Some discussion took place regarding the future of Avoca Farm. Readers are asked to watch for information from the Shire seeking ideas on this matter.


It was suggested that the Emu Hill townsite be marked in some way perhaps in a similar way to the displays at South Kumminin and Billericay.


Visitor Neville Marsh presented several diaries written by his uncle Wilfred Savage. These will be placed in the Savage file.

BUDGET ADOPTION

Preliminary preparation of the 2023.24 draft budget has now been completed and Council will consider the draft budget at its Ordinary Council meeting on 18 June 2023.

Once the budget is adopted preparation of the 2023/24 rate notices will be undertaken with delivery to ratepayers expected in late July 2023.

The Shire will be including the annual Bushfire Information Notice with the rates this year and landowners are urged to read and be aware of their obligations for their property requirements to comply with notice, especially property owners within the townsite as there has been changes made to the requirements for townsite land compared to previous years.
