





Please keep in touch with friends, acquaintances and other community members with regular phone calls to check up on their welfare and provide encouragement.

An announcement by the Prime Minister on Sunday 23 March 2020

Prime Minister Scott Morrison has announced a mass closure of pubs, clubs, gyms, cinemas, religious venues and other "non-essential" indoor facilities starting from midday today, following a meeting with state premiers and chief ministers on Sunday night.

After a day of chaos in which News South Wales and Victoria pre-empted the meeting with announcements of restrictions on non-essential activity in response to rising COVID-19 infections, Morrison criticised Australians who had ignored social distancing measures, and expressed regret that workers and business owners "will suffer the economic hardship that undoubtedly they will now have to face". Restaurants and cafes will only be permitted to offer takeaway and delivery services. Shopping centres, supermarkets, banks, pharmacies, and hairdressers are among the businesses that will continue operating

Some more information on the second stimulus package and announcement by the Prime Minister on Sunday 22 March 2020. A summary for you kindly provided by Caroline Robinson:

- Australians are advised not to travel in the wake of the coronavirus crisis unless the travel is essential in the course of your day-to-day life.
- Unaffected businesses include shopping centres, supermarkets, banks, petrol stations, pharmacies, convenience stores, freight and logistics and food delivery.
- Licensed clubs, pubs, cinemas, casinos, nightclubs and places of worship to close from midday Monday 23 March 2020
- Restaurants and cafes will be restricted to takeaway service only from Monday 23 March at midday (service to customers at the front door, order ahead or home delivery)
- The Western Australian border is to close from 1:30pm on Tuesday 24 March 2020, with the Government requiring incoming individuals to self-isolate for 14 days. The border controls will apply to all access points via roads, rail, sea and air.
- The National Cabinet meeting has yet to yield nationwide responses, but the NSW, Victorian and Australian Capital Territory Governments have announced measures to shutdown non-essential services over the next 48 hours in an attempt to slow the spread of COVID-19.

Gyms are to close nationwide in an effort to stop the spread

SECOND STIMULUS PACKAGE

These measures are in addition to the <u>apprenticeship and traineeship support payment</u>, instant asset write off and investment incentive.

Cashflow assistance for businesses (PAYG)

If you have employees you can access a tax free payment to cover the costs of employee wages and salaries

for businesses with a turnover under \$50 million

100% of the PAYG withholding applied as a credit by the ATO

a minimum of \$10K and a maximum of \$50K

for quarterly BAS - this means your PAYG is credited on lodgement of your next BAS

the additional payment will equal the total received to date - meaning eligible businesses will receive at least \$20K and up to \$100K under both payments

for monthly IAS - this means 300% of the March PAYG amount is credited on lodgement of your next BAS

the minimum payment will be applied to the first lodgement

there will be an additional payment introduced in the July - October period

Financing support

50% of any new unsecured short term loan for business is guaranteed by the government maximum total loan size of \$250K per borrower

a minimum of \$10K and a maximum of \$100K over 6 months

loans of up to 3 years, with an initial 6 month repayment holiday

government will encourage lenders to provide draw down style facilities (*like overdraft*) where interest is only paid on what you use

commences early April 2020 and be available for new loans until Sep 30 2020

Businesses in hardship

If you are trading insolvent, or get issued with a statutory demand letter by a creditor

an increase to the minimum amount for which creditors can issues a statutory demand

an increase to the time given to you to reply to a statutory demand

an increase to the threshold for a creditor to initiate bankruptcy proceedings, the time to respond, and the period of protection

relief for directors from personal liability when trading insolvent

Banking Assistance

The <u>Australian Banking Association</u> announced that their members will defer loan repayments for six months for small businesses who need financial assistance.

The Commonwealth Bank of Australia, NAB, ANZ and Suncorp have released their measures to assist small businesses and households facing the financial strain of COVID-19.

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

The General Meeting of the Historical Society was held at the Old Library room in the Shire Council Office on Monday 16th March 2020.

We are thankful to the Shire Council for making the Old Library area available to the Historical Society for their meetings and to store the family records and the filing cabinets while the renovations are being made to our History Centre.

The main business matters discussed were as follows:-

- The discovery of further complications to the History Centre building has extended the
 renovation completion date to April. The windows look very nice but have difficulty closing.
 The floors have been sanded and have come up looking great. The interior painting has been
 completed and the lighting has been updated to reflect the period. The outside of the
 building is still to be completed.
- The search for the new chairs for the renovated building is proving difficult. We are
 progressing. To combine the old with new is not as easy as is seems but we will do our best.
- Photographs in the Church museum have all had their labels put on them. The Church museum interior layout is looking great now but it is in need of repair. Funding will have to be sourced to make the necessary required repairs for both inside and out
- We have been trying to trace the donors of our Lanz bulldog tractors at Avoca farm but to date we have not any response from the advertisements placed.
- Negotiations are still on going in regards to the additional machinery shed to be located on the Churchill Street block. Several quotes have been obtained but our funds are short and further investigations are to be made.
- The sheds at Avoca farm are going to be re organized thanks to a couple of volunteers. This
 extra space will allow work to take place on some of the old farm machines that are stored
 there.
- Terry Treloar has donated a wheel that is an example of what was used while clearing land in the early 50's. The wheel and tyre have a "sleeve" made of another tyre fitted over it. This prevented punctures from happening to the original tyres, thus saving time and money.

Grain Brokers Australia Weekly Market Report

March 24, 2020

Plummeting ethanol grind eroding global corn demand...

Chinese purchases of US grains have been quite scant since the coronavirus epidemic hit the country, despite the Phase 1 trade agreement being signed by both nations back in January. China pledged to buy an additional US\$12.5 billion worth of agricultural goods in 2020 compared to the 2017 level of US\$24 billion.

Many analysts have been expecting China to wait until the second half of the calendar year to ramp up purchases of US grains - when new-crop supplies come online, and prices are traditionally more competitive.

However, there were signs last week that China may be about to 'walk the talk' as the recent price declines bought US export values more in line with offerings from competing origins. Additionally, logistics issues and supply challenges across the globe are interrupting global supply. This has provided China with a valid incentive to engage the US exporter to spread its geographical supply risk.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced last Friday that private exporters had reported sales of 756,000 metric tonnes of corn to China for delivery in the 2019/20 marketing year. This is the biggest corn sale to China since July 2013. Arrival must be before the end of June 2020, which is well before the US new crop slot.

Further private exporter sales across the week included 110,000 metric tonne of soybeans for delivery to 'unknown' destination' in the 2020/21 season. Sales flagged "unknown destination' typically mean China is the purchaser, and that was confirmed by the trade late in the week.

The USDA also reported deals totalling 340,000 metric tonnes of hard red winter wheat to China for delivery in the 2020/21 marketing year. This is the first Chinese purchase of hard red winter wheat from the US since late in 2017, just months before the US-China trade war got serious.

US corn futures plunged last week, despite the significant corn sale to China. The continued slide in crude oil values is a far greater challenge for global corn consumption. As coronavirus continues its global invasion, countries are increasing domestic and worldwide travel restrictions, sapping demand for fuel.

The price of Brent Crude has tumbled from a 2020 high of US\$68.91 per barrel on January 6 and from US\$51.90 per barrel at the beginning of March to close last week at a 17 year low of US\$26.98 per barrel. That represents a loss in value of 61 per cent year-to-date and 48 per cent for the first three weeks of March.

Cheap oil is undermining the viability of the ethanol industry. The US accounts for 56 per cent of global ethanol production and manufacturers are feeling the pain as margins on the corn-based fuel slumped to record lows. The US mandates that ethanol is blended into the nation's fuel pool. However, despite falling prices gasoline demand is being eroded by the national travel restrictions put in place to curb the spread of coronavirus.

Most of the industry is bleeding red ink right now, and there is no end in sight. Many ethanol plants in the US have slashed production over the past week or been forced to cut staff. Some have even closed to cut their losses until margins recover, whenever that may be!

Ethanol production in the US uses around 140 million metric tonne, or roughly 40 per cent of total corn production. There are reports that US ethanol grind may decline by 20 per cent. That equates to an annualised decrease in US corn disappearance of 28 million metric tonne and a significant increase in US ending stocks.

But who really knows how much production will decrease as demand is not being driven by price? The longer the national shutdown goes on, and it will be longer than most in the US care to admit, the bigger the decrease in demand.

And this is just the US equation. The low oil price will have a similar impact on ethanol demand and production in all jurisdictions, particularly those who mandate an ethanol inclusion in fuel or are major exporters of ethanol for fuel use. Non-US corn use for ethanol production is around 60 million metric tonne.

And corn is not the only feedstock. Brazil is the world's second-biggest ethanol manufacturer, at 28 per cent of global production, and sugar is their primary raw material. In other countries, wheat, and even barley, are used, but the quantities involved are minor, relative to the size of the global crops. Ethanol yield from cereals also tends to be inferior to both corn and sugar, making the financial equation even less appealing with the price of oil so low.


All this erosion of corn demand comes as Brazil and Argentina are forecasting near-record corn harvests, despite the continued dry weather. Local agencies have maintained their production estimates, but parts of Argentina have certainly seen a yield reduction and the dry is slowing the planting of the second corn crop in Brazil.

Adding to the global feed grain glut is a potential record wheat crop in 2020/21. The International Grains Council pegged it at 769 million metric tonne, but market analysts are quoting numbers as high as 775 million metric tonne. Production that high means the world is building stocks even before any potential demand destruction by coronavirus.

With the 2020 winter crop planting season almost upon us, and plenty of uncertainty in global markets, now is the time to be looking ahead. The Aussie dollar has done its work for now, and there is good incentive to sweep the old crop cupboards bare. And if the soil moisture profile has been topped up by good summer rains, a modicum of production confidence may make new crop cover attractive at current values.



COVID - 19

As the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic continues to develop across the country, the Councillors and staff of the Shire of Narembeen would like to extend our best wishes to everyone facing difficult situations as this crisis escalates. We understand that the measures being put in place have severely restricted our way of life and our ability to conduct our business but at this time it is the health and wellbeing of our community that must be at the forefront of our minds.

During the COVID-19 outbreak we urge everyone to avoid unnecessary social gatherings and where possible stay within their own property to limit the risk to themselves and others. Let's take this opportunity to show the strength of the Narembeen community and work together to protect those most vulnerable. When shopping please remember your neighbours, friends, the elderly and those in frontline medical professionals and try to employ a bit of empathy so we can all get through this difficult period with some comfort and dignity.

The Shire has put in place a number of measures to help further protect the community, these are summarised below and more actions may be taken as the situation progresses over the coming weeks:

- The Narembeen Gym has closed its doors until further notice. This is in line with Federal Government restrictions.
- The Narembeen CRC and Library has also closed its doors to the public. The team at the Narembeen CRC will continue to work diligently behind the scenes and will remain available to assist the community via phone or email, so if you are feeling isolated during this difficult period don't hesitate to give them a call even if it's just for a quick chat. They are also investigating the implementation of a drop off or collection service for the library. At this stage all events, workshops and activities have been cancelled.
- The Department of Human Service (Centrelink, Medicare etc.) facilities at the CRC will remain available on a call ahead basis so the team can open the external entrance door for you.
- Restrictions have been placed on bookings being taken for the Narembeen Caravan Park to reduce
 the number of travellers and tourists. Cabins are still available for essential contractor services but we
 encourage the community to ask their family and friends who may have been planning to come and
 visit during Easter etc. to reconsider and stay at home.
- The Shire's cleaning team are increasing their work patterns around the public toilets areas to reduce cross contamination risks.

- The Narembeen Aquatic Centre has closed for the season and the Narembeen Triathlon has been cancelled.
- At this stage the Shire will be proceeding with a limited morning wreath laying and minute silence for Anzac Day
- The Shire office remains open for transport and licencing enquiries, however we are encouraging people to conduct as many transactions online as possible or just call the office for advice as opposed to visiting in person.

NAREMBEEN LESSER HALL INTERPRETATION PROJECT

This project is now complete. Stephen Carrick Architects performed their final inspection of the site at the beginning of December and were satisfied that all works had been completed as per the Interpretation Plan.

The Interpretation provides a way to engage people in the stories and cultural heritage significance of the Civic Precinct as well as Narembeen as a whole.

The project tells the stories of the site, ensures that the social, historic, aesthetic and scientific values of the site remain embedded and continue to resonate into the future.

The Shire of Narembeen commissioned local artist Jordan Sprigg to create a hero statement piece which recreates a scene from the past - a horse waiting for a farmer to leave the Lesser Hall.

Professional photos were taken by Strange Image Photography in December 2020 and these will be used to promote the area through the Shire's website and other tourism products.

NAREMBEEN ROAD BOARD BUILDING

The Narembeen Road Board building has undergone extensive renovation work since June 2019. We are pleased to advise that internal renovation works should be complete within the next week, following this the external works will be finalised. It is anticipated that the Narembeen Historical Society will be able to relocate back into the building by the end of April.

As with all older buildings, the challenge remains to ensure the long term support and viability of buildings for the benefit of future conservation and enjoyment by present and future generations.

UPDATE ON SHIRE PROJECTS

NAREMBEEN AIRPORT

In 2019, the Shire of Narembeen were successful in receiving funding to significantly improve the RFDS transfer facilities at the Narembeen Airstrip. Works also include reseal works to the aircraft turn around areas, taxiways and the RFDS aircraft parking area.

The Shire have been working very hard on this project over the past few months and the difference in the RFDS transfer facility is amazing. Please see photos below.

The upgrade of the RFDS transfer facility will now meet standards for patient transfer, the automatic door enables ambulances to easily enter the building and the awning over the front of the building will improve weather coverage, these works will improve the amenity of the facility to benefit both volunteers and professionals who use the building.

As part of improving access, safety and to prolong the life of the airstrip, the reseal works will enhance the airstrip for RFDS and other users.

It is anticipated that this project will be finalized at the end of May 2020.



EMU HILL PUBLIC CEMETERY

The contractor completed the niche wall area including the seated reflection area and raised garden bed in mid-December. The area looks really lovely and is a much more personal area for families to visit their loved ones.

Stage two of the project will continue which includes signage, additional paving and garden area, landscaping and sealing of roadways. It is hoped that these works will be completed by 30 June 2020.


