MIA'S LOCAL HERO GRANTS ROUND OPENS

13th October 2023

The latest round of 'Mia's Local Hero Grants' has been opened to eligible groups and individuals living in the electorate of Central Wheatbelt.

It is the eighth round of the small grant funding program provided by Hon Mia Davies MLA.

"These small grants are designed to support groups and people in the electorate who work hard to support and inspire their community," Ms Davies said.

"This round of the program will provide amounts of up to \$200 for local groups who support and enrich our communities."

Ms Davies said the grants provided an opportunity to show her support, thanks and appreciation for the hardworking volunteer and not-for-profit organisations that make such a difference in our community.

"I encourage everyone that is eligible to make an application as it's hotly contested and there are many deserving projects, people and event in the electorate," Ms Davies said.

"The funds could be used to support or sponsor a local event, contribute toward the purchase of new equipment or materials, or to assist your group to better support your members or community.

"I'm looking forward to receiving the applications, and if anyone has concerns about their eligibility, they should contact my office."

Successful applicants from the previous round include bringing a qualified swim instructor to Mukinbudin for the Swimming Club, purchasing photography light display boxes for the Narembeen Historical Society and personal protective equipment for the Pingelly Youth Cadets.

"The funding also contributed to new trestles for the Nungarin Wheatbelt Markets as the Committee celebrated their 25th anniversary this year, new roller-skates for the Wylie Roller-skating team and a 'come and try day' for York & District Archery Club.

Round 8 opens Friday 13th October and closes at 4.00pm on Friday 10th Nov 2023.

Hurt to Help Charity Launch

The charity Hurt to Help Limited is a new charity recently founded by Narembeen local, Ethan Stirrat. Ethan was born and raised in the Wheatbelt. He started school at Muntadgin and then moved to Narembeen DHS, when Munt school closed, when he was 5. He went to boarding school in Perth from Year 10 and is now in his 6th year of Medicine at UWA. Ethan enjoys pushing his body to its limits. Earlier in the year he completed a 24 hour run and has more recently developed an initiative called Stoictober. Stoictober involves Ethan running 500kms, doing 6000 pull ups, 12000 push-ups and 12000 sit ups over the month of October, thus implementing the core principles of the Ancient Greek philosophy-Stoicism. The principles being; hard work, progress, resilience, effort and taking responsibility for your own life rather than blaming external factors.

Being from a small rural town, anything that happens to residents, the whole community is affected. Ethan wants to be able to give back to those less fortunate than himself so decided to create a charity. A charity that is completely transparent with its donors, so that people donating money can see exactly where their money is going and the difference it is making.

Hurt to Help Limited will provide financial aid to rural people who have had to travel, relocate, or have been negatively impacted due to medical or safety issues. These include natural disaster, domestic violence, medical treatment, or other unjust/harmful circumstances. The charity also aims to establish scholarships or educational funds for disadvantaged children who have suffered family or personal tragedies. Especially for rural students without access to secondary or tertiary education in their place of residence. Another goal of the charity is to make a significant contribution to the Western Australian community by helping improve the lives of not only the recipients receiving support, but all people that get involved with Hurt to Help.

The official charity launch will take place at the **Narembeen Recreation Centre on December 2, 2023.**

Country Stargazing Here Comes Astrofest!

November has a bumper line-up of fabulous stargazing treats and the big-ticket item is this year's WA Astrofest! Held on Saturday 18th November, this free and family friendly event will have dozens of big telescopes to look through, astronomy talks, children's space activities, astrophotography and much more to overload your cosmic senses! For early risers, dazzling Venus will make a close approach to the lovely thin slither of the Moon on November 10th. The best time to see this stunning duo is one hour before sunrise, looking low towards the east.

Adding to this month's stellar diary, stargazers will be treated to a special display from the Leonids Meteor Shower. The Leonids meteor shower is generated from comet Tempel-Tuttle. The shower peaks on the night of the 17th/18th of November but can be viewed several days either side of the peak. The best views will be under dark skies, after midnight.

This shower emanates from the constellation Leo, which is visible just about everywhere on Earth. For those in northern WA, Orion will be higher in the sky, and may produce clearer meteors.

When to look: From midnight to early morning, 17th/18th November.

Which direction to look: Toward the northern horizon

Meteor showers happen when our planet Earth crosses the orbital path of a comet. As comets pass by the sun, the extreme temperatures heat up some of the nucleus and cause debris particles to spread out along the comet's orbit creating a comet tail. As Earth passes through this debris cloud, we have the opportunity of viewing the fiery spectacle of a meteor shower.

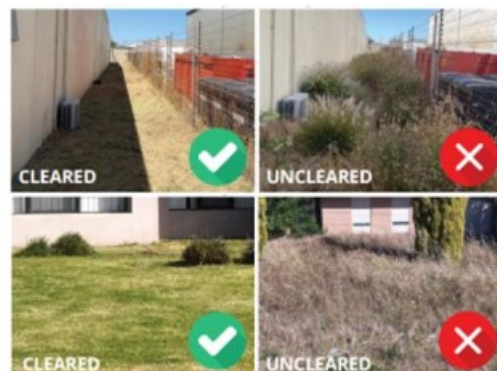
Summer Swimming

Bushfire Notice - Townsite Land

Each year, prior to 1 November, all owners or occupiers of land, within the Narembeen townsite, are required to clear flammable material from their land and maintain. Land is to be cleared of all flammable matter from the whole of land except for living trees, shrubs and plants under cultivation, and lawns. Slashing and removal of long-standing grass on the entire block and verge to ground level would be considered an acceptable means of removing flammable material from the property. Flammable materials include long-standing grass, weeds, boxes, cartons, paper, rubbish, and any

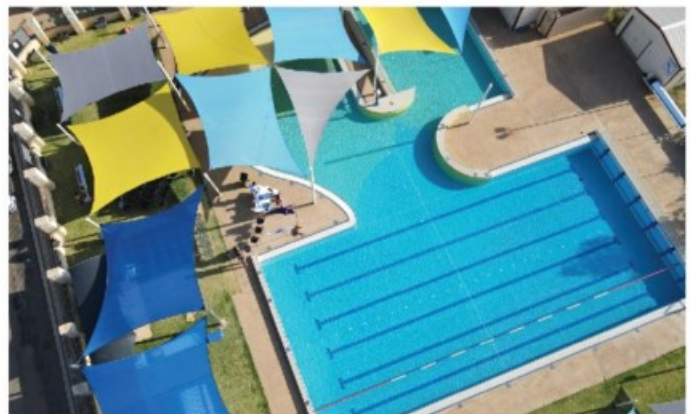
