

Pound & Hopkins Roads

It is hereby notified for public information that the Shire of Kulin intends to close a portion of the Hopkins Road and the entire length of Pound Road as per the details below.

- Hopkins Road will be closed between Pound Road and Kulin Dudinin Road for a period of 24hrs for the installation of new culverts from 7:30am Monday 17th February 2020.
- Hopkins Road will be closed between Pound Road and Notley Road for a period of 24hrs for the installation of new culverts from 7.30am Tuesday 18th February 2020.
- Pound Road will be closed between Hopkins Road and Kulin Dudinin Road for a period of 24hrs for the installation of a new culvert from 7:30am Wednesday 19th February 2020.
- Local access is permitted for landowners who are required to use the road for business purposes.
- Appropriate signage will be installed during the road closure period.



Michael Lethlean, our Pool Manager is offering a range of "cool me down" drink options, such as slushy's, soft drinks and most importantly - cold water. If that doesn't cool you down, there is also a variety of ice creams to choose from to help you survive the scorching heat and humidity Narembeen has been experiencing in the last couple of weeks.

The Aquatic Centre also has BBQ facilities that are open to all visitors so bring all your family and friends down for a afternoon catch up.

The Aquatic Centre offers Early Morning Swimming to the community from 6am - 7am then reopens for the day from 11am to 6:30pm, Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and stays open until 7pm Friday to Sunday. The Centre is closed every Tuesday.

DOG & CAT REGISTRATIONS

All dogs, three months of age and over, must be registered and microchipped. All cats, six months of age and older, must be registered, microchipped and also sterilised. This is required by law. Microchipping services are offered by our ranger for a fee of \$55.00 and can be arranged by contacting the Shire office. Animal registrations are available for 1 year, 3 years or lifetime. Dog and cat registrations expire on 31 October each year.



HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

The Annual General Meeting of the Historical Society was held at the History centre on Monday 17th February 2020 with 12 members present.

The President Lorraine Lethlean presented her report thanking the members for their continued support and help on the projects that were undertaken during the year.

The addition of a new machinery shed museum continues to prove a challenge especially the financing of it. Our History Centre building renovations have not been completed as yet. It was hoped that we would be able to move into the premises this month but the floors are still to be sanded and some other minor adjustments need to be addressed.




