



# **ANIMAL REGISTRATIONS**

# **Dog Registrations**

It is a legal requirement that all dogs over three months of age are registered.

To assist in reuniting lost pets with their owners quickly, dogs must always wear both their registration tag and an identification tag. This registration tag should be worn alongside an identification tag that includes your name and address (owner).

Registrations forms are available from the Shire and your dog must be microchipped prior to registration.

Sterilisation is optional; however the Shire does provide discounted registration fees for sterilised dogs. Payment is due at the time of application

Registrations for one or three years are due on the first of November each year. Lifetime registrations are also available.

# **Cat Registrations**

It is a legal requirement for all cats six months of age or older to be registered.

Cats should wear a collar with current registration and identification tags at all times, this will help in safely returning your cat if it is ever lost. If the owner of a cat cannot be identified, it will be transported to the Shire's Management Facility.

Cat owners found to be non-compliant with these requirements may face a \$200 infringement and fines of up to \$5,000 if prosecuted.

All cats over the age of six months of age must be micro-chipped prior to registration. The owner of a cat that has reached six months of age must ensure the cat is sterilised by a vet.

The Minister for Local Government has announced a package of reforms to the *Local Government Act*. As part of the reforms to strengthen democracy and increase community engagement, The Minister proposes to review Councillor numbers based on population.

- Option 1- Reduce the number of council members to seven at the next election (2023)
- Option 2- Reduce the number of Council members to five at the next election (2023)
- Other suggestions are welcome.
- If you would like to see a reduction in the number of council members, why?

# Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start. They provide important information so you can take action to protect yourself and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of a bushfire. You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to assess your level of bushfire risk and decide what actions to take.

# The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) levels are:

## Moderate: Plan and prepare.

Most fires can be controlled. Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area.

# High: Be ready to act.

Fires can be dangerous. Decide what you will do if a fire starts. Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.

# **Extreme: Take action now** to protect your life and property.

Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. Put your bushfire plan into action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early.

# Catastrophic: For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions and if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.



When there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to 'No Rating'. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.

#### Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

# When a bushfire starts, things can change in a matter of minutes so it's important to stay up to date through official information sources.

During a bushfire, emergency services will provide you with as much information as possible, but no system is foolproof. If you believe you are in danger, act immediately to stay safe and do not wait for a warning.

#### If you see smoke or flames call Triple Zero (000) and put your bushfire plan into action immediately.

Bushfire warning levels change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property, and the decreasing amount of time you have until the fire arrives.

SHIRE OF NAREMBEEN PUBLIC NOTICE

#### DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION – PROPOSED SINGLE HOUSE AND OUTBUILDING 29 CHEETHAM WAY, NAREMBEEN

The owner of the abovementioned lot has lodged a planning application proposing to construct a single house and an outbuilding.

Under the Residential Design Codes the permitted aggregate size of an outbuilding on a lot is 60m<sup>2</sup> in floor area, with a 2.4 metre wall height and 4.2 metre ridge height.

The Shire has adopted a Local Planning Policy that allows lots above 2000m<sup>2</sup> to have a larger outbuilding, subject to Shire approval. The Shires Policy allows a potential floor area of 150m<sup>2</sup>, a wall height of 3.5 metres and a roof height of 5 metres for an outbuilding.

The application entails a variation to the R Codes and the Shires Local Planning Policy as the proposed outbuilding would have a floor area of 200m<sup>2</sup>, and a wall height of 4 metres.

The proposed house location also entails a variation to the front setback requirements. It complies with the front setback minimum of 6 metres however does not achieve the 12-metre average front setback.

Prior to determining this application, the Shire would like to provide an opportunity for public comment on the proposal. The development plans can be viewed at the Shire of Narembeen administration office during office hours or on the Shire website.

Should you wish to make a submission on the proposal, your comments (in writing) will need to be lodged with Council within 14 days by 23 November 2022.

Please note, if no comments are received by the closure date, we will assume that you have no comment you wish to make and the application will be assessed and determined on its merits and without any further consultation.



# **SCAM ALERT**

The nationwide scourge of scammers stealing money from unsuspecting and vulnerable individuals has turned its ugly head towards clubs and charities in WA.

Payment redirection scams cost Australian businesses over \$14 million in 2021 and WA ScamNet is warning committee members to be on high alert for impersonators of third-party suppliers in particular.

Consumer Protection was recently informed of a WA association which was duped out of \$70,000 by a sophisticated email payment scam. Scammers posing as the president of the association requested a number of payments from the treasurer, who unfortunately transferred money electronically to the requested account without question.

Many clubs and charities are run by volunteers and it appears scammers have identified this as a susceptible target market. We ask that you ensure your committee members are on alert for potential scams. Please read and follow the advice on the <u>Payment Redirection Scams</u> page on the WA ScamNet website.

Committee members should also take this opportunity to review their payment practices and ensure proper controls are in place. These may include, but are not limited to, ensuring a valid invoice is received for each payment and matched to a purchase order or approval for the purchase; requiring at least two persons to effect a payment; passwords are not shared or written down and bank statements are regularly reconciled.


