
Hope everyone is well.

We have been busy assisting our brothers and sisters at Merredin Police Station regularly over the last couple of weeks. On 10 March, a male person was assaulted in Merredin and later died. There had been tensions between family members as a result of the death and threats to family members were made. There was a significant police presence placed in Merredin which resulted in no incidents of civil disturbance or harm to the community which was a good result.

We have been informed of some members of the local community being scammed. Scammers might call, text or email you and pretend to be from a government organisation. They can also pretend to be from places like Telstra, PayPal, Australia Post. Remember "if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is".

Scamnet is also urging the public to be wary of phone messages from a family member or friend claiming they need help, following a significant rise in "Hi Mum" "Hi Dad" scams.

In these "family impersonation" scams, victims are contacted - by a scammer posing as a family member or friend.



The scammer will claim they have lost or damaged their phone and are making contact from a new number. Then, once they have developed a rapport with their target, the scammer will ask for personal information such as photos for their social media profile or money to help urgently pay a bill, contractor or replace the phone.




