My Dad (Frank to all of you here today) was born few trophies under his belt - so when he first and three older brothers (all now deceased) he only played for a year or two..... followed by a baby brother Noel a few years later.

Dad and his siblings all taught themselves how to ride horses early - around 3 years of age with no children had to walk for miles to get to school.

Dad would rise early before school - around 5.00 and help his Mum to milk the cows as the cow's milk provided cream which they sold to help run the farm as well.

One year at school - <u>Dad used his magic fly trick on</u> <u>a new teacher!</u> Dad's poor teacher never went back to teaching after that year!!! TRUE STORY!!!

Dad took off his first harvest at the age of 12 years - These times were tough but happy times for Mum and harvest - Dad decided to leave school to help his <u>as possible</u>. And they did - around 7-9 years later. folks on the farm.

When he met and married a farmer's daughter from a nearby town of Warracknabeal (Betty) Dad was share-farming his Uncles farm nearby in a town called Hopetoun. Dad knew he could never buy his Uncles farm - so in 1956 Dad and Mum decided to leave their families - and with their first two children, they drove across to the 'wild west'!

They eventually settled into Narembeen <u>as the</u> town was 'rocking' Dad said! They leased a farm from "CUSACKS" with Dad shearing sheep and Mum milking cows for cream and selling eggs in their 'spare time' to save a deposit for their dream farm. They were true pioneers - as they lived off the land!

Dad was a good footballer back in Victoria - with a

and this really does sum Dad up - he is strong, determined, never gives up and above all, loves

Coronavirus

FACTS

From the Department of Health, Australian Government website

As at 06:30 hrs on 24 February 2020, we have 22 confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) in Austral-

- 8 in Queensland
- 4 in New South Wales
- 6 in Victoria
- 3 in South Australia
- 1 in Western Australia

10 of these cases are reported to have recovered. The remaining cases are in a stable condition. 7 cases are passengers who were on the Diamond Princess repatriation flight from Japan. They were in quarantine at the Manigurr-ma Village Howard Springs facility in Darwin when they tested positive to coronavirus (COVID-19).

6 of these people have returned to their home states for medical treatment. One person will be transported to Queensland today.

Across the world

Across the world, there have been about 78,904 confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) and 2,466 reported deaths. Of confirmed cases reported globally, the case fatality rate is approximately 3%. The case fatality rate in countries and regions outside mainland China is 1%

The majority of cases of COVID-19 have been reported from mainland China. 1,828 cases have been reported from 31 countries and regions outside mainland China.

Coronavirus MythBusters

Can an ultraviolet disinfection lamp kill the new coronavirus?

UV lamps should not be used to sterilize hands or other areas of skin as UV radiation can cause skin irritation.

How effective are thermal scanners in detecting people infected with the new coronavirus?

Thermal scanners are effective in detecting people who have developed a fever (i.e. have a higher than normal body temperature) because of infection with the new coronavirus.

However, they cannot detect people who are infected but are not yet sick with fever. This is because it takes between 2 and 10 days before people who are infected become sick and develop a fever.

Can spraying alcohol or chlorine all over your body kill the new coronavirus?

No. Spraying alcohol or chlorine all over your body will not kill viruses that have already entered your body. Spraying such substances can be harmful to clothes or mucous membranes (i.e. eyes, mouth). Be aware that both alcohol and chlorine can be useful to disinfect surfaces, but they need to be used under appropriate recommendations.

Is it safe to receive a letter or a package from China?

Yes, it is safe. People receiving packages from China are not at risk of contracting the new coronavirus. From previous analysis, we know coronaviruses do not survive long on objects, such as letters or packages.

Can pets at home spread the new coronavirus (2019-nCoV)?

At present, there is no evidence that companion animals/pets such as dogs or cats can be infected with the new coronavirus. However, it is always a good idea to wash your hands with soap and water after contact with pets. This protects you against various common bacteria such as E.coli and Salmonella that can pass between pets and humans.

Do vaccines against pneumonia protect you against the new coronavirus?

No. Vaccines against pneumonia, such as pneumococcal vaccine and Haemophilus influenza type B (Hib) vaccine, do not provide protection against the new coronavirus.

The virus is so new and different that it needs its own vaccine. Researchers are trying to develop a vaccine against 2019-nCoV, and WHO is supporting their efforts.

Although these vaccines are not effective against 2019-nCoV, vaccination against respiratory illnesses is highly recommended to protect your health.

Are antibiotics effective in preventing and treating the new coronavirus?

No, antibiotics do not work against viruses, only bacteria.

The new coronavirus (2019-nCoV) is a virus and, therefore, antibiotics should not be used as a means of prevention or treatment.

However, if you are hospitalized for the 2019-nCoV, you may receive antibiotics because bacterial co-infection is possible.

Are there any specific medicines to prevent or treat the new coronavirus?

To date, there is no specific medicine recommended to prevent or treat the new coronavirus (2019-nCoV).

However, those infected with the virus should receive appropriate care to relieve and treat symptoms, and those with severe illness should receive optimized supportive care. Some specific treatments are under investigation, and will be tested through clinical trials. WHO is helping to accelerate research and development efforts with a range or partners.
