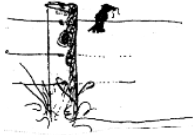

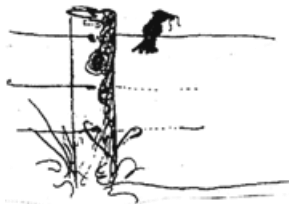

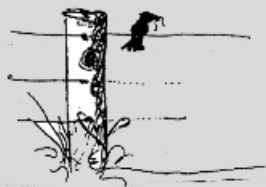

Country Stargazing

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

A Total Eclipse of the Moon! Coming to Your Skies 8th November!

For natural cosmic phenomena, you don't get more remarkable than a Total Lunar Eclipse!

A total lunar eclipse occurs, when the Sun and Moon are perfectly aligned in their orbits, with the Earth in the middle. As the Moon travels around the far side of the Earth, it passes directly into the shadow of the Earth.

Why does the Moon turn Red?

To add to the magic of it all, the Moon turns a coppery-red during a total eclipse, earning it the nickname of 'Blood Moon'. As the Moon passes into the full shadow of the Earth, called the umbra, the Sun's light passes through the atmosphere of our planet and is scattered, losing most of the blue light. This means that the light that reaches the lunar surface is predominantly red in colour. This effect is known as Rayleigh Scattering and this is also how our sunsets are created.

When to look: From 7.00pm to 8.50pm, 8th of November.

Which direction to look: In WA, the Moon will rise, mid-eclipse, starting low in the eastern horizon.

Enjoy the magical transformation of the bright full Moon into a slowly darkening coppery ball, hanging mysteriously in space.

Another colourful grouping occurs on the 11th of November with Mars forming an Orange Triangle with two red super giant stars, Betelgeuse and Aldebaran. The Moon lies right next to Mars, adding to this special spectacle.

When to look: After 10pm, on the 11th of November.

Which direction to look: North-east.

Enjoy these confetti of colour in the night sky.

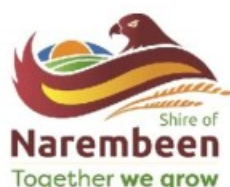

The Minister for Local Government has announced a package of reforms to the *Local Government Act*. As part of the reforms to strengthen democracy and increase community engagement, The Minister proposes to review Councillor numbers based on population.

Shire of Narembeen is undertaking a review of its Councillor numbers and feedback received through this consultation process will assist the shire to transition to the new requirements. As a resident, your input is highly valued, and the Shire is seeking feedback from you on the following options.

- ♦ Option 1- Reduce the number of council members to seven at the next election (2023)
- ♦ Option 2- Reduce the number of Council members to five at the next election (2023)
- ♦ Other suggestions are welcome.
- ♦ If you would like to see a reduction in the number of council members, why?

Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

- **Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.** They provide important information so you can take action to protect yourself and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of a bushfire. You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to assess your level of bushfire risk and decide what actions to take.

The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) levels are:

Moderate: Plan and prepare.

Most fires can be controlled. Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area.

High: Be ready to act.

Fires can be dangerous. Decide what you will do if a fire starts.
Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.

Extreme: Take action now to protect your life and property.

Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. Put your bushfire plan into action.
If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early.

Catastrophic: For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions and if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.

- When there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to '**No Rating**'. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.

Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

- **When a bushfire starts, things can change in a matter of minutes so it's important to stay up to date through official information sources.**

During a bushfire, emergency services will provide you with as much information as possible, but no system is foolproof. If you believe you are in danger, act immediately to stay safe and do not wait for a warning.

If you see smoke or flames call Triple Zero (000) and put your bushfire plan into action immediately.

Bushfire warning levels change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property, and the decreasing amount of time you have until the fire arrives.

The warning levels for bushfires are:

Advice	Watch and Act	Emergency Warning	All Clear
			
A fire has started but there is no immediate threat to lives or homes. Be aware and keep up to date.	There is a possible threat to lives or homes. You need to leave or get ready to defend – do not wait and see.	There is a threat to lives or homes. You are in danger and need to take immediate action to survive.	The danger has passed and the fire is under control. Take care and remain vigilant in case the situation changes.

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

- Lung cancer is the third most common cancer affecting both women and men in Western Australia.
- In 2017, 637 Western Australian men and 472 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

- Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:

- A new cough or change to your usual cough
- Repeated chest infections
- Becoming more short of breath, tired or lacking energy
- Losing weight without trying
- Pain in your chest or shoulder
- Finding it hard to breathe or swallow
- Not feeling hungry.

If you have coughed up blood, even if it was just once, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer – often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Sid's message – 'Slip Slop Slap Seek and Slide' It's National Skin Cancer Action Week 21st – 27th November and with two in three Australians diagnosed with skin cancer by age 70, the action week is an important reminder to use sun protection and of the importance of early skin cancer detection for all Australians as we make our way into summer. It's important to use the five forms of sun protection:

Slip on sun-protective clothing,

Slop on SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen,

Slap on a broad-brimmed hat,

Seek shade,

Slide on sunglasses.

A combination of these measures, along with getting to know your skin and regularly checking for any changes are the keys to reducing your skin cancer risk. Preparing Students for a Changing World

We are heading into Week 4, while the community heads into harvest and all of us commence the busy lead up to the silly season. On Wednesday September 21 2022, the Narembeen DHS, Narembeen CRC and local seniors from the community came together to celebrate Older Adults' Week. Around 20 seniors joined students from Kindy, Pre-primary and Year 4-5, to participate in a range of activities. There were 3 stations: craft, outdoor games and historical objects investigation:

- The craft activity involved making and decorating crowns. This was a fun activity, which had extra significance in memory of Queen Elizabeth II. It was great to see students and adults wearing their crowns throughout the day.
- The games rotation saw different games, set up on the netball court, ranging from firing a ball into a bear's mouth, to shooting hoops, skittles, Jenga and a large game of Connect Four. Mrs Yvonne Treloar summed it up in her letter to the school, "It was very entertaining for the older children who joined in the little groups to explain the games, and praise and reprove the younger ones with such good humour".
- The third station created much discussion and interest as the students interviewed the seniors on a range of items borrowed from the historical society. Answers were recorded on the iPads and made into a book using the app Book Creator. Once again Mrs Treloar summarized it well. "We had a mixture of mostly kitchen items which had to be named. This caused a lot of interest and explanation by the oldies. There was also a letter under glass written in 1916. I certainly remembered the old copy books we used to use. When we told them that it (the letter) was over 100 years old, they weren't that impressed until I told them I was 91 and they looked me over very speculatively, but decided I suppose that I still looked like a human being". It was fantastic to receive the letter from Mrs Treloar and get a senior's point of view. Thank you for taking the time to write to the school.

A beautiful array of food was on offer for morning tea which provided a break after 2 rotations. Thank you to the staff and the CRC for providing such a magnificent spread. To conclude the morning, we were fortunate to have Paulie share 3 songs he wrote about Narembeen, after reading Iris Bristow's book. 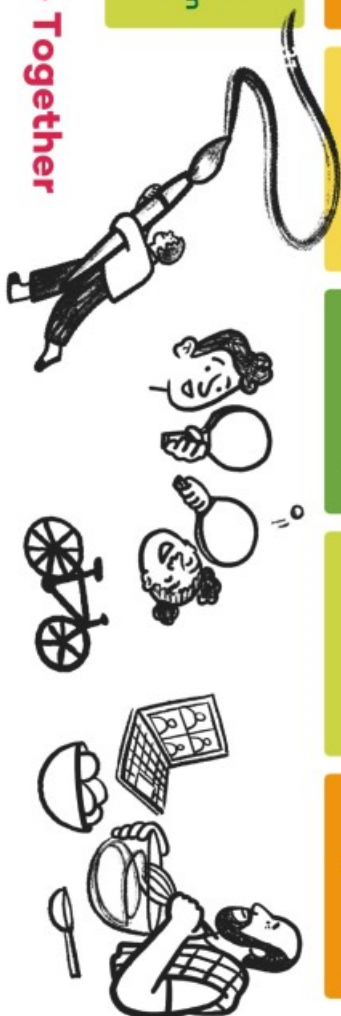
