Hello,

Hope everyone is well. Giving you an update of the happenings in Narembeen.

Narembeen Police visited Narembeen District High School and took part in a morning sausage sizzle with the children. It was an excellent event and it was great to see a lot of smiling faces. A big thankyou to Narembeen IGA who provided the sausages and bread. Narembeen Police also found the time to take part in a reading with the children from Narembeen Kindy. Fortunately, the reading material wasn't too hard.

We have received a report of suspicious activities in the Wadderin area. Please report any suspicious vehicles or persons in the area to police.

There continues to be serious/fatal traffic crashes in Regional WA.

Please be aware that more people die on regional roads in WA than on metropolitan roads.

Common factors in fatal road crashes on regional roads include speed, fatigue, non-use of seatbelts, and unlicensed drivers.

The number of serious injuries and fatalities when not wearing restraints increases dramatically in regional and remote areas.

Too often drivers fail to adjust to the differences in road conditions between metropolitan highways and regional arterial roads.

The Wheatbelt has the highest fatality rate per head of population.

- Always wear a seatbelt. Those travelling unrestrained in a car are at least 10 times more likely to be killed in a road crash than those wearing a seat belt.
- Don't speed: 110 kph is the maximum limit on regional roads.
- Drive to conditions. Consider the state of road surfaces, time of day, proximity to trees on the roadside.
- Fatigue is a killer: take regular breaks when driving long distances.
- Road safety is everyone's responsibility.

We want everyone to be home with their loved ones, until next time, stay safe.

COUNCIL MEETING BRIEFS - FEBRUARY

To commence the process to recruit a new CEO Council appointed consultant Fitz Gerald Strategies to assist the Selection Panel with the recruitment, with a Selection Panel comprising the Shire President, Cr Kellie Mortimore, Deputy Shire President Cr Scott Stirrat, Councillors Michael curie and Warren Milner and Rhonda Cole as the Independent Person.



It is planned that advertising will commence in early March 2023 for the position.

A motion by Councillor Bray for the CEO to investigate the appointment of a Work Health and safety officer on a shared basis with some other RoeROC local governments was endorsed by Council and the proposal will now be discussed at the next regional Roe ROC meeting in March 2023

NAREMBEEN MINE OPERATIONS

Council has received complaints from the community regarding the trucks operating in an unsafe manner on Mt Arrowsmith and Mt Walker Roads, such as crossing over in front of oncoming vehicles and crossing over to the incorrect side of the road when turning not other roads.

The Acting CEO has discussed these concerns with the Mine Manager, Hugh Trivett and as all the trucks have cameras fitted, he has given a commitment to deal with these matters when raised. However, to take the appropriate action he requires dates and times when these incidents are occurring. LONGHURST STREET DRAINAGE

The installation of the drainage pipes has now been completed and kerbing will be undertaken as soon as contractor can be sourced and hopefully this will solve some of the water pooling issues in this section of the street this winter.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Restricted (Permit Required) 1st February to 15th April

The following additional requirements for burning are also in place.

- 1st February includes grass and raked cereal stubble and header windrows of non-cereal stubble including canola and legumes.
- 1st March is header windrows and chaff dumps and cereal stubble fires.

Any questions about burning times should be directed to a Fire Control Officer or the Shire Office.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SURVEY

Thank you to those of you in the community who took part in this survey. It informs us of what the community is wanting to see improved and developed in our town centre.

As part of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure funding project, a draft concept plan was developed to assist the Shire to adopt a longer-term vision with input from the Community. As part of this process, a survey was conducted over six weeks from December 2022 to February 2023 through the following processes:

- Information table at the Community Christmas Party
- Social Media
- Local Newsletter Fencepost
- Copies of the plan made available at the CRC and Shire Office
- Mail out via Australia Post

32 responses were received with the majority representing the older members of the community.

The survey had a total of 16 options/suggestions to be ranked on priorities from 1 High to 3 Low. Any options not ranked were given an absentee score of 3. An opportunity to add other suggestions, ideas and comments was also included.

All comments were recorded and presented to Council with #15 Reduced Parking in Churchill Street being both ranked the lowest priority and receiving the most comments.

The three highest priorities included:

- 1. #17 Pavement in front of IGA
- 2. #7 New pathways connecting the main street with the rest of the town
- 3. #1 Wayfinding Signage

The results were presented at the February Council meeting for consideration on how Phase 3 funding will be allocated for Churchill Street. It was recommended that the paving in Churchill Street be the focus of these current funds.

The draft concept plan will be finalised within the coming months with the results from the survey and suggestions provided by both the Council and the Community to be included. The Plan will be designed to help guide the Shire on how future infrastructure funding will be spent.

The Equinox & Star Clusters

The equinox marks the transition from summer to autumn in the southern hemisphere and has almost the same number of hours of daylight as darkness!

Equinoxes happen twice a year and on the dates of the equinox, the Sun is exactly above the Earth's equator, causing the equal length of night and day. The equinox marks several astronomical phenomena too! During the equinox, the Sun will rise directly in the east and set due west. The Sun will also appear exactly halfway between its northern most and southern most location in the sky. The exact time of the equinox occurs when the sun is directly above the Earth's equator, for 2023 this will occur at 5:24am for West Australians.

The Autumnal equinox for the southern hemisphere will occur on the 21st of March.

For some fun stargazing, the quarter Moon makes a close approach to Mars from March 26, and on the 28th will be just below the red planet. For those with telescopes or high-powered binoculars, the Shoe-Buckle Star cluster can be seen above Mars, and the January Salt-and-Pepper Star Cluster can be seen below the Moon.

When to look: 7pm to 9.30pm, 28th of March. Which direction to look: In the western sky.

Something Interesting: Star clusters are lovely astronomical objects to view, often distinguishable with special shapes and patterns. The Shoe-Buckle Cluster is an open cluster located in the constellation Gemini. The cluster is approximately 2,800 light-years away from Earth and contains approximately 200 stars.


