen Hockey and Tennis clubs for feedback requesting formal advice from each club on its position regarding the project

FIRE BREAK ORDER 2022/2023

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of *Bushfire Act 1954*, you are hereby required on or before **31 October 2022** to plough, scarify, cultivate, spray or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable matters until **15 April 2023** firebreaks in the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you.

Rural Land

Firebreaks 2.5 metres wide as follows:

Immediately adjacent to and surrounding all cleared land subdividing all cleared land into areas no greater than 400 hectares. Surrounding each building, haystack, fuel dump or ramp.

Townsite Land

Firebreaks 2.0 metres as follows:

Vacant lots in excess of 1,025 sq metres as follows:

- All lots containing less than 2,025 sq metres on boundaries and immediately surrounding all buildings.
- Remove all flammable material from fuel dumps or liquid fuel containers to a distance of 15 metres.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the costs of performing the work directed by this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner and/or occupier by the date required by this Notice.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD (permit required)

Restricted burning period is now in place until 31 October 2022.

Permits can be obtained from Murray Dixon, Chief Financial Control Officer.

MOSQUITO FOGGING

LIFESTYLE

In your lifetime you have experienced a lot of changes in technology. What has been the most significant for you?


The Telephone—because it was the beginning of modern communication, to be able to communicate across the world. The first telephone connected to the school was in 1956.



What change in technology was the hardest for you to grasp, and why?

Computers “plus” - because they are almost unbelievable and while their good points are great the downside of modern technology is not good. I do not like the lack of human contact.

When you were a child what means of communication were there and which was most commonly used?



Letter writing was the most common form of communication, very few homes could afford telephones, this was a ‘service for business’ people mainly. Telegrams (by morse code) were also another form of communication through the Post Office.

What was your favourite form of communication, and why?

Letter writing was a favourite for me, as I had pen friends in America and relatives in England. Also, when war came in 1939 we wrote to servicemen abroad.

What was your favourite pastime as a child, and why?

I think riding our bikes everywhere on weekends, no “strange danger” in those days, also could visit friends on farms close to town.

What forms of entertainment was there and what was your favourite?

We had “Paddy Baker” bring pictures (movies) to town—also most families went to dances in the old town hall—late night shopping on Saturday nights a social night. Football on Sundays—visiting and playing with other kids. We made our own fun, dancing was my favourite. The Brass Band played in the street on Sunday mornings.

What types of food did you most commonly eat/make?

Basic food has stayed much the same. Soups, stews, salad, lots more sweets eaten. Rice pudding, custard, apple pie, sandwiches, home cooked cakes, biscuits, a lot more home cooking was done in early days—“beats takeaways”.

What was the fashion in your childhood days?


There wasn't a lot of fashion in our childhood, there was a lack of money in most homes. Girls wore dresses or skirts and blouses, shoes and socks, sometimes sandals, cardigans and jumpers, usually one best dress. Boys wore short pants and shirts, jumpers, shoes and socks, sandals sometimes. They went into long pants at about 14 years old. No jeans or sneakers or beanies, hoodies etc in the early days.

What were the popular hairstyles in your days?

Girls mainly had short hair or plaits and had their hair curled in 'rags' for special occasions. There were no ladies hairdressers in town. The boys had mainly short back and sides. There was a man's barber shop in town. Mothers mostly cut their children's hair.




