#### AUSTRALIA DAY CELEBRATIONS IN NAREMBEEN

It was another great success at the Australia Day Ceremony at the Narembeen Aquatic Centre on Sunday, 26 January 2020. With approximately 80 people attending, the Narembeen Councillors prepared a great bacon and egg breakfast for all to enjoy, including some of the Australia Day Bowlers that travelled from afar to play in Narembeen for the Annual Bowls Day. It was a beautiful morning beating the heat, starting bright and early at 7:00am for all setting up and decorators, awaiting the arrival of community members at roughly 7:30am for a 7:45am start.

Each year on Australia Day Local Government Councils are given the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the contribution and engagement of members within our community. The purpose of these awards are to recognise individuals and organisations that have made contributions into the local community, which are above and beyond normal employment duties.

Shire President, Cr Rhonda Cole presented this year's awards to the following well deserving recipients:

#### Senior Citizen of the Year - Carmel Harper

Carmel's Citation read as follows:-

Carmel Harper came to live in Narembeen 7 years ago. Carmel is a very capable person who does not hesitate to put up her hand when something has to be done.

When Government funding for the Autumn Club was discontinued the members had to organise the running of the Club. Not wishing to see the group disband, Carmel was happy to take on the responsibility of organizer. Realizing that a financial base was needed she approached the Narembeen Shire and was rewarded with a donation of \$1,000. Further to this she obtained a donation of \$500 from her son in law John Cobley and his wife Debbie of Narembeen Dental. This gave a great start and encouraged other groups to assist in the same way.

With these resources combined with eager workers and Carmel's leadership the Club has thrived with attendance each week usually in the high teens.

To provide added interest Carmel has arranged for guest speakers to address the gatherings. Community members are also invited to attend. Topics so far have covered issues such as health services, the disadvantaged and other social matters. These have proved both interesting and educational, particularly on hearing how the other half lives.

Under her direction more outlets have been found for the items made - blankets, beanies, scarves, Teddy bears, dolls, clothing for premature babies and other items are distributed. Some of the organizations to benefit are Children's Hospital, K.E.M.H., Narembeen Hospital, Narrogin Hospital (Maternity Section), Northam Police Welfare Groups, Camp Kulin, Shopfront (an agency for disadvantaged and homeless), The Shoebox Project and several Homes for The Aged throughout the state. Recently a parcel of knitting was sent to Bahrain with Carmel's

With the above contribution as well as her involvement in other organisations e.g. Seniors and Historical Society, we feel that we are nominating a worthy community member in Carmel Harper for the Senior Community Citizen Award for Narembeen 2019.

Members were at the club at 5am each morning to start the breakfasts as some competitors hit off at 06.30am. It was huge, but we did it!!!

#### PROPOSED MOTEL - LOTS 72 (NO 22) AND 73 (NO 24) THOMAS STREET

In accordance with the provisions of the Shire of Narembeen Town Planning Scheme No.2 – notice is given of a proposed Motel on Lot 72 (No.22) and Lot 73 (No.24) Thomas Street. Under the Scheme, the Shire is inviting public comments regarding the proposed development to be submitted to the Chief Executive Officer, 1 Longhurst Street, Narembeen 6369. The public comment period is open and comments will be taken until 10am on Wednesday, 19 February 2020.

The proposed development is for a 15 unit motel comprising of two buildings with a combined floor area of approximately 503 square metres. Each motel room is proposed to have their own bathroom and all buildings are proposed to be setback 1.5 metres from any lot boundary.

The lots are zoned 'Residential' under the Town Planning Scheme - Under Clause 4:11.1 the objectives of the Residential zone are:

- to retain the single house as the predominant form of residential development in the town.
- to provide for lifestyle choice in and around the town with a range of residential densities.
- to allow for the establishment of non-residential uses subject to local amenities not being adversely affected.

The Lots are also classified as been within the Town Centre zone, the objectives of which are:

- to ensure the town centre remains the principal place for business and administration within the District.
- to encourage a high standard of development including buildings, landscaping, and car parking.
- to make the town centre an attractive place to work and to conduct business through the implementation
  of a townscape improvement plan.

More information on the application received and the provisions under the Shire's Town Planning Scheme can be found in the report to the December Council Meeting and its associated attachments. #### NEW SAFETY STANDARDS FOR QUAD BIKES

The <u>Consumer Goods (Quad Bikes) Safety Standard 2019</u> came into effect on 11 of October 2019. The standard aims to prevent or reduce the risk of fatality or injury from quad bikes and it is **our** responsibility to enforce it.

Even though quad bikes are responsible for more fatalities than motorcycles and more injuries than tractors on rural properties, until now, quad bikes have not been subject to

a safety standard. Quad bikes are the leading cause of fatalities in Australia of all consumer products that are not currently regulated.

The standard has three elements: improved information for potential purchasers, enhanced quad bike stability, and rollover protection to reduce injuries and deaths.

This standard applies to all quad bikes from 11 October 2020 with additional requirements for general use quad bikes from 11 October 2021. The standard does not apply to second-hand quad bikes other than those imported into Australia.

#### Changes required by 11 October 2020

By 11 October 2020, all quad bikes must meet the specified requirements of the US or European standard, have a label warning of the rollover risks clearly displayed, include information on the rollover risk in the owner's manual and be tested for stability.

#### Changes required by 11 October 2021

By 11 October 2021, all new general use quad bikes will need to confirm with minimum standards for stability on slopes. The standard will also require that all new general use quad bikes sold in Australia will have an operator protection device (OPD) to reduce the risk of serious injuries and fatalities in the event of a rollover.

#### Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the manufacturer, importer or distributor supplying in Australia to supply quad bikes that are compliant with the requirements of the safety standard.

Failure to comply will result in breach of the Australian Consumer Law, which can result in fines and penalties. Contact Consumer Protection or ACCC to report on any non-compliance.

#### **BURNING - PERMITS REQUIRED**

The Shire of Narembeen advises that we are now in the RESITRICTED (PERMIT REQUIRED) burning period from 1 February 2020 to 15 April 2020.

Please note the following:-

- 1st February include grass and raked stubble
- 1st March is header windrows and chaff dumps and stubble fires

From the start of the restricted burning time to the 15 April, no person is allowed to light a fire on a Sunday or Public Holiday.

Any questions about burning times should be directed to a Fire Control Officer or the Shire Office.





#### New Infrastructure drought funding for Durack Shires 28 January 2020

Eleven shires in Durack will benefit from between \$500,000 - \$1 million grants under the Morrison Government's Drought Communities Programme (DCP) extension.

Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price is urging eligible communities to take advantage of the fund for local infrastructure projects and other drought relief activities.

"This is the kind of boost communities in Durack need. I have been advocating in Canberra to achieve this extension of the Morrison Government's Drought Communities Programme to Western Australia," Ms Price said.

The Durack Shires added to the DCP extension today are eligible based on need and the economic impact of drought in the region. The DCP is assessed using rainfall deficiency data from the Bureau of Meteorology, population and industry data with a particular reliance on agriculture. The Government monitors drought conditions across the country and may add more councils depending on conditions.

"Funding will support events that create jobs, boost tourism and improve community wellbeing and enable construction of infrastructure that encourages people to stop in these small towns," Ms Price said.

Eligible councils are invited to submit project proposals via an online application at business.gov.au.

Grant guidelines and applicant information is available at <u>business.gov.au</u> and <u>GrantConnect</u>.

Minister for Drought David Littleproud said 35 WA Shires have now been included.

"Drought doesn't just hurt farmers, it goes beyond the farm gate. It hurts small businesses and the wider community as well, but this extra funding keeps money flowing through affected areas," Minister Littleproud said.


