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
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



A boost for Durack Business and Jobs

12 March

The Morrison Government has today announced a \$17.6 billion economic plan to keep Australians in jobs, keep businesses in business and support households as the world deals with the significant challenges posed by the spread of the coronavirus.

Our targeted stimulus package is focused on keeping Australians employed and helping small and medium sized businesses to stay in business.

Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price has congratulated Prime Minister Morrison and Treasurer Josh Frydenberg on their plan to deliver a targeted economic stimulus package to assist business and families in Durack.

"I estimate that at least 2 thousand Durack apprentices and trainees will benefit through the business boost their employers can access by applying for a wage subsidy of 50 per cent of the apprentice's or trainee's wage for up to 9 months from 1 January 2020 to 30 September 2020," Ms Price said.

The stimulus package has four parts that support business investment, provide cash flow assistance to help small and medium sized business and to keep their employees in jobs, along with targeted support for the most severely affected sectors, regions and communities. That includes additional assistance to help businesses identify alternative export markets or supply chains. Targeted measures will also be developed to further promote domestic tourism.

"Many Durack residents who are recipients of household allowances like the Aged Care and Disability pension as well as Newstart for example, will benefit from the one off \$750 dollar payments," Ms Price said.

The Government's economic support package is proportionate, timely and scalable to respond to the economic challenges presented by the spread of the coronavirus.

Through our response today and the actions we have taken to bring the Budget back to balance over the last six and a half years, Australians can be confident that our nation is one of the best prepared to respond to the economic impacts of the coronavirus.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR, SHIRE COUNCILS AND LOCAL MP.

The formation of "The Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network", (WSFN) as recently reported, supported by 42 Wheatbelt Shire Councils to secure 500 million dollars over 15 years with Deputy Prime Minister Michael McCormack who is also the Federal Infrastructure Transport and Regional Development Minister saying, the collaborative nature of the project made it "hard to say no to opening up the cheque book". Since that announcement there seems more road funds may be available through economic stimulus.

Safety has to be the highest priority on all freeways, highways and roads so the following may not be possible.

To allow heavy haulage vehicles to drive on or just over the broken white line and possibly in some situations where the broken white line is inside a continuous single line. This would allow wheel tracks to be spread over the whole road surface with eventually double white line sections to be widened by approximately half a metre for the same effect.

Hazard lights on or a sender unit sending alternate left and right flashes to keep other road users informed, without remarking roads or signs.

There would not be many country WA drivers who after a recent rainfall event come across ribbons of water 3 or 4 centimetres deep in wheel tracks on the bitumen. Dangerous in a small vehicle especially at night with oncoming traffic.

Closing in on nearly 60 years of having a drivers licence in WA and by association Australia, perhaps belatedly you appreciate it has been a privilege.

From 2006 to 2013 I worked roughly halfway between Perth and Geraldton just off the Brand Highway on the Coorow/Greenhead Road so witnessed the mining boom plus the lime sand being transported inland.

From Badgingarra to Muchea I don't believe there was an overtaking line in 2006. (Happy to be corrected). Heavy haulage and oversize load drivers and pilot vehicles should be commended for their contribution to our State during this period and the general motoring public for their patience.

On trips home travelling on parts of the Brand, Great Northern and Great Eastern Highway wear and tear of the road surfaces became evident similar to now where Tier 3 railway lines have been closed and I imagine the lime sand roads.

In recent years I've seen first hand the Narembeen and Bruce Rock Shires raise, reform, reculvert and reseal the main road between the two towns, usually 4 or 5 kilometres each year. It is always a surprise the time and effort that goes into the first 3 above with the resealing done in less than 8 hours.

Throughout the state I'm not sure there is enough quality road building material left within a economical distance of our highways. I'm not sure we have the machinery to compact the road building material presently used.

Some 40 years ago the Bruce Rock Shire had their own metal quarry. With minimal preparation they laid a single strip of bitumen on some of their secondary roads with some still in use or only recently replaced. It's a fair effort for a few mm of bitumen with blue metal stone on top.

School days starting in Kondinin in 1951, not sure we had any town streets bitumen but do remember the roads out of town being formed up a year before the sealing. Not possible today but preparation and foundation key to safer roads and longer lasting roads.

Repeal Local Law 2020 (Pest Plants)

The purpose of the proposed local law is to repeal an obsolete local law

The effect of the proposed local law is that the obsolete local law will be revoked and abrogated.

Standing Orders Local Law 2020

The purpose of this local law is to:

Provide for the conduct of meetings of the Council, Committees and Electors.

The effect of this local law is to provide for:

Better decision making at meetings;

The orderly and efficient conduct of meetings;

Greater community participation and understanding of the business of the Council; and

More open and accountable local government.

Dogs Local Law 2020

The purpose of this local law is to:

Make provisions about the impounding of dogs, to control the number of dogs that can be kept on premises and the manner of keeping those dogs and to prescribe areas in which dogs are prohibited and dog exercise areas.

The effect of this local law is to provide for:

Extend the controls over dogs which exist under the Dog Act 1976.

Fencing Local Laws 2020

The purpose of this local law is to:

Prescribe a sufficient fence and the standard for the construction of fences throughout the district.

The effect of this local law is to:

Establish the minimum requirements for fencing within the district.

Emu Hill Public Cemetery Local Law 2020

The purpose of this local law is to:

Provide for the orderly management of the Emu Hill Public Cemetery (Reserve No 17068) in accordance with established plans and to create offences for inappropriate behaviour within the cemetery grounds.

The effect of this local law is to:

Ensure compliance by all persons engaged in the administration of the cemetery, burying deceased in the cemetery, or otherwise providing services to or making use of the cemetery.

CONVID - 19 (CORONAVIRUS)

The Shire of Narembeen is working closely with the Commonwealth, State and Territory jurisdictional governments to respond to the outbreak of a novel coronavirus that has recently been declared a pandemic by the World Health Organisation.

The pandemic is managed in WA under the State Emergency Management Act 2005 (EM Act), and Local Government has been participating in State Emergency Coordination Group meetings as the Association is legislated under the EM Act to represent the sector.

Whilst the Department of Health has been appointed lead agency for distribution of information on the disease and responses, a specific Pandemic Coordination Unit has also been established to liaise across agencies, businesses and Local Governments in enacting the State Pandemic Plan.

The State Government has agreed to include all Local Government CEOs in information updates being sent to State Agencies on a twice-weekly basis. The updates are shared on the WA Health website and can be accessed here.

Local Governments and members of the public are encouraged to go to online resources for up to date information, as outlined below:

- HealthyWA website this should be the main page to refer people to as it has information on COVID clinics and current advice.
- Commonwealth Department of Health contains a number of fact sheets to answer the many questions that are currently being asked by the broader community and different industries including advice for employers,
- State Government Coronavirus Page includes the WA Government Pandemic Plan

Council will be considering implementing measures to minimise the risk of Coronavirus in the local community at its Council meeting on 18th March 2020. Consideration will be given to cancelling programmed events such as the Triathlon, minimising the Anzac Service and early closure of the Narembeen Swimming Pool.



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) - WATCH THIS SPACE 8

Well the news about coronavirus is only getting worse and we will be waiting to find out what will be happening with schools and universities as the situation worsens. As of today, I have no information on school closures, except 'maybe extension of the Term 1 holidays' but I receive updates almost daily about what measures to take. We have installed bacterial wash dispensers in the classrooms that did not have them and have ensured that there is plenty of soap at all times in the toilets. It is important that we continue to explain to the students the importance of good handwashing hygiene. It seems that there is a very low rate of confirmed cases of COVID-19 among children, relative to the broader population and they do not seem to get severely ill. Children can however, have high levels of COVID-19 but no symptoms. It appears therefore that there is a small chance of our students actually showing symptoms of coronavirus but they may be able to carry it and pass it on. Our roles in this outbreak is to minimise the danger to those who will be badly affected by it; those with compromised immune systems, the elderly and those with chronic medical conditions.

There is currently no vaccine to prevent COVID-19 infection. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to this virus. However, there are some everyday preventive actions you can take to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

- ✓ Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that
 contains at least 60 percent alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- ✓ Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- ✓ Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- ✓ Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
