Bright Lights Shine on Narembeen Hockey

After many delays, the long-awaited hockey lighting project is finally complete.

The Hockey Club had the chance to enjoy their final training session under the new lights last Thursday — just in time for the grand final. Whether coincidence or good luck, it may have been a good omen, with the Women's A and B Grade and Men's teams all bringing home premiership wins. A huge congratulations to the teams on this fantastic achievement.

This lighting upgrade was made possible through the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, under the Club Night Lights Program. The total project cost of \$325,286 included significant contributions from the Hockey Club, the Shire of Narembeen, and Go Narembeen, who contributed \$60,000 toward the broader town oval lighting upgrade project, benefiting the wider community.

The Shire would like to acknowledge and thank Garrick Yandle (Haddeo Infrastructure Agriculture Pty Ltd) for his efforts and experience in managing this project — particularly for his work liaising between the contractor, Hockey Club, and the Shire. Great work, Garrick!

The successful completion of this project builds on the recent CNLP funding awarded for the football oval lighting upgrade, anticipated for completion in June 2026. Once finished, this combined lighting enhancement will meet Australian Standards and create more opportunities for night-time events and recreational activities in our community.

We are incredibly fortunate as a community to have been successful in three CNLP funding rounds, securing support for:

- Narembeen Tennis Club
- Narembeen Hockey Club
- Narembeen Football Club / Town Oval

Well done to all involved in bringing these projects to life and supporting the growth and improvement of our local sporting infrastructure.

Mt Walker Standpipe Works – Community Update

The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) has finalised recommission the old Mount Walker standpipe.

A new bore has been drilled and installed. The 250kL onsite tank is currently about one-third to half full, and access is anticipated to be available by mid-September, once the tank has had adequate time to fill. Please note that filling is weather-dependent and estimated to require approximately 10 sunny days.

Access to the standpipe will remain locked until the tank is full and Council has finalised access controls. This is due to the limited storage capacity and the time required to refill the tank between uses.

DWER will retain responsibility for the assets, including insurance, until they are formally transferred to the Shire in the coming weeks.

We appreciate your patience as we work to bring this infrastructure online to support local water needs.



Shire Secures Approvals for Cultural Interpretation Project at Emu Hill

Through the dedicated efforts of Project Officer Kyla Padfield, and ongoing collaboration with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA), the Shire of Narembeen is pleased to advise that authority has been secured from the Department of Aboriginal Sites (DAS) to proceed with a meaningful community project at Emu Hill.

This approval allows the Narembeen Historical Society to construct a visitor information shelter and install interpretive panels that will highlight the cultural and historical significance of the Emu Hill site. This project will provide both locals and visitors with a deeper understanding of the area's rich heritage and promote respectful engagement with the landscape.

To support the long-term sustainability and management of the site, the Shire has also applied to the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH) requesting a change in vesting. The aim is to have the triangular portion of the reserve formally vested to the Shire of Narembeen, allowing for improved care, access, and development of this important historical site.

This is a fantastic outcome and a testament to the persistence and hard work of everyone involved. We look forward to seeing the project progress and to the valuable cultural and educational benefits it will bring to the community.

- 3. Pay a \$100 deposit
- 4. Complete the mandatory online induction
