



## Narembeen District High School

Located in Western Australia's Wheatbelt region, Narembeen District High School provides students with a locally relevant and rich educational setting. Despite its regional location, the school has a strong focus on ensuring students are not disadvantaged by isolation. It has a positive learning environment where excellence is encouraged in all areas of education, including academically, socially and on sports fields.

The whole school community also takes part in several annual events including family days, yoga days, friendship days, NAIDOC Week, Reconciliation Week and R U OK? Day to promote togetherness and belonging.

"The school's positive culture sees us with happy, well-adjusted students, who strive to be the best they can be. They have great pride in their school and its achievements," Christine says. Programs that boost student success include a strong focus on reading education, as well as whole school literacy and numeracy programs to equip students with these vital skills from a young age.

When a hard of hearing student enrolled at Narembeen District High School, all staff completed a short Auslan course. Auslan then went on to become the language all students from Years 3 to 8 learn. There are also teaching specialists in music, physical education, science and IT working with primary school students. The school also has an impressive list of sporting achievements, including winning swimming championships for 18 of the last 19 years, and a cross country shield for the last 23 years.

"Our motto is 'preparing students for a changing world' and we certainly have excellent programs in place and teachers in classrooms to enable them to achieve to their potential," Christine says. "Our aim is to ensure all our students achieve their personal best and continue to grow, not only academically, but morally and socially. We guide them to respect individual differences and develop pride in themselves, their school, their environment and their community."






The J.S.Roe campsites and the old school sites will be high on the agenda for 2023. It was suggested also that old wells should be included when mapping these attractions.

#### ANIMAL REGISTRATIONS

Letters have gone out to all residents who have a dog or cat registered with the Shire.

Registrations are due and can be paid in person at the Shire.



## Dog Registrations

It is a legal requirement that all dogs over three months of age are registered.

To assist in reuniting lost pets with their owners quickly, dogs must always wear both their registration tag and an identification tag. This registration tag should be worn alongside an identification tag that includes your name and address (owner).

Registrations forms are available from the Shire and your dog must be microchipped prior to registration.

Sterilisation is optional; however the Shire does provide discounted registration fees for sterilised dogs. Payment is due at the time of application

Registrations for one or three years are due on the first of November each year. Lifetime registrations are also available.

### Cat Registrations

It is a legal requirement for all cats six months of age or older to be registered.

Cats should wear a collar with current registration and identification tags at all times, this will help in safely returning your cat if it is ever lost. If the owner of a cat cannot be identified, it will be transported to the Shire's Management Facility.

The Minister for Local Government has announced a package of reforms to the *Local Government Act*. As part of the reforms to strengthen democracy and increase community engagement, The Minister proposes to review Councillor numbers based on population.

Shire of Narembeen is undertaking a review of its Councillor numbers and feedback received through this consultation process will assist the shire to transition to the new requirements. As a resident, your input is highly valued, and the Shire is seeking feedback from you on the following options.

- Option 1- Reduce the number of council members to seven at the next election (2023)
- Option 2- Reduce the number of Council members to five at the next election (2023)
- Other suggestions are welcome.

Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.

They provide important information so you can take action to protect yourself and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of a bushfire. You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to assess your level of bushfire risk and decide what actions to take.

## The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) levels are:

## Moderate: Plan and prepare.

Most fires can be controlled. Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area.

## High: Be ready to act.

Fires can be dangerous. Decide what you will do if a fire starts. Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.

## **Extreme: Take action now** to protect your life and property.

Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. Put your bushfire plan into action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early.

## Catastrophic: For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions and if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.

When there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to 'No Rating'. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.

#### Fire Danger Ratings and Bushfire Warnings

When a bushfire starts, things can change in a matter of minutes so it's important to stay up to date through official information sources.

During a bushfire, emergency services will provide you with as much information as possible, but no system is foolproof. If you believe you are in danger, act immediately to stay safe and do not wait for a warning.

If you see smoke or flames call Triple Zero (000) and put your bushfire plan into action immediately.

Bushfire warning levels change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property, and the decreasing amount of time you have until the fire arrives.

**Emergency Warning** 

All Clear

#### SHIRE OF NAREMBEEN PUBLIC NOTICE

### DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION – PROPOSED SINGLE HOUSE AND OUTBUILDING 29 CHEETHAM WAY, NAREMBEEN

The owner of the abovementioned lot has lodged a planning application proposing to construct a single house and an outbuilding.

Under the Residential Design Codes the permitted aggregate size of an outbuilding on a lot is 60m<sup>2</sup> in floor area, with a 2.4 metre wall height and 4.2 metre ridge height.

The Shire has adopted a Local Planning Policy that allows lots above 2000m<sup>2</sup> to have a larger outbuilding, subject to Shire approval. The Shires Policy allows a potential floor area of 150m<sup>2</sup>, a wall height of 3.5 metres and a roof height of 5 metres for an outbuilding.

The application entails a variation to the R Codes and the Shires Local Planning Policy as the proposed outbuilding would have a floor area of 200m<sup>2</sup>, and a wall height of 4 metres.

The proposed house location also entails a variation to the front setback requirements. It complies with the front setback minimum of 6 metres however does not achieve the 12-metre average front setback.

Prior to determining this application, the Shire would like to provide an opportunity for public comment on the proposal. The development plans can be viewed at the Shire of Narembeen administration office during office hours or on the Shire website.

Should you wish to make a submission on the proposal, your comments (in writing) will need to be lodged with Council within 14 days by 23 November 2022.

Please note, if no comments are received by the closure date, we will assume that you have no comment you wish to make and the application will be assessed and determined on its merits and without any further consultation.




