RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Restricted (Permit Required) 1st February to 15th April

The following additional requirements for burning are also in place.

- 1st February includes grass and raked cereal stubble and header windrows of non-cereal stubble including canola and legumes.
- 1st March is header windrows and chaff dumps and cereal stubble fires.

Any questions about burning times should be directed to a Fire Control Officer or the Shire Office.

NAREMBEEN MINE OPERATIONS

Council has received complaints from the community regarding the trucks operating in an unsafe manner on Mt Arrowsmith and Mt Walker Roads, such as crossing over in front of oncoming vehicles and crossing over to the incorrect side of the road when turning onto other roads.

The Acting CEO has discussed these concerns with the Mine Manager, Hugh Trivett and as all the trucks have cameras fitted, he has given a commitment to deal with these matters when raised. 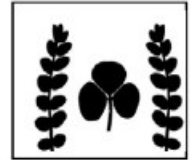

JOHN HENRY CURRIE

Born in Mt Lawley on the 22nd May 1933. Second son to William Stanley and Dorothy Alice Currie of Burracoppin. Brother of Brian William.

He spent the first 9 years of his life at Burracoppin attending the North Burracoppin School. He rode his bike 9 kilometers each way every day, joined by teachers Ryllis and Lampardo on the way, all on bikes and in all weather.

He left Burracoppin for Narembeen 17th March 1942 because the grass hoppers drove his dad out of farming there.

He attended Narembeen School and rode his bike 6 kilometers each way until going to Narrogin School of Agriculture in 1948—1949.

He came home to the farm with his dad and brother Brian in 1950. He dad bought a farm at Gorge Rock in 1951, 80 kilometers away, between Corrigin, Kondinin and Kulin.

They sold Gorge Rock in 1952 to buy Nobles and Bears next door.

On the 8th February 1958 John married Peggy Wagner and had 3 children, Graeme, Jenny (deceased) and Noela.

We purchased Dayman's farm, near Wadderin Dam in 1962. We all farmed together until 1964.

Later John and Graeme purchased George Burgins next door, then Brian Federici's at Wogarl.

John and Graeme farmed together until 1988, when all farms were sold.

John and Peg lived in Narembeen for 2 years, which time he worked for WJ Nichols.

John played football for Warriors from 1950 until the amalgamation with Rovers in 1963.

While playing with Warriors, they won 5 premierships, including the first of the Bruce Rock/Merredin amalgamation in 1960 (EDFL).

During Johns football career he was selected in association sides.

His highlight was being selected from 14 teams playing at the Northam carnival, to play in a lightning carnival in Perth in 1958. They were the winning country team.

After the amalgamation of Warriors and Rovers, John was the first captain/coach in 1963. During this time there were some very lean years and if they won there would be a gravel pit party back at John and Peg's.

He was made a life member in 1967 after many years on the committee.

After retiring from football, age 35, in 1968 he tried golf for 6 weeks, then he went back to watching the game he loved.

John was president of the football club in 1970.

He was always a Hawthorn fan and never changed.

Over the years John played tennis at Wadderin Hill, Narembeen and Mt Arrowsmith. He was captain at Arrowsmith for many years.

John played cricket for South Kumminin, when the regulars went on holidays, but still got picked to play in finals and won premierships.

John was a member of both Masonic and Buff Lodges. They were heavily involved in P & C activities, including "car rallies" which finished at Currie's shed.

He was a member of the Swimming Pool Management Committee for several years.

After giving tennis away, he took up bowls, winning many championships, Champion of Champions and pennant finals with Black, who had a great rivalry with Whites over the years.

He was on the committee for many years, match for 6 years, including 2 years as captain.

On moving to Mandurah in 1990 and joining Dudley Park Bowling Club, he continued enjoying success in Championships and pennants. He was also on Match Committees for a period of time.

After his third hip operation, he sadly gave bowls away.

Since then, they acquired a son in law Barry Cole and 2 grandchildren, Britt and Mac, who he adored and kept in their good books by giving them \$10 to \$20 and now \$25 every time he saw them. The family grew when Britt introduced John and Mac introduced Kelly resulting in Trigg and Lenny.

After retiring to Mandurah, John enjoyed going back to Noela and Barry's to help during seeding, muelsing and sheering. He almost got the D.C.M. for taking out a boundary fence with the wide machinery.

Over the years John and Peg had many happy holidays at Safety Bay with the kids when they were young.

Later they travelled to Europe, America and around Australia.

Henry's shed in Mandurah is 10ft x 8ft—whichever ends up with the contents will have to triple the size because nobody can store things like John can. Good luck Mac and John.

Back in the 70's Dr Treagus told Henry to give up smoking, so young John bet him \$10 he wouldn't. He did so you still owe him \$10 John!

Peg asked John if he wanted to stop the dialysis—his response We'll see.

He wanted to make that special day for his lovely wife of 65 years.

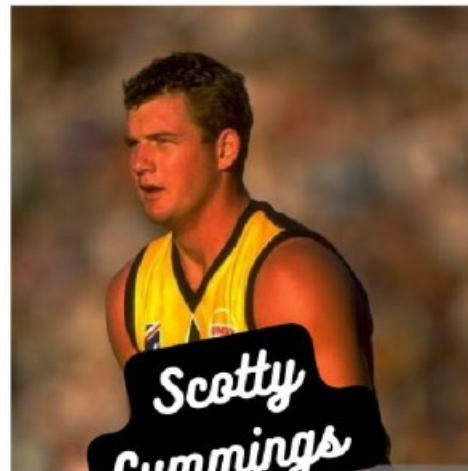

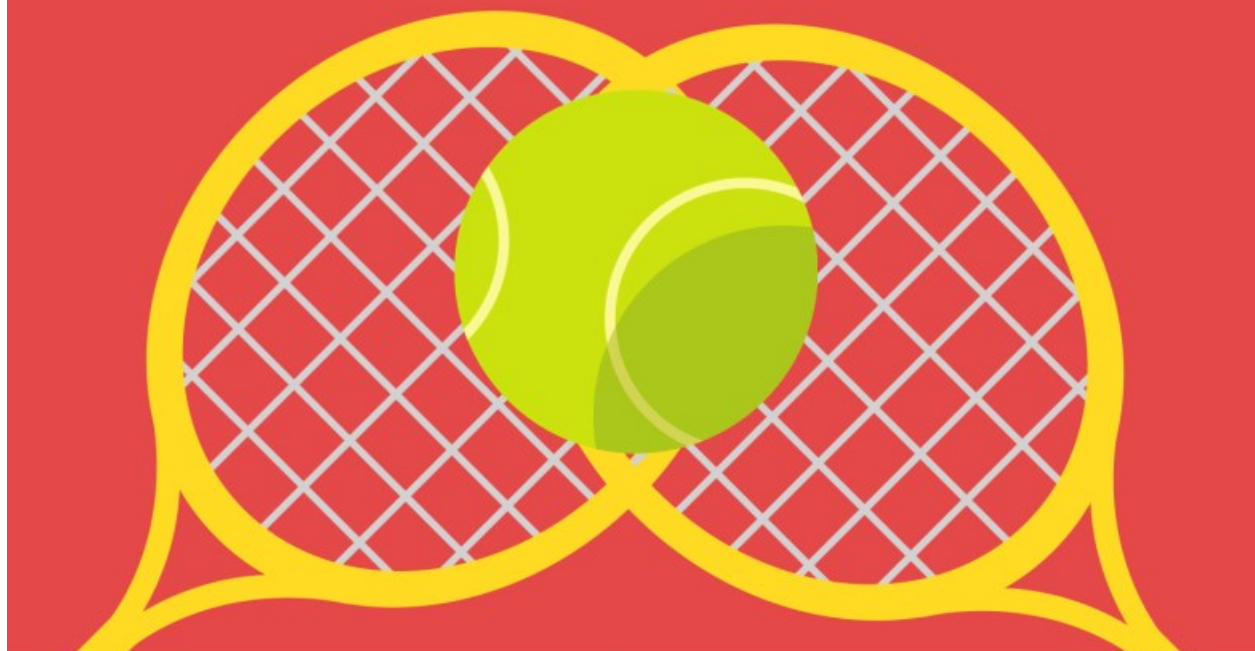
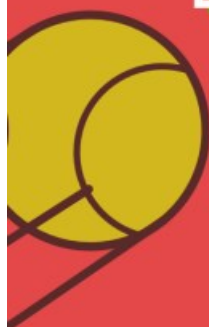
